Should any of the behaviour outlined in this policy occur on madrasah premises the madrasah may feel it is necessary to contact the appropriate authorities and if necessary, even ban the offending adult from entering the madrasah grounds.

We trust that parents and carers will assist our madrasah with the implementation of this policy and we thank you for your continuing support of the madrasah.

At Madrasah Abu Hurairah, we are very fortunate to have a supportive and friendly parent body. Our parents recognise that educating and raising children is a process that involves partnership between parents, class teachers and the madrasah community. As a partnership, our parents will understand the importance of a good working relationship to equip children with the necessary skills for their life beyond madrasah. For these reasons, we continue to welcome and encourage parents/carers to participate fully in the life of our madrasah.

The purpose of this policy is to provide a reminder to all parents, carers and visitors to our madrasah about the expected conduct. This is so we can continue to flourish, progress and achieve in an atmosphere of mutual understanding.

Behaviour That Will Not Be Tolerated

- Disruptive behaviour which interferes or threatens to interfere with the operation of a classroom, office area or any other area of the madrasah grounds, surrounding area or area occupied by staff and children of the madrasah.
- Using loud or offensive language, swearing, cursing, using profane language or displaying temper.
- Threatening to do actual bodily harm to a member of school staff, visitor, fellow parent/carer or pupil regardless of whether or not the behaviour constitutes a criminal offence.
- Damaging or destroying madrasah property.
- Abusive or threatening emails or text/voicemail/phone messages or other written communication.
- Defamatory, offensive or derogatory comments regarding the madrasah or any of the pupils/ parent/staff at the school, on facebook or other social sites. Any concerns you may have about the madrasah must be made through the appropriate channels by speaking to the class teacher, headteacher or senior leaders, so they can be dealt with fairly, appropriately and effectively for all concerned.
- The use of physical aggression towards another adult or child. This includes physical punishment against your own child on school premises.
- Approaching someone else's child in order to discuss or chastise them because of the actions of this child towards their own child (such an approach to a child may be seen to be an assault on that child and may have legal consequences).
- Smoking and consumption of alcohol or other drugs whilst on or near madrasah property.

All of the above apply to when madrasah is taking place on site as well as during periods of remote learning. The online learning platforms we use are considered to be areas occupied by staff and children of the madrasah.
