

ORDINANCE NO. 94-2
BOROUGH OF CLINTONVILLE, VENANGO COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

An ordinance of the Borough of Clintonville, Venango County, Pennsylvania, providing for the provision of police services in the Borough; it is hereby enacted and ordained by the Council of the Borough of Clintonville, as follows:

Section 1. Creation of a Police Department

The Police Department of the Borough of Clintonville is hereby established.

Section 2. Authority of the Borough Council to Enter into a Cooperative Agreement

- (a) The Borough Council may enter into a cooperative agreement or contract with the Borough of Emlenton for the provision of police services as provided in Section 1122 of the Borough Code, the Act of February 1, 1966, P.L. (1965) _____, No. 581, 53 P.S. Section 46122.
- (b) Compensation, pension or benefits for the Borough police officers shall be as provided in the cooperative agreement or contract with the Borough of Emlenton.
- (c) The initial term of this cooperative agreement or contract shall not exceed one year, and it may be renewed after the review and resolution of the Borough Council for additional periods with each period not exceeding one year in length.
- (d) Borough Council shall make appropriations as needed to fund this cooperative agreement or contract.

Section 3. Appointment of Borough Police Officers

- (a) Borough Council may appoint, remove or suspend one or more suitable persons, citizens of the United States of America, as Borough police officers.
- (b) Borough Council may by resolution appoint and accept as Borough police officers the police officer or officers serving with the Borough of Emlenton and providing services through the cooperative agreement or contract. Disciplinary action of Borough police officers appointed through the cooperative agreement or contract shall be conducted in the manner provided in the cooperative agreement or contract.

Section 4. Authority of Borough Police Officers

- (a) The Borough police officer or officers may within the Borough or upon property owned or controlled by the Borough or by a municipal authority of the Borough, whether such property is within or outside the limits of the Borough, without warrant and upon view, arrest, and commit for hearing any and all persons guilty of breach of the peace, riotous or
