September is always a massively busy time of the year. On the 11th we celebrated our Kick-Off event by providing fun games and food. We welcome back our 9:00 AM Contemporary Worship and 5:30 PM Wednesday evening worship. Sunday and Wednesday school are starting off great! Just over 300 students have registered so far, which surpasses last year's total number.

Every month Julie Pedersen holds a backpack packing event that sends weekend food to children at Lewis and Clark Elementary. This months donations were lower than what we received in September but that did not stop Julie and her crew in gathering what they needed and packed them up.

On the 16th some of our staff went to Castaway for the weekend to help guide 26 youth who attended from Calvary with a total of 150 youth from the Eastern North Daktoa Synod. Six of Calvary's high schoolers also went to work as "Work Crew". During their time at Castaway the students were introduced to Pastor Lori Fuller, a wonderful speaker. Pastor Fuller is deaf and shared with everyone her life of being born deaf and how going to Seminary is where she first felt welcomed.

I'm Pretty Sure Jesus Was a Blood Donor!

"Then Jesus took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, and all of them drank from it. He said to them, 'This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. Truly I tell you,I will never again drink of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

One blood donation can help save up to three people!

Like so many of you, I have been donating my blood since I was a teenager. I imagine the number of gallons must be getting up there by now, but of course the way to value this "investment" isn't the amount of blood I've offered but the number of people I've never met who have received this gift of life. For about a decade, I donated "double reds," which meant I couldn't give as regularly as a normal donation. But for most of my adult life I have given a pint of blood every other month – six pints a year. And because the organization that collects my blood gives me a call when my next appointment date nears, I normally get surprised that it's time to give again. As some of you know, I am no fan of needles. I have no doubt I have never, ever seen the hose attached to my vein. (I also have never watched the nurse stab my finger to check for the minimum iron content in my blood either!) So the truth is, I love being able to help others survive, I enjoy being surprised by the appointment person, but I do not enjoy the stabs or the insertions! Now you may not know that even though only 37% of the U.S. population is eligible to donate, less than 10% of eligible donors in the U.S. actually donate. This last factoid tells us 63% of us can't give blood, but think how many donations this population offers to others! These "in-kind" donations are the difference between life and death for many. Instead of a phone call to remind us of a need, these people perhaps get a call from a family member or a neighbor in trouble. Their actions matter!

Beloved members of Calvary, this article is your "call" to action. So, this is your pastor calling around to remind you that our regular giving to Calvary is about 10-15% below our normal giving for this time of the year. Since I've served as your Lead Pastor, the month of December has been a rush to the finish line but the way I see it, just like blood donations, it doesn't really work if there are months of no blood to carry to the needy. Just think if we all waited to come to the aid of our neighbor six months after a calamity. In both cases, commitments, actions matter to others.

And just as a blood donation doesn't remain a pint of fluid sitting in a lab, so your commitment to Calvary (in-kind or financial) doesn't remain just words or a ten dollar bill – both are transformed into life and hope for others. Dare I say that just as Jesus' precious blood gives life to sinners like us, Jesus' words of compassion to the wounded, the lonely and the destitute give them hope through us? I believe this is at least a part the kingdom of God.

Highlights of the CHURCH COUNCIL

FINANCE

Income in August was slightly lower than we saw in the prior year, but comparable. We can look at monthly income over the last 10 years and see the current month income is similar. Income from year-to-year is generally close on a monthly basis but can be skewed by large one-time gifts or the timing of Easter.

August activities were numerous and began with wishing well to two staff members as they moved on to their new calls. The congregation celebrated Pastor Ivy with a picnic meal and music by Paint the Town. Calvary held the first opportunity to pack backpacks with food for the weekend for Lewis and Clark students. There was an all-ages book club that concluded with making cookies. Kindergarten through fifth grade students were invited to an art camp. Noisy offering in August continued to be collected for St. Joseph's Food Pantry and the total collected for July and August was \$1,074.

Income through August was 6% lower (\$32,000) lower that the five-year average and expenses were 15% (\$113,000) higher than the five-year average. As we move into the fall schedule, with all the excitement that accompanies it, let us join together to encourage each other in how we are all called to Calvary.

CALL TO ORDER DEVOTION OLD BUSINESS

Global Friends!

Cynthia Shaab, who represents both the Grand Forks Global Friends Coalition, and the new to Grand Forks Church World Service affiliate, informed our Council of sixty people arriving in Grand Forks at some point in October!

We have yet to receive any details about where in the world these folks are coming from but we do know they will need support in a number of ways. Cynthia talked about congregations like Calvary supporting a family or two with wrap-around services that include the following six areas:

1. Education 2. Transportation 3. Housing 4. Health 5. Cultural Adjustment 6. Jobs and Finance The plan is to form a committee of at least one person in each of these stated areas, become educated in this whole process through the support of Global Friends Coalition and CWS and then remain advocates for three or more years. This is a big ask, a huge commitment, so it is with great trepidation that the Council is putting out an invitation to join in this hospitality committee. When Calvary says "All are welcome" did any of us see this coming? Can you even imagine God in the midst of all this? Well, if you talk to members who have been around awhile, they will tell you we've been a part of something like this in the past so it's not our first rodeo!

And so, of course, Cynthia reminded us that the GF area has been doing this work for many years now with literally hundreds of refugees. In other words, not only can it be done, it's been done with amazingly success, (though not without some struggles) - you know, like most if not all of our own families!

In conjunction with this new influx of neighbors, Calvary will be hosting a "Slice of Thanksgiving" celebration in our Fellowship Hall on the Sunday before Thanksgiving, November 20 at 3:00 pm. All are welcome to share a slice of pie and some ethnic desserts.
