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#### From the Pastor's Nook:

It's hard to argue against the statement that we live in one of the most divisive times perhaps since the Civil War, which is why I've been pondering what it means to be unified. Maybe you have too. Particularly as people who strive to follow Jesus, what does it mean to live in unity? We know that it's desired, "how very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity!" (Psalm 133) and we know that Jesus in John 17 prays for us to be one as he and God are one.

But I know that I can miss the mark on unity, as it's easier for me to be in unity with people who agree with me, who make me feel comfortable and don't push me to see other viewpoints. Jesus never says that unity is easy, and as a matter of fact, prepares his disciples proclaiming the good news of God that everyone has value, that some will reject them. Jesus isn't talking about the kind of unity that demands we compromise our values, our hearts, souls and minds to the voices and allows harm to occur to our neighbor.

Jesus is clear that unity, is liberation for all-no group of people scapegoated, marginalized and controlled for the comfort of another group. The litmus test for unity as God's people is simply this: loving for our neighbor as ourselves. Not "do I like my neighbor?" Not "do I agree with them?" Not "should they have the same access to clean air, water, healthy food, housing, thriving wages, healthcare, as me?" Our neighbor's value is not ours to decide, as God already did: with a resounding "you are my beloved."

This is unity in God's kingdom: unity of every human having bodily autonomy, agency, freedom, inclusion, care, community, no matter what. Every human: Gay humans, Trans humans, Black humans, Brown humans, immigrant humans, undocumented humans, pregnant humans, unhoused humans, unemployed humans, incarcerated humans, poor humans, women/femme humans. You see, the unity comes in our shared humanity of being created in the image of God. Each human.

Jesus was also as human as divine, a human who came to unify humans back to a divine God, to reveal that in God, we aren't divided, we can't be. But that was too scary, too radical, too controversial, too much for people with all the worldly power and authority. It still is. "Divide and conquer," the saying goes. Jesus says, "be one and live."

There can be no "us or them," Jesus says. There is only "we." We who know that being "one" isn't conformity, but living boldly different in a world that celebrates status quo, sameness, comfort, ease, and agreeability. (Cont'd on back page)

#### **FAITH FORMATION**

Gospels, Apostles, Epistles, and Saints!

In this age of nearly instant, *global communication*, it's challenging to imagine how "news" traveled anywhere in "Bible times".

As we celebrate All Saints Day, we are humbled to honor and remember those faithful **apostles** and the message in their **epistles** to Christian communities of faith, echoing across millennia, continuing to inspire us today with the *Good News*, **Gospel** message.

We thank the Latin, Greek, and Old English languages for the origins of these words.

*Epistle* comes from the Greek noun *epistole*, meaning *letter* or *message*. It was first used in the 13<sup>th</sup> century to describe the letters sent to instruct and support the early Christians. Of the 27 New Testament (NT) books of the Bible, 21 are *Epistles* written by the *Apostles*. *Apostles*, the early Christian teachers (disciples of Jesus) inspired by the *Holy Spirit* to record the story of Jesus' life and teachings and to teach others how to lead Christian lives.

**Apostle** is an Old English noun that comes to us via Latin and Greek words apostolos or apostellein meaning sent forth.

The noun **Gospel** comes from the Old English word **godspel** meaning **glad tidings/good news**.

The Middle English noun **saint** appeared in the 13<sup>th</sup> century. It comes from the Anglo-French word seinte/saint via the Latin word sanctus or sacred.

All Saint's Day has been celebrated on November 1 since the year 835. As members of the Reformed tradition, "Presbyterians give glory to God for the ordinary, holy lives of the believers in this and every age. This is an appropriate time to give thanks to members of the community of faith who have died in the past year."

Serving as a liturgist is a gift to the church. You don't have to be a bible expert, a linguist, or have a seminary degree to serve as a liturgist. A liturgist has a heart to help and lead others. Remember that Moses was called to lead and speak in front of people despite his difficulties speaking: "How then should Pharaoh heed me—who gets tongue-tied!" (Exod. 6:12). Moses has already pointed this issue out a few chapters earlier, protesting that he has "never been a man of words" and is "slow of speech and slow of tongue." Scholars believe that Moses was afflicted with the challenge of stuttering. Look how he turned out with God's help!

#### Mission Commitment Sunday – November 17

So what in the world is Mission Commitment Sunday? Mission Commitment Sunday (MCS for short), is an expansion of our stewardship commitment. Mission Commitment is all about ensuring that we lean into our mission to be the Little Church with a BIG HEART. MCS is about sharing the load of our mission through our spiritual practices.

Our spiritual practices include (but are not limited to) things like prayer, scripture reading, giving of our financial resources, fasting and dedication to service. These are the practices that keep the church vibrant, sharing the good news of the gospel with our neighbors.

MCS allows us to provide a space for the about 200 members of the Huntington Seniors group to gather each week. MCS allows us to provide a safe space for Alcoholics Anonymous to meet regularly as these individuals continue to heal and lift up one another in their struggles. MCS helps us to ensure that we have a place to collect an abundance of clothing for veterans or to provide food for the hungry.

Mission Commitment Sunday is about all of those things and MORE! MCS is the day that we COMMIT, PROMISE, PLEDGE and ENGAGE in the practice of *HOPE*. The act of giving regularly and intentionally through our spiritual practices helps us grow in faith and become more mature spiritually. It serves as a continual reminder of God's claim on our lives. It requires us to put our own needs and wants into proper perspective, to set aside our own interests for the sake of God and others. Generosity is a tool God uses to shape our hearts. It is the active engagement of HOPE.

As the leadership of the church, we are responsible for envisioning our prayer-filled HOPE requests. Our finance team is currently working on assessing the needs for 2025.

Greetings friends and family of the Presbyterian Church of Sweet Hollow,

It has been a pleasure serving the needs of our church members and the surrounding community. However, continuing our ongoing ministry efforts comes at a great expense to the church. As the leadership of the church has assessed its year end needs, we are projecting an annual budget deficit of approximately \$22,500. Most of this expense is due to increasing costs, especially insurance.

Without this money, the church's remaining reserves will be depleted, and some bills may go unpaid. That is why we are turning to you for support. Your extra financial gifts to the church will help us keep the spirit of service alive, as Christ has called us to do. It will also help us bridge the gap until the time when the sale of the back portion of the property is complete (expected mid-2025) and our reserves will be restored to a comfortable level.




# **MISSION & MORE**
