

HILLTOP'S HEROES By Bill Pope • HERO Organizer

If you recently saw a group dressed in yellow and red, it was not a meeting of the Canary-Lovers Club. It was Hilltop's Emergency Response Organization (HERO) conducting their Annual Refresher Drill. HERO is composed of several specialized teams.

THE DAMAGE SURVEY TEAM, lead by Carol Schunk, reviewed the possible levels of damage to Hilltop homes as that will set the priorities for our Search & Rescue Team's activities. Damage Survey Team members then retrieved radios from the Wayne Burklund Emergency Equipment Container acquired with your HNA dues, and surveyed their assigned routes through the neighborhood looking for damaged homes depicted in photos. The Teams radioed in each incident as they were found. Participants were Barrie Levi, Julia Quinn, Bruce Dickieson and Anne Pope.

THE SEARCH & RESCUE TEAM lead by Bill Pope reviewed their SIZE-UP, SEARCH and RESCUE procedure where each letter serves as a memory-aid for what to do. Bill then presented the results of his work with a Structural Engineer from the State's Post-Disaster Safety Assessment Program on which damaged buildings are safe to search and which are not. The S&R Team then reviewed the appropriate extraction device and patient lift to use for a victim's injuries, and learned how to use our new Kendrick Traction Splint to greatly reduce the pain of a broken leg. Attending were Sam Bertolet, Harriet Fischer, Robert (Rab) Brown, Craig Jaffe and David Kent.

THE MEDICAL TEAM's Drill was led by David Shapendonk. David did a review of the Medical Team's standard tasks of Primary Assessment, Triage and Secondary Assessment and where each is performed. Medical teams will likely be the first HERO teams sent to lightly damaged homes because patients can be assessed, treated and left in their homes. Here Medical Teams will perform all three procedures including advanced First Aid. At moderately damaged homes, Search & Rescue Teams will locate, perform Life Saving Intervention and extract victims for treatment by Medical Teams outside or at the Ball field Command Center until hospitals open—which hospitals say may take several days.

Medical Team members then practiced the above procedures, taking turns playing victim. Participating were David Shapendonk, Marla Rubin, Ed Rugoff, Renee Tondelli, Mary Hruska and Lance Harding.

HERO will need many more members to help the many predicted to be trapped or injured after the long overdue Major earthquake coming our way. North Venice's fall baseball season is in full swing, with the largest turnout for the fall season in recent memory. Games are played on Saturdays and Sundays, weekly until Thanksgiving.

There is a newer division called "50/70" which stakes the pitchers mound 50 feet away from the batter, and has 70-foot basepaths, to help intermediate players adjust from Little League to high school baseball.

The Major Division, which has boys and girls aged 10 thru 12, has 6 teams this fall.

perfect time to teach new skills to players, and is not focused solely on winning ballgames. Games are usually 4-5 innings, with a 4-run cap per inning. Pitchers are only allowed to pitch 2 innings in the fall, to help protect their young arms.

The Minor Division, which has boys and girls aged 8-10, is the first time young players pitch at full Little League distance. These games are played with a 1 hour and 45 minute time frame, to keep the attention of the players. Stealing bases is permitted, but for

the fall season the home plate is closed for stealing, which encourages coaches to teach their young players to drive in runs.

5-Pitch and Farm are dedicated to the younger players, aged 5-8, depending on skill set. Fundamentals are the primary focus of the coaches for their young players at this level.
