COFFEE FACTS

Coffee dates back to 800 A.D.

Coffee beans are technically seeds. They're the pits of the cherry-like berries found on the flowering shrubs, but we call them "beans" because of the resemblance to legumes.

Only two U.S. states produce coffee.

Kona coffee is the United States' gift to the coffee world. Because coffee traditionally grows best in climates along the equator, Hawaii's weather is optimal for harvesting beans.

Espresso means "pressed out" in Italian.

This refers to the way espresso is made — forcing boiling water through pressed coffee grounds. And although espresso has more caffeine per volume than coffee, it would take three shots to equal the amount in a regular cup of joe.

Coffee drinkers tend to live longer.

Research has linking moderate consumption (about three to four cups per day) with a longer life span, plus a reduced risk of cardiovascular disease, type 2 diabetes and Parkinson's, according to Harvard Health Publishing.

One cup of black coffee only has one calorie.

Adding sweeteners, cream, and other mix-ins can quickly jack up the total. A venti Java Chip Frappuccino from Starbucks contains 88 grams of sugar and 600 calories — more than a McDonald's Big Mac!

Keep Your Eyes Open for SB 330 & SB 592

Now Senator Wiener is working to revive SB 50 for passage in 2020. In the meantime, you may want to keep your eyes and ears open for SB 592, and SB 330. SB 592 says: If a city rejects a luxury housing project as too big or too tall, developers can argue that city rules aren't "economically viable" for them. It exports Silicon Valley's tragedy to everyone: huge luxury dorm projects allowed statewide, destroying neighborhoods that investors want to gentrify for pricey micro-units. Lets developers demolish a 1,200-sq-ft home to build a 5,000-sq-ft mansion with a 400-sq-ft luxury mini-unit. No affordable units required. It's a big reward for corporate rentals. SB 330 needs our attention: Nancy Skinner's luxury housing bill FAILS to require a single unit of affordable housing. It silences the public, allowing just 5 hearings per project, forcing cities to hoard all 5 for entities like Planning Commission & City Council. Goodbye to neighborhood hearings. Urges developers to sue cities for \$10,000 to \$50,000 per "denied unit" if a city rejects a bad project. Skinner says it "streamlines" approvals. NO. Lawsuits will jam state courts. Trashes community planning, encouraging spot-zoning in which Sacramento hands power to luxury housing developers to decide what, and where, to build. Please pay attention to the developments around our area and whether your are for or against the upcoming bills, let your voice be heard.
