A NOTE FROM PASTOR KIRK



The bright light of Epiphany calls the church to pay rapt attention to the needs of those whose lives have become defined by darkness. And some of that darkness has really increased (or deepened) because of these last ten months of pandemic. Into this dark moment, Calvary is slowly transitioning back from being physically distanced from other members to worshipping, learning and simply being back together. As I've said before, our experience of worship will be a bit frustrating for a while as the appropriate protocols prevent much of what we know of worship. Altru and public health have announced the first Tier of Phase 1B of the COVID-19 vaccination plan has begun. Community members who are 75 and older can contact the COVID Hotline at 701-780-6358 to be included on a vaccine waitlist. Due to the amount of vaccine allocated to the State of North Dakota the time needed to vaccinate the 75 and older population may take several weeks. Those who fit in future tiers of phase 1B and future phases should refrain from calling until we communicate that we are moving into the next tier.

Highlights of the CHURCH COUNCIL

December 2020

Treasurer's Report - Overview

Income in November was 27% lower than the prior year. While November income was higher than the prior two months, it was much lower when comparing to the prior year.

Calvary's November level of activities was lower when compared with prior Novembers. Worship continues to be live-streamed each Sunday and "Six Feet into the Word" is posted each Wednesday on Facebook. Confirmation classes and weekly Bible studies continue to be held on Zoom. The Angel Tree requests were released in November and many of the gifts have already been returned to share with those in need.

Year-to-date income through November was \$84,500 (10.8%) lower than the prior year and \$55,000 (7.3%) lower than the five-year average. Year-to-date expenses through November were \$39,600 (4.6%) lower than the prior year and \$23,700 (2.9%) lower than the five-year average. As we all are tired of waiting for our lives to go back to "normal," we are reminded we are in the season of Advent which is a time of waiting and preparation of Jesus' birth.

December's income was amazing! When comparing current year income to prior year, the current is 30% higher. The Calvary building in December was quite busy even without in-house worship. Confirmation and 4th grade students delivered poinsettias to Calvary members, four- and five-year-olds were invited to a milestone event, and an Advent Festival was held. A couple of maintenance items completed in December were replacement of the furnace that heats the Sanctuary and the Sanctuary pew cushions had a much-needed cleaning. Christmas Eve worship had some old and some new aspects. A traditional worship service and a contemporary worship service were posted online for those who preferred to worship indoors. A live nativity worship service and a hymn sing service were offered for those who chose to worship outdoors.

Yearly income through December was \$32,000 (3.4%) lower than the prior year and \$35,000 (3.5%) lower than the five-year average. Yearly expenses through December were \$35,000 (3.7%) lower than the prior year and \$41,600 (4.5%) lower than the five-year average. Financially, Calvary ended the year in a way we could not have predicted based on the ups and downs our world has seen in 2020. God is good!

Council Business

The Annual meeting will be held on January 31. The Nominating Team has secured just about every position for our 2021 Council. Those names will be given out in the annual report that goes out prior to the annual meeting. The Sanctuary furnace is fully operational and a few other smaller furnaces in the building are now back up and running too. In-person worship begins on January 17 and both ends of the building are ready to go technology wise for in-person and livestreamed worship.

Officers and Ministry Teams

Christmas Eve will be online and outside in-person. people have the ability to stay in their cars or come out on the grass area. The online services will be posted in the morning on December 24 so people can worship wherever it fits in their day. The last six weeks of 2020 were pretty busy with financial and giving focused communications to the congregation going out in multiple ways about stewardship We ended the year in the positive and were able to make all of our current and long standing commitments as well as benevolences. Confirmation classes and worship will begin in-person and small groups will again be able to meet sooin per the color chart made in 2020.

CONFIRMATION

We have made the switch back to in-person confirmation classes. Be sure to watch for the weekly e-mails to see which door to enter through and which space you will meet in. There are still some entirely online options watch for those classes if you are interested in that format. Don't forget a mask for in-person class! Registration continues to be open for classes and we will continue to add classes. We encourage students and families to register for classes that fit in your schedule! If there are classes that you would like to see added to the calendar, please reach out to Morgan via email! Your feedback is very helpful in the scheduling process!




