# From the Pastor's Nook . . . . .

Are you ready to (re)build? For many years, at least 20, I was in a constant effort to tear my body

down by feeding it the wrong things. Having a food addiction, I was in a constant state of feeding my body junk. Tasteful junk, but junk nonetheless (and yes, some of that junk was distasteful as well). It wasn't until I was approaching my 50s that I realized how much damage I had done and I needed to rebuild my body.

Rebuilding the body after decades of damage is not easy. It is about changing habits. And one of the habits that needed to change was about what I put into my mouth. The church is in a similar space right now. We have a rebuilding project to undertake.

There are two important points to be made here. The first is understanding what we are taking in. The second is what are we sending out?

The first item is pretty simple here. What we are taking in is as simple as what is the message that we are investing in for the church? How are we investing in the church? What are we doing to help grow the investment in the church?

That brings us to item number two. We have to change what comes out of our mouth.

As we emerge from the cloud of CoVid (which is a cloud we hope stays away for a long time), we have to be incredibly intentional about how we have to rebuild the church. In rebuilding the church, we have to ----Continued on Page 3

realize that things will have changed forever. Things like Zoom meetings, Facebook streaming, and mask wearing are going to stick around. It is unrealistic to expect things to return to the way they were.

We have to forge forward instead of stumble backward. And part of that forging forward is realizing that some people will never come back. That is the reality of CoVid. And we could dwell on that reality, making negative comments about 'those' people or making negative comments about the church itself. If you find yourself shelling out that kind of negative energy, ask yourself "Who am I serving? Am I looking out for me or for others? Am I building up or tearing down?"

If you claim that you are building up, how many times have you invited someone for worship? Once, maybe twice? Studies show that you have to invite someone seven times to an event before they typically say yes! That is part of the persistence of faith. It is caring enough to invite someone over and over and over and over and...you get it.

Proverbs 18:21 says, "Death and life are in the power of the tongue" and the tongue that matters is yours. Which part of death or life are you doing in rebuilding the body of the Presbyterian Church of Sweet Hollow?

What is in front of us is dependent on YOU! Your attitude, your energy, your words and your prayers are key to moving forward.

Pretzels were also a popular Lenten food because of their sparse list of ingredients during a time of fasting.
