No one gets to tell Calvary when we have to re-open just as no one can force you to be in the building if you and your family don't feel safe.
- 3. **DIFFERENT** When the time finally arrives, there is no way we aren't celebrating ALL DAY AND ALL NIGHT!!! But please know this when that day comes, precautionary methods will still be fully employed at first. Physical distancing, hand sanitizers all over the place, masks, no fellowship, coffee, cookies or handshaking. Receiving communion will only be done if we find a way to do it safely and no singing for some time.

IT'S A MARATHON NOT A SPRINT

Because we've found ourselves in the midst of a world-wide pandemic that looks to be more long-term than we would have hoped, I want to make three bold-letter announcements:

- 1. **SAFETY** Calvary will err on the side of caution. There is no way we're going to open our doors if there is a decent chance that COVID19 could be picked up by someone who enters these doors.
- 2. **TRANSPARENCY** I will regularly communicate/update when our building will be ready for worship services, weddings, funerals, Bible studies and any group that has normally uses Calvary's facility. I will do this in coordination with our synod office, our church council and all the appropriate government agencies (local, state and federal) such as HHS, CDC and the NIH. No one gets to tell Calvary when we have to re-open just as no one can force you to be in the building if you and your family don't feel safe.
- 3. **DIFFERENT** When the time finally arrives, there is no way we aren't celebrating ALL DAY AND ALL NIGHT!!! But please know this when that day comes, precautionary methods will still be fully employed at first. Physical distancing, hand sanitizers all over the place, masks, no fellowship, coffee, cookies or handshaking. Receiving communion will only be done if we find a way to do it safely and no singing for some time.

On a more hopeful note, I've been asked about what a "slow opening" would look like. Here are some realistic examples:

- •Parking lot bingo, lots of bingo
- •Sharing a Bible study with anyone over the age of ten in the church yard while sitting at least 6 feet apart
- •Parking lot worship while in our vehicles via radio transmitter
- •Conducting an inurnment at our Columbarium while practicing physical distance Participating in socially distanced mission event outside the walls of Calvary (again, while practicing the safety measures we have all had to learn)

There's been talk about gradually allowing a certain percentage of our maximum capacity. For example: our Sanctuary holds 400 max so in this scenario the maximum would be 30% (or 120 worshippers) at first and 50% (or 200 worshippers) a couple of months later, but I don't think this would work at Calvary very well. After all, who gets to decide? Or would we schedule everyone in alphabetical order to attend not one service in the sanctuary and two in the Fellowship Hall but three in

the Sanctuary and four in the Fellowship Hall every Sunday? I'm a bit nervous about that one...

Here's what I know for sure: whatever we decide is wise (safe) today is going be up for re-negotiation a month from now, three months from now as well as in September and beyond. I take great solace knowing God is always with us, the church is not a building, that our livestreaming video worship services are doing well, that Zooming is a real asset and our staff as well as our members are

wonderfully committed to Calvary not just surviving this pandemic but to growing deeply through it.

If and when you have questions about the inevitable changes coming up, please pay attention to our website and Calvary's Facebook page. I promise to stay ahead of the information as best I can, so if you hear something helpful (or confusing) please call me or the church office.

OUTDOOR WORSHIP

Calvary will begin outdoor worship services on Sunday, June 14, at 9:00 a.m. on the west side of the building. The challenge is how to begin in as safe a way as possible during a worldwide pandemic. To give due diligence to everything safety wise, there will only be twenty, physically distanced worshippers allowed. If we are able to do this well, we will increase the number of worshippers in the near future. Masks will be required for everyone. so either bring your own or we will supply you with one. Of course there will be no physical sharing of Christ's peace, no passing of the offering plate or Holy Communion. In fact, we're trying hard to have everyone enter from one direction and exit in another with as little contact as possible.

I understand the sterile nature

of this worship service and hope we can slowly, methodically, add more elements of great Lutheran worship, but as you've heard so often these days, we're in a marathon not a sprint.

So here's the weekly drill for this service: call the church office and you'll be told if you're one of the first twenty. My expectation isn't to have the same twenty people every Sunday. Can the first twenty hold off for a week or so in order to allow others to experience this onsite worship? I hope so. Another outdoor worship experience we will begin to offer starting Wednesday, June 10 is parking lot worship in your vehicles with your car radios. Services will be at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday nights in the south parking lot. We will continue to look for safe ways that we can

gather in the name of Jesus. Who would have thought we would be in this position as a church four months ago?

(Not me.) We continue to make the online services better by investing in the technology that makes it possible so thank you for your feedback and patienc! I hope you inderstand how deeply the staff at Calvary not only miss you but are doing our level best to reach out to you in the name of Jesus via our online services.



MISSION TRIPS

Calvary's decisions regarding how to do ministry, including mission trips, are in accordance with CDC guidelines. Synod recommendations, and of course, informed by the comfort level of participants. We made the difficult decision to cancel both the Middle School Mission trip to Milwaukee, WI and the High School Mission trip to Logan, WV. While this certainly was not unexpected or surprising, the teams are feeling the hurt of yet

May Council Update

FINANCE UPDATE:

Income and expenses are about even from this time last year. Calvary has received the proceeds from the PPP loan. \$8000 has been used for payroll. The parking lot project should begin a week from today. The HVAC upgrade is on hold for now.

The new confirmation program was "rolled out" in April with confirmation families receiving information on the program. Three sessions of Zoom were held to help answer questions from families as they learn about the program. While the building has been quiet of activities, it has been busy receiving a refresh of spaces that while funded just had not been able to be completed with the constant use of Calvary's building. New carpet was installed in March and April throughout the building, offices were painted, and the youth room received a makeover.

Calvary members and friends are amazing! They continue to support Calvary and the community in the ways they feel called whether it is making masks for others, delivering school lunches, or calling and checking in on Calvary member and friends.

COUNCIL UPDATE:

The new carpet is installed and painting is complete. The technology upgrade is on its way to being complete. There was a breakin at the church where a crowbar was used to pry the door open. A staff laptop, wireless microphone and other miscellaneous items were stolen. We discussed the pros and cons of investing in an alarm system and security cameras to secure the building. We decided to install a deadbolt and install a latch guard over the lock to make the door more secure and keep the outer door by the office locked.

Reopening the church building is a process. We have and will continue to receive guidance from the Synod office but the final decision is up to the council. We will continue to assess day by day as the situation unfolds. Keeping a safe environment is the number 1 concern for our congregation.

We put out an online survey to quickly identify where and how to address the needs and desires of the congregation at this time. We also know that there are many opinions accross the board and we are doing our best to give space and discussion to all constructive responses. It takes every voice!

Pastor Ivy is continuing her women in the Bible series. Pastor Kirk spoke about the EaND Synod zoom meeting on May 17 where the only item on the agenda will be voting so we can narrow down the candidates for synod assbembly. Erin Navarro, Diane Stoley, Lori Kehrwald, Mike Mclean, Jana Hanson, and Matt Vanderpan would represent the council and Phylis Johnson is our delegate.

We continue to pray for our church, our community and the world.

Many of you may know that Bishop Terry Brandt resigned as bishop of the Eastern North Dakota Synod of which we are a part of. In the meantime. Interim Bishop Larry Wohlrabe has been called to span the time between Bishop Brandt's term and the election and installation of a new bishop. We, as a synod, are currently in the process of discernment in calling the new bishop and it has been narrowed down to the following 7 candidates:

First of all, I am not seeking to leave Calvary. My name was lifted up and I am stepping out in faith to see where the Holy Spirit leads.

I covet your prayers for myself, the other candidates, and the church as we discern who will be leading us into what God has in store for us. I cling to my favorite verse of scripture while trusting in God to lead us as a synod to the next chapter: "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ." Philippians 1:6
