# WHAT IS AT THE HEART PASTOR JARED CARSON



I enjoy chocolate hearts, meaningful cards, beautiful flowers, delicious dinner dates, and soft plush animals as much as anyone, but the heart of Valentine's Day is not about the things that we buy for those we love. The stories and legends of St. Valentine abound, but at the core of these stories we know that he was a witness and martyr to the faith of God in Christ Jesus. Love is all about being in

relationship. The Gary Chapman's 1995 book, *The Five Love Languages*, he reminds us that love is shared and received in many ways. Knowing and understanding the love language that most resonates with you and those with whom we share our love and affections is what makes love powerful. The five "love languages" are: gifts, quality time, words of affirmation, acts of service (devotion), and physical touch (intimacy). The challenge for some of us is that we have learned how to use and express only some of these love languages, and we are not very good at those. Or we employ the shadow side of love, which is the manipulative way we display love in order to trigger a response that we desire.

Here is where Chapman and the Christian faith in God through Jesus have confluence. As we sit on this side of Glory's vail, some of us might wonder if we are loved by God. Is God like us with our half-hearted and manipulative attempts to love? After all, we hear people quote scripture saying, "We were made in God's image". Can God completely love without being manipulative? Yes, this is where the stories of faith found in the Bible point to God's complete and total love for the whole creation in the person and life of Jesus Christ.

"And all these things are from God (being able to see the world and all people as new creations in Christ) who reconciled us to [God's own self] through Christ, and who has given us the ministry of reconciliation. In other words, in Christ, God was reconciling the [whole universe] to [God's own self], not counting people's trespasses against them, and [Christ] has given us the message of reconciliation. Therefore we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were making [God's own] plea through us. We plead with you on Christ's behalf, "[Live] reconciled to God!" (Pr. Jared's translation of 2 Cor. 5:18-20, adapted from NET)

Without manipulation, God gives the gift of God's own self in the incarnation of Jesus which is intended to restore us. God gives gifts of daily bread that are meant to sustain the world and all people. God provides family and friends who are to be caring and compassionate. God in Jesus breaks into human history and walks with us, offering us examples of quality time in relationship, acts of service and healing touch. By God's Spirit, we are empowered to be Christ's ambassadors bringing service and touching the lives of others. God in Christ offers us spoken assurance and displays affirmations of God's love and intent, even from the cross. Scripture bears witnesses to how God's action uses Chapman's five love languages to demonstrate to the world the power of divine love.

We recall also in the scriptures that "Perfect love casts out fear [or hatred]" (1 John 4:18). At the beginning of this new year, remember that we are a new creation in Christ Jesus and called to be ambassadors of Christ. By our baptism into Christ, "we are called to welcome all, following the example of Christ," as our baptismal liturgy says. Because of what God has done for us, our mission is to go into the whole world to share God's love through gifts, quality time, words of affirmation, acts of service, and physical touch. While God utilizes every pathway to express love, the power of God's love to transform lives is effective when we employ it to reach the needs of others. Love has come to usbthis Valentine's Day and this year we get to share it from the source! Amen.

#### **FINANCE - 2025 FINANCE REPORT**

Income in December was slightly lower than the prior year, but very comparable. There were a number of larger gifts received in December which helped finish the year better than we have seen in years past.

The December calendar was filled with activities for all. Some of the special annual events held in December were the Advent Festival, Thursday Music Club Christmas Musicale, Unforgettables choir concert, Christmas Cheer, Sunday and Wednesday School children telling the Christmas story, Christmas Cookie Exchange and a Quiet Christmas worship service. Noisy offering for the last seven weeks of the year was collected for the Angel Tree gifts in the amount of \$4,342.79.

Income ended the year 4% higher than our five-year average while expenses ended 2% higher for the same time period. Calvary's income exceeded our expenses considerably, and we were able to share gifts with local and global missions at higher level than in past years. We are thankful for our members and friends who give generously so Calvary can share generously in our community and world.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### Ministry Site Profile

Transition Team – Lori, Rachel, and Tony shared the draft of the team with council members. The document was discussed.

#### Call Committee

Pastor Jared stated the call committee will be formed as the Ministry Site Profile is finalized. Congregation members have shown interest, and Shari is willing to be the council designee.

#### Interim or Term-Call Search

Pastor Jared is working with the synod staff for a possible interim. The option of a Term Call Interim was also discussed. Diane posed a question to Pastor Jared regarding his scheduled days in Grand Forks and congregational needs on non-scheduled on-site pastoral service. Pastor Jared will continue his current schedule and will assess each circumstance and travel when needed for funerals, etc.

#### Nominating Committee report

The committee met today before the Finance meeting. Members brainstormed lists of potential members for leadership roles. They will work for a full slate of officers for the council, foundation, and nominating committee. Pastor Jared suggested consideration to add a youth member to Calvary's council with a one-year term. Discussion ensued and no action was taken.

#### RIC/All-Inclusive Team discussion

A recent event for congregation members yielded a meaningful gathering and helpful feedback. Communications received were thoughtfully discussed. The RIC committee is getting more feedback and the need for more information on the questions: Are we welcoming? What does it mean to be RIC designated?

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Report from nominations for the Annual Meeting. Diane reported on the candidates for the 2025 ballot. A candidate for the office of president of the Council is needed. Share ideas with Diane.




#### What is Calvary doing to participate?


