
Calvary is a big church with a lot going on! That means many ways to connect with your church family- worship events, education opportunities for all ages, classes, groups, and activities. There is something for

# A NOTE FROM INTERN PASTOR AARON



I recently had a Zoom meeting with the students and advisors for our MDivX Cohort at Luther Seminary. We hadn't had a chance to see one another in person since last February and just needed a chance to reconnect that wasn't during a class period. While checking in, we all shared a wide range of highs and lows. People shared that they were struggling with all kinds of heavy burdens in their lives, such as sickness, challenges in their jobs, loss of family members, fighting with their spouses, infertility, loneliness, wildfires threatening their towns, snow already falling

and just fear and uncertainty. With those realities - they were also lifting up the joys of birthdays, promotions, more time with their families, anniversaries, a new puppy, having the chance to vote, taking road trips, getting a new bathroom tub, to snow already falling. While we all took turns sharing, one thing became clear, we are all in this together. I think that the Apostle Paul said it best; "Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep." (Romans 12:15). We are joined together in the community of Christ. Our burdens and our joys are to be shared with us all. Maybe some of these highs or lows are similar for you. Maybe you can relate as it feels like a lot right now for us all. At the end of the day, we are in it together, and God is ever present with us. And God doesn't expect us to do it all by ourselves, or do everything on our own. Author John Roedel put it this way...

Me: Hey God.

God: Hello....

Me: I'm falling apart. Can you put me back together?

God: I would rather not.

Me: Why?

God: Because you aren't a puzzle.

Me: What about all of the pieces of my life that are falling down onto the ground?

God: Let them stay there for a while. They fell off for a reason. Take some time and decide if you need any of those pieces back.

Me: You don't understand! I'm breaking down!

God: No – you don't understand. You are breaking through. What you are feeling are just growing pains.

You are shedding the things and the people in your life that are holding you back.

You aren't falling apart. You are falling into place. Relax.

Take some deep breaths and allow those things you don't need anymore to fall off of you.

Quit holding onto the pieces that don't fit you anymore. Let them fall off. Let them go.

Me: Once I start doing that, what will be left of me?

God: Only the very best pieces of you.

Me: I'm scared of changing.

God: I keep telling you – YOU AREN'T CHANGING!! YOU ARE BECOMING!

Me: Becoming who?

God: Becoming who I created you to be! A person of light and love and charity and hope and courage and joy and mercy and grace and compassion. I made you for more than the shallow pieces you have decided to adorn yourself with that you cling to with such greed and fear. Let those things fall off of you. I love you! Don't change-Become! Become who I made you to be. I'm going to keep telling you this until you remember it. Me: There goes another piece.

God: Yep. Let it be.

Me: So...I'm not broken?

God: Of course Not! - but you are breaking like the dawn. It's a new day. Become!! Become!!

# Highlights of the CHURCH COUNCIL

# October 2020

#### **Treasurer's Report - Overview**

September Overview: The expected lower monthly income we have been anticipating since April due to Coronavirus and no "in-the-building" worship, arrived in September. Income for September was 36% lower than the prior year. The inability to host worship in the building is one of many causes for the lower September income.

While the church was not as busy as past Septembers have been, there were still many activities happening around the building. There were four opportunities for drive-thru communion through September. A drive-in movie was held at the end of September that welcomed twenty-five carloads of excited movie goers. Confirmation classes continued throughout September with a different class format than we have offered in the past. Lastly, Calvary continues serving a meal at LaGrave on First every Tuesday and every other Saturday.

Year-to-date income through September was \$38,800 (6.3%) lower than the prior year and \$31,200 (5.2%) lower than the five-year average. Expenses year-to-date through September were \$22,600 (3.2%) lower than the prior year and \$28,700 (4%) lower than the five-year average. In the last quarter of the year, Calvary members and friends often accept the challenge to help Calvary finish the year financially strong. Let's work together to close the rather yucky year of 2020 on a positive note.

#### **Council Business**

The constitution, bylaw and continuing resolution updates are complete. They've been submitted to the Synod for approval and will be reviewed tonight with Council. The reopening plan is complete and will be implemented as needed. Our parish nurse, MaryAnn Devig, joined the executive team meetings to help produce a high quality, well-thought-out plan.

#### **Officers and Ministry Teams**

Sunday School is online with weekly lessons available on the website and Facebook page. They consist of a Bible story, music and activity. There are also "Grab-and-Go" bags available. There are three milestone events scheduled for each grade in Calvary's Fellowship Hall at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday afternoons.

Currently the church is doing Undies Sunday though United Way. There is a box in the entrance at door 1. Undergarments, socks, diapers, etc. for youth are what they're mostly looking for.

Blessing Bags are also in the entryway for door 1. People are able to grab a bag or two if they'd like. Fill it with \$5-\$10 worth of items for someone in need. There are further instructions in the bag.

#### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KIRK What color are we in anyway?

These are difficult days. There, I said it. This pandemic has caused us to continuously revamp our getting-back-together plans. We watched as the county slowly built up to the Red Zone and now we are bouncing between the Red and Orange Zones, the only thing written in stone is God's presence among us. Obviously worship will continue to happen, but as unfortunate as it is for all of us, this sacred time to thank and praise God together will only be done virtually until this COVID-19 is much less prevalent. (Which means a successful vaccine has been developed and distributed to a wide swath of our community.) When we move back to a lower community risk, we will work to adjust the plan at Calvary. We are blessed with the size to do some amazing things in the name of Jesus, but with that size comes challenges as well. Changing the course of a small boat is easier than a large ship, so please know if the COVID-19 numbers are consistently trending down and we make it back to orange, yellow or green - we get to change directions. For now, please keep your fellow siblings in Christ who are struggling mightily (including the staff) in your prayers. The history of the church is filled with long periods of suffering and displacement, so we join the ranks of amazing, courageous folks that's for sure.

Finally, just because our worship spaces are currently without worshippers, it doesn't mean ministry isn't taking place. Anyone who has called Calvary over the last seven or eight months can tell you we will do whatever it takes to respond to your concerns. I believe the Holy Spirit is breathing deeply among us these days.
