Dear Siblings in Christ,

Highlights of the CHURCH COUNCIL

FINANCE - 2025 FINANCE REPORT

Income in April began an upward trend as we hoped. There were a few annual gifts received in April that moved monthly gifts higher than the prior year as well as help from Holy Week and Easter gifts.

The April events calendar was filled from the beginning to the end. April began with installation of Chelsea Helland as Calvary's youth director, Feed My Starving Children MobilePack event was held April 11-12, Calvary Foundation grants were awarded, Holy Week began with Palm Sunday and ended with Easter Sunday, many eggs were delivered during the Easter-Egged Fundraiser, Camp Metigoshe led worship and the Calvary Classics toured the Rydell Toy Shop. Noisy Offering in April raised \$2,367.17 for the Lewis and Clark Float into Summer Book Drive.

Year-to-date income through April was 3.8% lower than the five-year average while expenses were 4% lower for the same time period. Calvary's current income direction feels promising and hopeful as we approach the summer months. We pray our members and friends continue to be "filled up" at Calvary, and remember, we are all in this ministry together. Everyone is needed to continue our amazing work at Calvary.


