### From the Pastor's Nook . . . . .

#### Taking peace for granted....

Here in the United States I think we can fall into the trap of taking peace for granted. While we have our squabbles as a country (and yes they are ever-present), 21<sup>st</sup> century Americans have enjoyed a peaceful existence. When was the last time you worried about our country being invaded by a massive military force? For many of us, it may have been 21 years ago, but even then, that component of our history was more terrorist-driven than outright invasion.

The scenes from Ukraine in recent days are distressing and frightening. They remind us how fragile peace in the world is. To think that only days ago the people of that country were getting on with their lives, making plans for their families, their businesses, their education, and now suddenly their lives, homes and futures are under threat. One of the awful things about war is the way that it suddenly destroys everything in its path. It disrupts normal life and overnight introduces death, destruction, violence, fear, sorrow and grief.

Watching our screens from our living rooms or work places, we live and work in comfort while feeling powerless to help. Our hearts and our prayers go out to the people of Ukraine who didn't ask for this war, and who simply wanted to be left to get on with their lives, their jobs and with bringing up their families. Now they must hide, shelter, and even run for safety to protect themselves and their children.

Jesus said to His disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives."

Our obligation as Christians is to offer each other the peace of Christ that never goes away. This Lenten season, there will be a sharing of peace every Sunday with the shared phrasing, "The peace of Christ be with you. And also with you."

I invite you all to reflect on those words every day during the season of Lent and in doing so to pledge that we will never take peace for granted - but instead we will pray for peace, work for peace and make sacrifices for peace. I suggest that after these words are prayed Sunday morning during Lent, we might pause for a brief moment to pray that the peace of the Lord will be with the people of Ukraine and guide the efforts of all those who are working to restore peace there, and in other countries across the world where war and violence are raging.

And if you find it in your hearts to do so, share the following prayer with all you can...

***Loving God, we pray for the people of Ukraine, for all those suffering or afraid, that you will be close to them and protect them. We pray for world leaders, for compassion, strength and wisdom to guide their choices. We pray for the world that in this moment of crisis, we may reach out in solidarity to our fellow human beings in need. May we walk in your ways so that peace and justice become a reality for the people of Ukraine and for all the world.***

***Amen.***




# How We Can Provide Aid To Ukraine

As we witness the unsettling events unfolding in Ukraine, many of us are looking for ways to help. The Mission Team has compiled the following list of organizations that are providing aid to Ukraine:

***Global Giving Ukraine Crisis Relief Fund***-The Ukraine Crisis Relief Fund by Global Giving sprang into action once Russia declared war on Ukraine last week. Their website states, "Your donation will help affected communities in Ukraine, with a focus on the most vulnerable, including children, who need access to food, medical services, and psychosocial support."

***Save The Children***-According to Save The Children, 7.5 million kids are in danger of physical harm, emotional distress, and displacement due to the invasion in Ukraine. Even before the conflict escalated last week, there were already 400,000 children there who needed humanitarian aid. On their official website, Save the Children states they "will use donations made to their Ukraine Crisis Relief Fund to help families meet their basic needs such as food, medicine and shelter."

***The International Committee of The Red Cross***-As per their website, "Recent work includes visits to places of detention to help improve hygiene and nutrition. The security situation permitting, our teams now in Ukraine will continue their work to repair vital infrastructure, support health facilities with medicines and equipment, and support families with food and hygiene items."

***Razom For Ukraine***-According to its official website, the organization is named Razom for Ukraine because Razom "means 'together' in Ukrainian and serves as a constant reminder of the community that it takes to create, build and do, to stay the path towards a more prosperous and democratic Ukraine." This organization has been helping Ukrainians since it was first established in 2014.


## “Marching into Building Healthier Communities”

Our successful food drive for our “Souper Bowl of Caring” is now followed by focusing on “Building A Healthy Community One Individual at a Time”.
