Reformation (Part II)

This month is the 500th Anniversary of Luther's protest. We will celebrate our ongoing reformation through worship and Christian Education opportunities. Beginning Sunday, October 8, we will use orders of worship from our congregation's history and significant Protestant reformers. Old pictures and records will be available for viewing during coffee hour. Special guests may join us each week. Reformation Sunday (October 29) will conclude our celebration. Please join us for these time-travelling services of praise and prayer, word and song.

What's it all about?

The early Reformers sought to purge the church of its fluff and flaws, and restore the church to the essentials: God, scripture, faith, and grace. In their questions and dogged pursuit of God's presence in the world, they changed the course of both sacred and secular, familial and political communities. From Martin Luther (Wittenberg, Germany) to John Calvin (Geneva, Switzerland) to John Knox (Edinburgh, Scotland) to William Leverich (at Old First Presbyterian Church, Huntington), they looked for the ways God was re-forming the church, and realigning its mission. Their footsteps lead from the 16th century through the founding of Old First Presbyterian (1658) to Sweet Hollow's establishment (1829) and into our congregation today. Our reformation continues as we consider who God is *here* and *now*, and who we have become through God's recreation of our community.

We see our reformation when babies are born and new church officers are installed. We see our reformation when a new program is begun and a tired one is discontinued. Thus, our reformation is not yet complete. We continue to examine ourselves, asking what God is doing *now*. We continue to wonder what God would have us do *now*. And, like the early reformers, we continue to wonder what fluff and flaws distract us from the essentials. What stands in the way of loving God with our whole heart and mind and soul – whether it is dogma, practice, institutions, social pressures, or other diversions?

The Presbytery of Long Island is our partner in our ongoing reformation. Over the past two years, they guided Sweet Hollow as we examined and evaluated our history and present identity, as well as the places God calls us next. Our Visioning Task Force did this work and gave us a better understanding of our identity and immediate challenges. Now we move to the next steps.

At the direction of the Presbytery, this fall our congregational Nominating Committee will prepare a list of candidates to serve as church officers and members of our next Pastoral Nominating Committee (to be presented at our annual meeting in January). The Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC) will prepare a "resumé" for Sweet Hollow, then search for pastoral candidates to fit our current needs and lead us to the place God calls us. This process will take at least a year. Let us pray for those who will form the PNC, and the work that they will do.

My position as Designated Pastor is a temporary call to Sweet Hollow. Presbytery allows the call to be renewed once (which happened in May 2017). It is my job to minister to and with you until a permanent pastoral relationship is formed. There are many questions about what will happen in the coming months. Please contact me or a Session member if you would like to be involved, or have any concerns about the process. Updates will be shared through monthly newsletters and bulletin announcements. Though the church, the world, and we ourselves change, we trust in God's unchanging and abiding presence.

Fall Church Brunch Program Begins Tuesday, October 10

Church Brunches this fall will start on the second Tuesday of each month at 10:00 am — October 10, November 14 and December 12. Mark these dates on your calendars now.

We will begin our 16th Brunch Season with a program which takes a look at the Sayings of Jesus from the *Gospel of Thomas*. We are not familiar with the *Gospel of Thomas* because in 367 AD it wasn't chosen to be included as one of the 27 works to form the New Testament. The *Gospel of Thomas* is one of many early Christian writings now known as the apocrypha, a word taken from a Greek word meaning "hidden" or "secret." We will be listening on a DVD to David Brakke, Chairman of History of Christianity and a professor of History at Ohio State University. During the first two or three hundred years following the death and resurrection of Jesus, there were many different Christian writings used at the many Christian churches around the Mediterranean before an agreement was forged to have an official cannon of 27 works forming the New Testament. The *Gospel of Thomas* is the most famous of the apocryphal gospels and was thought to have been lost until a copy was found in Egypt in 1945. Come join us as we listen to a very interesting story.

The second Tuesday, October 10, will be the kickoff Church Brunch for the Fall 2017 - Spring 2018 season. We'll have freshly-brewed decaf coffee to accompany some delicious goodies. Join us at 10:00 am or whenever your schedule permits. We'll be in the church parlor until 12:30 pm.

White Christians Have Become a Minority Group in America

The Public Religion Research Institute (PRRI) has just released the results of its 2016 survey of interviews with 101,000 individuals in the 50 states on their attitudes to religion. The national results show continuing declines in church membership during the past 10 years, white Catholics from 16 percent to 11 percent, white mainline Protestants from 18 to 13 percent and surprisingly white evangelicals from 23 to 17 percent.

Nationally, white Christians now account for only 43 percent of Americans and only 30 percent are white and Protestant. New York is the most diverse state, having the largest number of different religious groups. The largest religious group in New York state is Catholic with 31 percent. The second largest is unaffiliated with any religious group - 25 percent, and the third largest in New York state is black Protestant with 9 percent. Of the national unaffiliated group, 16 percent identify themselves as religious persons.

Sweet Hollow has always been a welcoming church. "You'll Know We Are Christians By Our Love" is a hymn we've recently sung which sums up Sweet Hollow. Robert P. Jones has written a book, *The End of White Christian America*, which will be our selection for the October Book Discussion. The discussion might assist in moving forward on the selection of our next pastor.
