Pastoral Column

Christmas finds newborn Jesus laying in the manger. So we sing, "Gloria!" for twelve days. We bring gifts with the wise men on Epiphany, then celebrate Christ's baptism the following week. When John the Baptist stood with Jesus in the Jordan river, God's voice proclaimed that "This is my Son, the Beloved. I am well pleased with him." Praise after praise after praise! Stars and gifts and signs! Love and joy and hope! Our own hearts are likely full with love for God in these days. Rooted in all these acts and all these days, though, is God's great love for <u>us</u>. He (Jesus) came down not for himself, but that <u>we</u> might have love. He came down that we might have joy. He came down that we might have hope.

The poet R.S. Thomas used modern imagery to describe why Jesus came down. "The Coming" was quoted in a December sermon, prompting reflection and conversation with several church members. It is reprinted here for your consideration:

a small globe. Look, he said. The son looked. Far off, As through the water, he saw A scorched land of fierce Colour. The light burned There; crusted buildings Cast their shadows: a bright Serpent, A river Uncoiled itself, radiant With slime. On a bare Hill a bare tree saddened The sky. Many people Held out their thin arms To it, as though waiting For a vanished April To return to its crossed Boughs. The son watched Them. Let me go there, he said.

Stewardship - Budget

To all that have pledged and donated this year, thank you for your continued generosity! We wouldn't be the "Little Church with the Big Heart" without you and your time, talents and treasures supporting all the good work that we do!

Stewardship - our path to sustainability

Thus far we have received 28 pledges for a total of \$74,225.00. Thank you all for responding so quickly. To reach full participation of our membership we need another 25 pledges. We are well on our way to exceeding our 2019 pledge total. On another positive note, five families were able to increase their pledges this year! I continue to believe that an increase of 10% in active members, building use and donations are all that we need to turn the tide and have momentum in our favor.

Estate / Legacy Planning

Have you named the Presbyterian Church of Sweet Hollow as a beneficiary in your will? A properly executed will enables you to sustain your support of Sweet Hollow. Your bequest may be a specific amount, a percentage of your estate or a residual amount (after expenses and other bequests have been fulfilled). If you need assistance, Rich Burke has graciously offered his help with planning. We are extremely grateful for those who have done so already!

Current Financial Status - End of November

We have income of \$210,218.71 and expenses of \$199,108.86 for a YTD total of \$10,109.85 Please keep in mind that this includes a legacy gift of \$50,000.00. Thank you for your continued generosity! Our donations are up from last year, while our Building Use is down \$20,000.00 and our Fundraising is down \$2,000.00.

Per Capita

We have received \$1,485.97 towards our 2019 responsibility of \$4527.95. Per Capita continues to be an area of that creates a large shortfall for Sweet Hollow on a yearly basis, even though it is approved as a budget expense.

Project Regeneration

We are continuing to work with consultants from the Presbyterian Foundation to help us discern a path forward for Sweet Hollow. Currently we are not on a path towards long term sustainability. We may have to make a difficult decision in the near future. The Presbytery of Long Island is also committed to provide support to us as we go forward together.

Discipleship/Membership

We are grateful to all the new members that have joined us this year as they make a commitment to supporting Sweet Hollow and joining us in the unity of our church family. We are called to discipleship, to be bold and spread the good news about Jesus; engage your family and friends in discussion about the joy of membership at Sweet Hollow!

Session Notes

- .The Personnel Committee reported Barbara Zimmerman's resignation in July and Tracy Dein's resignation effective January 1, 2020. These two open positions presented an opportunity to change our staff structure as has been repeatedly suggested in congregational forums. The Session thus approved the following changes to our church secretary position:
- * The former Treasurer and Secretary positions will be combined into a joint secretary/bookkeeper position at 25 hours/week beginning January 1, 2020.
- * Payroll will be outsourced to an outside company. This is a minimal expense and recommended by Presbytery.
- * A Treasurer will be elected from within the congregation.

The above changes will give us more office hours, as well as increased expenses. Reductions must thus be made elsewhere in the 2020 budget, or congregational giving and property rentals must be increased. Having assessed our resources and discussed the state of our church for several years (through congregational forums, the Visioning Task Force, and other intentional conversations) discerning where God is leading us, the Session recommends reducing our pastoral position to part-time beginning June 1, 2020. This will bring significant cost savings which will easily cover the slight cost increase for the secretary/bookkeeper position.

The proposed pastoral position changes require our Pastoral Nominating Committee to resume their work. (Remember that they intentionally paused work in August 2018 in order to participate in the Project Regeneration and other discernment about what we could afford.) There will be opportunities for feedback and sharing at future congregational forums. Please join us in these conversations as we together practice faithful stewardship of God's gifts to Sweet Hollow.

Blender Quiche Recipe

By popular request, here's Carol Keil's recipe for the quiche she served at coffee hour on October 27.

Basic recipe fills a 10" pie plate or baking pan of equivalent volume

Preheat oven to 400 degrees

Place the following ingredients in the blender bowl:

- 4 eggs
- 2 cups milk
- 1/2 cup Bisquik baking mix
- 2 medium onions
- ½ pound cheese (a great way to use up a variety of cheeses, if we have leftover cheese after a party I store it in a zip lock bag in the freezer till I need it for this recipe.)
- ½ tsp nutmeg
- pinch of pepper

Blend on high until smooth then pour into the pie plate or baking dish. Add "extras" of your choice: sautéed mushrooms, sauteed zucchini, diced ham, crumbled cooked sausage, diced tomato, etc. I usually place the pie plate on a pizza pan prior to filling it if I am adding ingredients that might cause the pie plate to fill to the rim.

Bake approx. 30 minutes. Let rest 10-15 minutes before serving.
