From the Pastor's Nook:

Protesting as a Form of Following Jesus

When we think of following Jesus, we often imagine acts of kindness, compassion, prayer, and service. But what if we also recognized that following Jesus sometimes means standing up — publicly and courageously — against systems of injustice? What if protesting is not only a political act, but also a spiritual one?

Throughout the Gospels, Jesus' ministry was filled with moments of protest. He challenged corrupt leaders, broke social barriers, and disrupted the status quo in the name of God's love and justice. When he overturned the tables of the money changers in the temple (Matthew 21:12–13), he was protesting economic exploitation. When he healed on the Sabbath (Luke 13:10–17), he was challenging rigid systems that valued rules over people. When he proclaimed, "Blessed are the peacemakers," (Matthew 5:9) he invited his followers to pursue peace not through silence, but through active engagement in the work of reconciliation.

Protesting, in its truest sense, is about bearing witness — shining light on what is wrong so that healing and justice can begin. For people of faith, it's a way to live out the prayer we say each week: "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." When we march, speak, write letters, or stand beside those who are oppressed, we are helping to make that prayer tangible in the world.

Monthly Family Sunday: Once a month, worship includes interactive storytelling or a children's message that engages everyone.

Intergenerational Events: Service projects, movie nights, or art workshops where all ages learn and grow together.

WORSHIP NOTES

Why We Practice Open Communion at the Presbyterian Church of Sweet Hollow

At The Presbyterian Church of Sweet Hollow, we joyfully practice *open communion*—meaning that all who seek to follow Jesus Christ are welcome at the Lord's Table. You don't have to be a member of our church, or even Presbyterian, to share in this sacred meal. The invitation comes not from us, but from Christ himself.

In the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), we understand the Lord's Supper as a gift of grace, not a reward for perfect faith. It is a reminder that God's love precedes our belief, our doubts, and our divisions. When Jesus gathered his disciples around the table on the night before his death, that circle included those who would soon deny, doubt, and even betray him. Still, he took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them—saying, "Do this in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19).

That invitation echoes through time. Each time we gather at the table, we remember that we come not because we are worthy, but because we are invited. The communion table is a place of belonging, forgiveness, and unity—a foretaste of God's kingdom where all are fed.

By practicing open communion, Sweet Hollow bears witness to a faith that is hospitable and hopeful. It reflects our Reformed belief that God's grace cannot be confined by human boundaries. It also reminds us that Christ meets us right where we are—with our questions, our struggles, and our joys—and still says, "Come, eat, and be nourished."

So when we share in the bread and the cup, we do so as one body, trusting that Christ is present among us and that love is what truly binds us together. Whether you are here every week or visiting for the first time, you are welcome at Christ's table.

Come, taste and see that the Lord is good.

Supporting God's Mission Through Special Offerings




