between police and the community. Before accepting his new



Since 2009, Ballard has made recommendations and determined the release of more than \$250,000 for service projects in more than a dozen municipalities. He is also the Founder and President of Milwaukee's Finest Scholarship Foundation and Co-Founder of Lead2Change Incorporation.

After graduating from Riverside University High School in 2013, Ballard enrolled at Columbia College Chicago for Broadcast Journalism. During college, Jerel interned with the Mayor of Chicago, Rahm Emanuel. After working closely with the mayoral staffers in Chicago, Ballard accepted another internship with United States Senator, Richard "Dick" Durbin. While studying Political Science at George Mason University, Ballard held a second internship as a Crisis Communication Research Analyst for the nationally recognized public relations firm, Kglobal. After his return to Milwaukee, Ballard interned with Mayor Tom Barrett and the Argosy Foundation while launching the Milwaukee's Finest Scholarship Foundation.

2020 Scholarships Announced

The Riverside Foundation exists to promote, encourage and support the maintenance of Riverside's long history of academic excellence.

We also provide higher education scholarships and awards to deserving students. Our Board of Directors includes RUHS graduates, parents and teachers. We are pleased to announce the following scholarships available for the 2020 RUHS graduating class.

Tom Bauch Scholarship: requires a student interested in pursuing a liberal arts or general knowledge studies track at a university, emphasis on English Literature and liberal arts and writing skills. \$2000 first year, could be renewable with continuing success in college.

Bezella Family Scholarship: to be awarded to a senior who has an interest in pursuing studies and a career in science, technology, engineering or math. One \$5000 renewable scholarship for a four year college or one \$2000 renewable scholarship for a two year college.

Bette Cano Community and School Service Scholarship: to be awarded to student based upon community and school service. \$500.

Drew/Washabaugh Family and Friends Scholarship: for a senior who has been accepted to a Wisconsin School such as Marquette, Cardinal Stritch, Alverno, MATC, UWM, UW or another school in the Wisconsin University system. They need to present their plan for funding their education in their application and a 2.5 GPA. An interest in liberal arts studies will be given

special consideration. Three individual scholarships of \$2000.

Jim Gibson Scholarship: to be awarded to a student athlete, also based upon GPA, financial need and community service. Six \$1000 scholarships.

Ellen Hader Scholarship: to be awarded to a senior who plans to study visual arts. \$500

Legacy Scholarship: awarded based on academic achievement, student activity participation, demonstrated community service and financial need. Also, student needs to be able to articulate about the legacy they have passed on to RUHS. \$1000.

RUHS Foundation Scholarship: \$500-\$1000 scholarships awarded to seniors based upon GPA, financial need, participation in school activities and community service.

Thornberg Scholarship: to be awarded to a senior who plans to pursue a career in education. \$1000 scholarship, possibly renewable.

Werner Family Scholarship: for a senior who has maintained a 3.0 GPA in high school, has been an active participant in extracurricular programs, has demonstrated a commitment to serving the community and a financial need. \$1000.
