Did you know? – At least three Federal Judges were Riverside students. **Judge Thomas Fairchild** (1929) served on the Wisconsin Supreme Court from 1956 to 1966. He was then appointed by **President Lyndon Johnson** to serve on the 7th Circuit Court of Appeals where he served until 1981.



Judge Terrance Evans (1958) was appointed by **President Jimmy Carter** to serve as a U.S. District Judge for the Eastern District of Wisconsin in 1979. He served in that position until 1995 when he was appointed by **President Bill Clinton** to serve on the U.S. Court of Appeals, 7th Circuit. He served in that position until his death in 2011.

Judge Rudy Randa (1958) was elected Municipal Judge in Milwaukee. In 1979, he was elected Circuit Judge for Milwaukee County and appointed to the Wisconsin Court of Appeals in 1981. In 1992, he was nominated by **President George W. Bush** to a seat on the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin. He served as Chief Judge of that court from 2002 until his death in 2016.
