

## Hi All

Today, two thirds of the population believes that there is other intelligent life in the universe and 40%-50% (and growing) believes in the reality of the UFO's and aliens or what is more broadly called the UFO phenomenon. That still leaves the rest of the population who either haven't thought about it, don't care or are in the highly skeptical camps who don't believe any of it.

I encourage you to watch two stories, one about David Grusch who I have talked a lot about already, and an older story about Travis Walton, who alleges that he was abducted in the 1970's. I have picked these two stories because they are two of the best that I have reviewed which illustrate many aspects of the UFO phenomenon. Another abduction story about Betty and Barney Hill in the 1960's has also been investigated many times and has some physical evidence will be reviewed in a future update. There is another story about Bob Lazar who claims that he worked on the reverse engineering of UFO's at S4 in Area 51 and, as time goes on, more information

about the validity of his claims has come forward. But I place the overall credibility of his story just behind David Grusch, Travis Walton and the Hills.

These are not trivial, simple stories. They are complex and require a considered and thoughtful mental approach. Skepticism is fine but you need to consider all the information as a whole and then ask yourself why would they make stuff up. Yes, hoaxes do happen and are uncovered in due course and freely admitted to by serious researchers. But several well documented hoaxes do not mean that thousands of other well documented and researched events are not real. Yes, events can be misinterpreted and that is why you need to look for corroborating information from different perspectives before you just rely on a knee jerk reaction that the story is BS.

It only takes ONE real (based on the strictest definition of real) event for it to be true - aliens exist and they have been to earth. We don't know who or what they are. We don't know their agenda other than well documented concerns about our development and use of atomic weapons. We don't know why they just don't go to the White House and hold a press conference.

They are likely physically, emotionally, biologically, socially, intellectually, spiritually so different from us that we currently can have no understanding of what they are like. Assuming that they are just like us only a lot smarter will lead us down many false paths as to what they truly are. They may not even be extraterrestrials. They could "simply" be us visiting from the future. Or trans/interdimensional beings who live in a multidimensional "heaven". For anybody to say that it is impossible simply puts you in the same category as our cave man ancestors who could only understand what was right in front of them. That doesn't mean that every crazy idea is possible. Maybe just some of the crazy ideas are possible. We don't need them all to be true for the UFO phenomenon to be true.
