Reformation (Part I)

As Christians, our Presbyterian faith began with Jesus' disciples. It grew through the early church, the organization of the Roman Catholic Church, and then through the Reformation. When Martin Luther grew weary with the 'fatal flaws' of the Catholic Church, he nailed some ideas to the church's front doors in 1517. He hoped for reform, not a new church. Nevertheless, the winds of the Holy Spirit stirred the people and blew this movement around the world. Today, the Protestant branch of the Christian faith includes Lutherans, Anglicans, Presbyterians, Methodists, Baptists, and more.

This October is the 500th Anniversary of Luther's protest. The Presbyterian Church of Sweet Hollow looks forward to celebrating the Reformation through worship and Christian Education opportunities. October 1 will be our annual observance of World Communion Sunday, when we join millions of other Christians around the Table, singing songs and praying prayers in a variety of languages. Beginning October 8, we will step back into our history each Sunday through October 29. We will use different prayers and orders of worship, corresponding to particular points in our own congregation's history. Please join us for these time-travelling services of praise and prayer, word and song. As you enter the doors, however, do not come to watch the spectacle, but bind your heart to the saints who have gone before.

Martin Luther wrote about those worshippers in the Reformation: "Those who come out of curiosity and the desire to gape at something new will soon be sick and tired of the whole thing... As for the rest, no law nor order, exhortation nor driving, that one can devise, is of any good to induce them to go willingly and of their own accord to Divine Service, so unwilling and reluctant are they to do so (though God takes no pleasure in forced service), so idle and good-for-nothing."

So let us gather – willingly – to worship God with the saints, apostles, and martyrs, and all those of every time and place. Be the church. Sundays at 10 am.

Galda entered the Church Triumphant on July 19 at the age of 94 and was buried in Calverton National Cemetery next to her husband Charles who died almost exactly four years earlier. Galda and Charles joined the Presbyterian Church of Sweet Hollow in February 1989.

They have two sons, Gary and Brian, and have been living in a lovely house on Prospect Street in Huntington Village. Gary, an architect, carefully restored this historic house. Gary arranged the house so he could carry out his design work on display and upscale houses on the first floor and his parents could live on the second floor. Charles had been an airline pilot and member of the Early Flyers Club while Galda handled the financial work for Gary. Unfortunately, as time progressed, the narrow steep staircase confined them to the upper floor with its marvelous views.

Gary designed and donated the Labyrinth Garden at Sweet Hollow in memory of his parents.

Fall Church Brunch Program Begins Tuesday, October 10

Church Brunches this fall will start on the second Tuesday of each month at 10:00 am — October 10, November 14 and December 12. Mark these dates on your calendars now.

We will begin our 16th Brunch Season with a program which takes a look at the Sayings of Jesus from the *Gospel of Thomas*. We are not familiar with the *Gospel of Thomas* because in 367 AD it wasn't chosen to be included as one of the 27 works to form the New Testament. The *Gospel of Thomas* is one of many early Christian writings now known as the apocrypha, a word taken from a Greek word meaning "hidden" or "secret." We will be listening on a DVD to David Brakke, Chairman of History of Christianity and a professor of History at Ohio State University. During the first two or three hundred years following the death and resurrection of Jesus, there were many different Christian writings used at the many Christian churches around the Mediterranean before an agreement was forged to have an official cannon of 27 works forming the New Testament. The *Gospel of Thomas* is the most famous of the apocryphal gospels and was thought to have been lost until a copy was found in Egypt in 1945. Come join us as we listen to a very interesting story.

The second Tuesday, October 10, will be the kickoff Church Brunch for the Fall 2017 - Spring 2018 season. We'll have freshly-brewed decaf coffee to accompany some delicious goodies. Join us at 10:00 am or whenever your schedule permits. We'll be in the church parlor until 12:30 pm.


News From The Pews
