"GOD WHO IS LIKE A MOTHER" – LANGUAGE FOR ADDRESSING GOD PASTOR JARED CARSON




Language matters. Language has power to shape our thinking. Language both reflects and forms our attitudes and actions. In 2013, the ELCA revised a worship FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) document called, "How is language used in worship?" This document helps pastors, worship leaders, and others think about how we use language. Copies of this resource are available online. The document says, "As language shapes and influences human perceptions, the language we use for God shapes and influences our perceptions of God." It's important that we take time to consider the language we use to describe God and the language we use to address (or call out to) God. It is commonly agreed upon in Christian theology that God is beyond physical gender. And it is true that God has often been described using

masculine language. Because language is created and used by humans, it reflects the imperfections and limitations of our humanness. Therefore, no use of language can ever totally describe or represent the fullness of God. This is not an excuse, nor does it give us permission to be careless with our words. Instead, we should be more aware of the language we use.

As we approach Mother's Day, we can use the simile, "God who is like a mother" to contemplate the ways God nurtures and tends to each of us and all creation. And when we use feminine imagery for God, it is more suggestive of the loving and trusting relationship between a parent and a child. Think about the text of Psalm 91:1-4, which likens God's protection to that of the wing of a mothering bird or hen. Perhaps it is this Psalm that Jesus has in mind when he expresses his desire to gather up the broken and bruised people of Jerusalem "like a mothering hen" in Luke 13:34. The Hebrew word for Spirit used in the Old Testament is a feminine noun and uses a feminine definite article.

Mother's Day can be a challenging day for some people. We recognize that because of human sin, not everyone has good experiences with parents that are all together positive, even mothers. We grieve that some people experience pain on this day. And I invite us to contemplate the good maternal relationships that we have/had with our mothers or others who have been a mothering presence in our lives. We give thanks to God for them! These positive references give us glimpses and experiences that we can use as attributes for God's parental presence in our lives.

I believe this quote from the Jodie Picoult book *My Sister's Keeper*, sums up my experience with moms and our mothering God every well. "(24/7) once you sign on to be a mother, that's the only shift they offer." Many of us may recognize the laborious and exhausting task of mothers. We can see this image of maternal love in the faces of our own parents, friends, co-workers, others in our congregation, and even when we look in the mirror. This 24/7/365 labor of love is God's maternal expression for creation and everything in it. God is just this motherly toward us. God who made humanity, both male and female, in God's own likeness. Scripture shows us a motherly God who invites us to be just as ardent in our own walk of faith, as we tend and nurture the faith of others.

Highlights of the CHURCH COUNCIL

FINANCE - 2025 FINANCE REPORT

Income in March continued the trend of the first two months of the year with lower-than-expected monthly gifts. Easter did occur in March of 2024 which made the difference on the monthly level, but a number of factors could contribute to the lower monthly gifts. Timing of events in the church year, timing of large gifts or an overall lower giving pattern could all contribute to the monthly gift level.

March events included burning of the palms for Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lenten meals and worship, Calvary Classics potluck and a Family Glow Dance. The last two years the Lenten meals have been served by a different Calvary group each week. It is always fun to see new faces each week sharing their culinary gifts with the congregation. This year our Family Glow Dance was hosted in collaboration with Sharon and United Lutheran Churches. Noisy offering was collected for Feed My Starving Children in the amount of \$1,098.30.

Year-to-date income through March was 9% lower than the five-year average while expenses were 6% lower for the same time period. Calvary has so many opportunities to "be the church" each week. We pray our members and friends take those weekly opportunities and invest their time, talents, and treasures in their church home.

Worship

Extra service added for Easter Sunday in the Sanctuary at 10:30 a.m. helped a lot. There were five total worship options this year.


