

From the Pastor's Nook:

Casting a Vision Together

"Where there is no vision, the people perish." – Proverbs 29:18 (KJV)

In every season of the church's life, God calls us to look both backward with gratitude and forward with hope. Our Presbyterian tradition holds that the church is *Reformed and always reforming*, guided by the Holy Spirit into new ways of faithfulness. That is why we are beginning a process of visioning together as a congregation.

So what is "visioning," and why do we need it?

At its core, visioning is about discerning God's call for our community at this time and in this place. Just as the early church gathered in Acts 15 to prayerfully decide how to live out the Gospel among diverse peoples, so we gather to ask: What does God want to do through us in the years ahead?

Visioning is not simply strategic planning, though it may borrow some of its tools. In the business world, small companies often take time to clarify their "mission" and "values" so that their decisions align with their core identity. A vision statement helps them navigate challenges and stay focused on their purpose. For the church, our mission is already rooted in Christ: to proclaim the Gospel, love our neighbors, and embody God's kingdom here and now. Visioning helps us ask how we uniquely live that mission in this community, in this generation.

Scripture reminds us again and again of God's call to renew and reimagine. Isaiah 43:19 proclaims, "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" Paul encouraged the Philippians to "press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:14). Visioning invites us to seek out that "new thing," to press on faithfully, and to listen for the Spirit's leading.

BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS

A Practical Guide to Our Church Visioning Process

"Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established." – Proverbs 16:3

Over the coming months, our congregation will be engaging in a visioning process. This is an intentional season of prayer, listening, and planning designed to help us discern where God is calling us next. Visioning is not about imposing a new identity, but about clarifying the gifts God has already given us and aligning our ministry with the Spirit's leading.

Here are the steps we will be following together:

1. Prayer and Grounding in Scripture

We begin by remembering that this is God's church, not ours. We will gather in worship and prayer, asking the Holy Spirit to guide our conversations. Key passages such as Proverbs 29:18 ("Where there is no vision, the people perish") and Acts 2:42–47 (the life of the early church) will frame our work.

2. Looking Back with Gratitude

Before we look forward, we pause to reflect on where we have been. Like the psalmist who remembers God's faithfulness (Psalm 77), we will name the milestones, traditions, and ministries that have shaped our identity.

3. Listening to the Congregation

Visioning is a communal task. Through surveys, small groups, and listening sessions, every member will have a chance to share their hopes, dreams, and concerns. This helps us discover our shared values and passions.

4. Listening to the Community

Just as Paul became "all things to all people" (1 Corinthians 9:22), we are called to pay attention to our neighbors. We will gather input from community leaders, local organizations, and those outside our walls to learn where our gifts might meet real needs.

5. Clarifying Our Mission and Values

Many small businesses thrive by identifying their core mission and values; the same is true for the church. Together, we will articulate what is most important to us as followers of Christ in this community. These values will become the foundation for future ministry.

6. Imagining the Future

This is where we dream! With the Holy Spirit's leading, we will consider what God may be calling us to in the next three to five years. What new ministries might we try? What partnerships might we build? How can our worship, service, and fellowship deepen?

7. Drafting a Vision Statement

From our conversations, we will craft a simple, memorable statement that expresses who we are and who we hope to become. This statement will be more than words on paper—it will be a guidepost for decision-making, helping us stay focused on God's call.


8. Planning Next Steps

Finally, we will identify practical goals and steps. Just as Nehemiah rallied the people to rebuild the wall (Nehemiah 2:17–18), we will work together on achievable actions that align with our vision.

9. Living the Vision

Visioning is never a one-time project. It is an ongoing practice of prayer, evaluation, and faithfulness. As our context changes, we will keep listening for the Spirit's voice and adjusting as needed.

This visioning process is not about creating something from scratch, but about listening deeply—to God, to one another, and to our neighbors—and then aligning our life together with what we hear. With God's help, we will discover a renewed sense of purpose and energy for ministry

Digging Deeper: The Bible in Depth with the Kerygma Program

"The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever." – Isaiah 40:8

This fall, our congregation is embarking on a new adventure in learning and faith formation: **The Bible in Depth**, a Kerygma Program designed for those who want to take a deeper dive into God's Word.

What is The Bible in Depth?

Unlike a quick overview or topical study, this course takes us **through a thematic exploration** of starting with God saving the people and finishing with God's people having hope. Together, we will examine the sweep of Scripture—from creation to covenant, prophets to psalms, Gospels to letters. The goal is not simply to *read the Bible, but to understand its history, context, and meaning* and to discover how these sacred texts continue to speak into our lives today.

The Kerygma approach is interactive and community-centered. Sessions combine careful scholarship with engaging conversation. Each week we will wrestle with questions, share insights, and learn from one another as the Spirit guides us.

Why This Study?

In the Reformed tradition, we affirm that Scripture is "the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ" (Book of Confessions, 9.27). A study like *The Bible in Depth helps us move beyond surface readings into a richer, fuller understanding* of God's story and our place within it.

The apostle Paul reminds us: "All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16). This course is one way we answer that call to be trained and shaped by the living Word.

What You Can Expect

- A two-year journey through the entire Bible (with flexible pacing).
- Study guides that provide **historical background**, **theological themes**, **and discussion questions**.
- A group setting where all questions are welcome—no prior Bible study experience required.
- Opportunities to connect ancient texts with today's challenges and joys.

Who Should Join?

Anyone who hungers for a **deeper knowledge of Scripture** and a **closer walk with God**. Whether you've been reading the Bible for decades or are just beginning, you will find this study accessible, challenging, and enriching.

Getting Started

Our Bible in Depth study will begin in October and meet **every other Sunday following worship.** The resource guide for the study is \$50.

Come ready to explore, question, and grow. Together we will discover how the grand story of the Bible continues to proclaim good news for us and for the world.

Behind the Scenes: How a Worship Service Comes Together

When we gather for worship each Sunday, we experience prayers, hymns, scripture, and a message woven together in a way that helps us encounter God's presence. But have you ever wondered how a worship service is created? Worship may look seamless when we gather, but behind the scenes there is prayerful planning, creativity, and collaboration.

The process often begins with **scripture**. Many churches follow the *Revised Common Lectionary*, which provides a cycle of readings across the seasons of the church year. These readings guide the preacher in preparing the sermon and set the spiritual tone for the day. At times, services may also be shaped around themes—such as justice, healing, or thanksgiving—that speak to our community's current needs.

Once the guiding scripture or theme is chosen, the **flow of worship** begins to take shape. We consider:

- What prayers and confessions help us open our hearts to God?
- What hymns or songs best carry the theme forward?
- How can liturgy (spoken responses, creeds, or affirmations) help us voice our faith together?
- What visuals or symbolic actions (candles, banners, communion, baptisms) deepen the meaning of the moment?

Creating worship is both **art and prayer**. It blends the traditions of the church with the unique spirit of the congregation. Sometimes worship is deeply liturgical and follows familiar patterns; other times it is creative, involving drama, storytelling, or new music. Each choice invites us to experience God's Word in a fresh way.

Finally, every service is bathed in **prayer**. We pray that God's Spirit will work through the words spoken, the music sung, and the silence shared. Worship is not a performance to be watched but a sacred space we enter together—bringing our hopes, questions, and gratitude before God.

As we continue to gather week by week, remember that each service is carefully and prayerfully crafted with one purpose: to help us draw closer to God and to one another. Worship is not just something the pastor or musicians "do"—it is something we all create together as the body of Christ.



Prayer Points for Current Global Concerns

1. Peace Amid Escalating Conflicts

- **Ukraine & Israel–Gaza**: Ongoing violence and displacement continue to pain God's heart. Humanitarian conditions in Gaza are worsening, with limited access for relief workers.
- Eastern DR Congo: Renewed rebel attacks in North Kivu claim dozens of lives.
- Sudan (Darfur): Health services are retreating under attack—cholera aid is being hampered.

Prayer: Lord, bring lasting peace and protection to those in conflict zones. Comfort the suffering and guide peacemakers toward reconciliation and justice.

2. Humanitarian Crisis

• Gaza City: The destruction of homes and essential services continues, with limited aid access.

Prayer: God of mercy, spark transformation in systems that harm children. Empower communities to embrace gentleness, restoration, and protection for the youngest among us.

3. Blockages to Justice & Accountability

• **ICC Sanctions**: The International Criminal Court faces new sanctions from the U.S.— framing concerns about judicial independence. <u>Global Issues</u>

Prayer: Righteous Judge, sustain the ICC and other justice systems committed to accountability and rule of law. We stand with victims needing fair and courageous advocacy.
