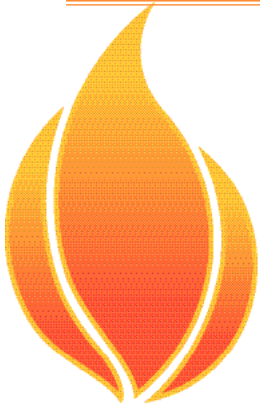

Campaign Update

While so many of us are sheltering in place for the health and welfare of our neighbors, there are certain professions that are able to keep working safely. One of those jobs is construction. Before COVID-19 changed so much around us, Calvary signed contracts to complete our SE parking lot project. The project initially began as part of the Forward in Faith campaign that began last fall.

I was contacted last week and everything is a go after the last of the snow melts on our vacated lot. After being told we have enough money from our campaign for this project, the construction will begin soon - maybe even next week. In case you are newer to our Calvary community, this parking lot space started a few years ago with the purchase of two houses which

The main office, some offices, the education office and the youth room were among the spaces that were painted. We are also able to go through things and inventory and reorganize because we have had to take everything out of every room that didn't get new carpet in the 2014 expansion.

Some cleaning that has been over due in strange places (like the vents in the Sanctuary) has been able



to happen because we have the time and had the absence of people in the space. This is a strange time in the life of the church but is an important reminder for us all that the church is not simply a building.

April Council Update

FINANCE UPDATE:

Income in March was \$5,200 lower than the prior year March. The cancellation of on-site worship for three of the five Sundays and two of four Wednesdays in March did make a difference in the monthly income. On a positive note, the gifts that have been received through online giving have helped tremendously to continue our ministry at Calvary!

Noisy Offering in March was collected for Feed My Starving Children in the amount of \$500. All events at Calvary in the second half of the month were cancelled in hopes we could help slow the spread of COVID-19 in our community.

Income through March was \$38,000 and \$9,700 higher than the prior year as well as the five-year average, respectively. Expenses through March were approximately \$21,000 higher than the prior year and \$16,000 higher than the five-year average. Calvary has amazing members and friends. Even without on-site worship, members and friends continue to “show up” in many

ways, delivering groceries to those who cannot leave their home, worshipping together each Sunday and Wednesday, and continuing to support Calvary in the ways they are able. Thanks be to God!

COUNCIL UPDATE:

Because of the coronavirus, all our plans have been either cancelled or put on-line. The staff has been sent home to as much work as possible - which has been considerable. The worship services have been appreciated I know and the Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services have been really amazing because the staff involved have really stepped up! Michaela Hepper has supplied some of the staff with the names of all our members so that we can connect with everyone who is physically isolated. We're all wondering when the new normal will begin so we pray for God's healing throughout the world that is suffering in so many ways. We hear so much about the frontline fighters and in some cases that is literally true in Emergency Rooms and in other

cases it's literally in our homes where being together is not new, it's a real challenge. Baptisms, funerals and weddings will all be impacted as we go forward so scheduling is going to be quite a deal in the months ahead.

Thank God for Zoom and other ways of communicating these days. Looking ahead, assumptions are that this isolation will continue through most if not all of the summer AND the Grand Forks/North Dakota area will see a significant rise in cases of sickness from this pandemic infection. How this will even further affect businesses, families and congregations will be seen but Calvary, I believe, has a large part in this scenario so please pray for what God is calling us into in the days, weeks, months and years ahead. Finally, if you or someone you know is struggling, please let one of us know. More than ever, you are our eyes and ears. I bet you never thought your call to be a part of Calvary's council would take on such an important role - kind of like the council in 1997!

UPDATES & MORE

I had a Zoom meeting yesterday (April 28) with the EaND Synod office and our Synod's eight Deans (I am one of them) to discuss two important items:

1. Our virtual Conference Assemblies. Our Grand Forks Conference Assembly will be staged here at Calvary on Sunday, May 17 at 2:00 and
2. How our congregations will be re-opening after the COVID pandemic begins to subside.

As far as our Assembly, only pre-registered members of our Conference are able to "attend" and vote this annual meeting which has as its main order of business the election of our next Bishop. We are tasked with passing on to the Synod Nominating Committee up to seven names of pastors who are seeking the call to serve as our Synod Bishop (six year term, up to three terms). Four Conferences have already met and we are one of the four that have yet to convene.

On the subject of re-opening Calvary, there are so many variables of course. Most people refer to a "soft re-opening" or as North Dakota is calling it, ND Smart Restart. How this will happen at Calvary is the job of our Council of course. After quite a bit of discussion with our Synod and Conference leaders, we know that masks, physical distancing, fellowship time, no passing of either offering plates or the sharing the Peace of Christ will be enforced. Anyone with pre-existing conditions, anyone over 65 and anyone who works with vulnerable people cannot physically be here yet. We are making plans to gather again but it will be when it is safe and we are as prepared as we can be.

Obviously we will continue to live-stream our worship services for the foreseeable future but we're thinking about offering a parking lot worship service if and only if a radio transmitter we've recently ordered actually works through our car radios in close proximity. We'll be trying it out for the first time at 2:00 pm on Sunday, May 10 at our "Drive in Bingo." Stay tuned and stay healthy!

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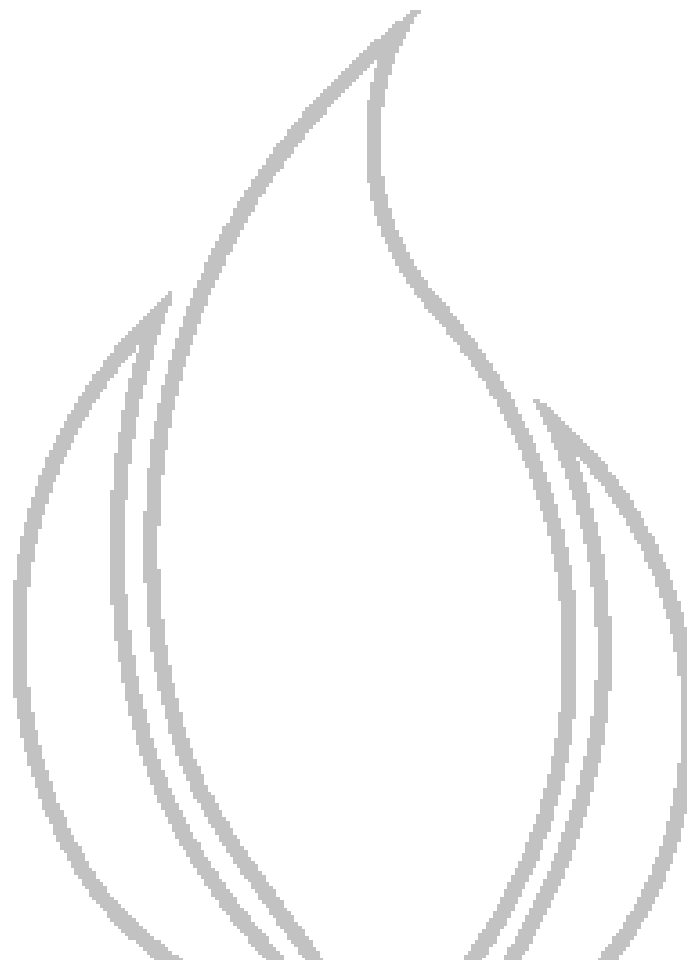

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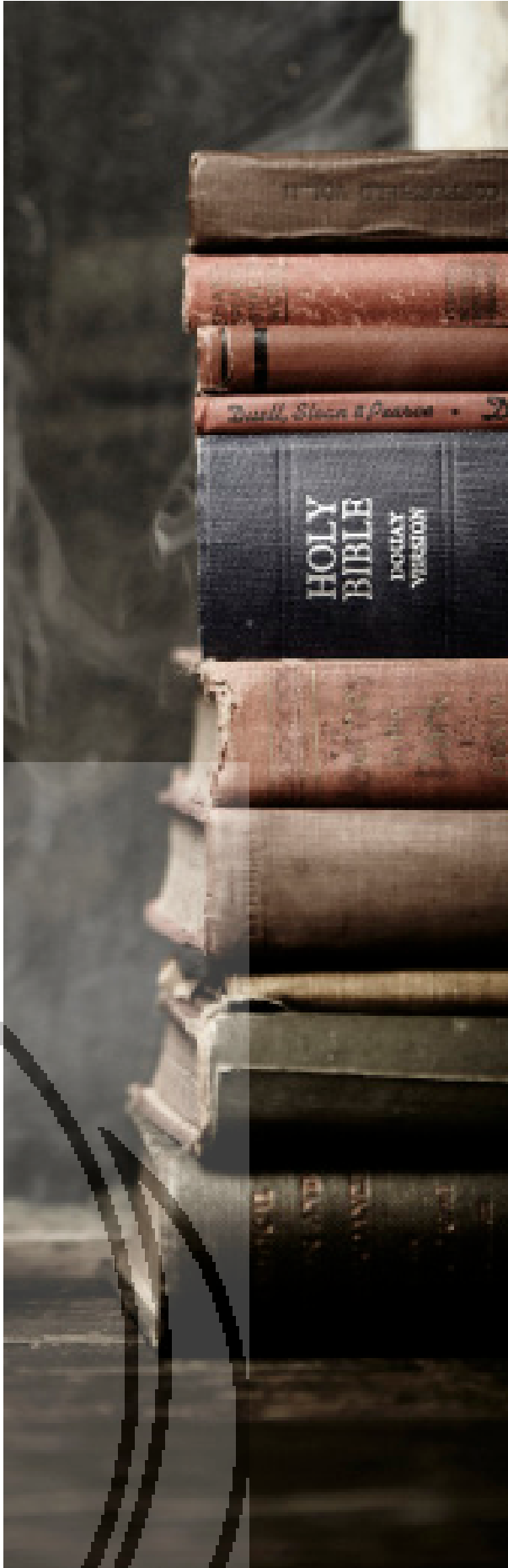
