From the Pastor's Nook:

STARGAZING

What came into existence was Life, and the Life was Light to live by. The Life-Light blazed out of the darkness; the darkness couldn't put it out. (Eugene Peterson, The Message, John 1:4-5)

Each of us has a precious gift (some have many!) to carry and place before God. Just like the magi, most of the time we are not certain where this will take us. God does provide sign to guide us if we have the courage to follow. Once we have been with Jesus, we are canged and it is not safe to go back on the same path. The church learns this as the magi follow the star to arrive at the manger. Throughout history, this has come to be known as Epiphany. According to tradition, twelve days after the birth of Jesu the magi arrive, offering gifts and their worship.

Just like the magi, we too have a star to follow. God has a plan for each of us (individually and collectively), a way to draw closer to God and to help us live our lives abundantly as intended. This is easier said than done. Figuring out exactly where we are to go, what our gifts are, and then finding the courage to go may take a lifetime for some people. In our impatience, we strain to see the path all at once. In reality, God often reveals only one step of the path at a time. Epiphany reminds us of the journey, a call to obedience in recognizing where God is leading and following even when we haven't

a clue as to the final destination.

STEWARDSHIP AND STUFF

There are some wonderful principles in the Old Testament that apply to present-day Christians. One of these is in Deuteronomy 8:10-18. Stated in contemporary language, it says, "When you have eaten and are full, and when your cars, houses and bank accounts multiply, don't forget where it came from: Remember the Lord your God."

In truth, all that we have comes from God. God determines what we will receive, whether it be money, gold, silver, houses, land, bank accounts, stocks, bonds, etc. It all belongs to God in the first place, and he entrusts it to us. According to David's prayer in 1 Chronicles 29, riches, honor, power, and wealth all come from God.

That's why there is no such thing as a self-made man or woman. Oh, we have to do our part. God's plan is not that we just sit around praying and reading the Bible all day long so that what we need to survive will miraculously drop into our hands. We're not just to pray for our "daily bread," but we're also to get up each day and work for it! That's why the Apostle Paul stated clearly, "Anyone unwilling to work should not eat" (2 Thes. 3:10). But in reality, the amount of money and wealth which we receive is determined by God. According to his divine will and knowledge, God entrusts to each of us the amount which he knows will be best for us.

What should be our reaction to our financial state? Some might pray, "Dear Lord, you must have made a mistake concerning me and my finances. Please give me more money." Others might try to circumvent God's design for their lives by trying to win the lottery or to obtain large sums of money through some other means. Mature Christians, however, will realize God's infinite wisdom far surpasses their limited perspective. They will accept with a thankful spirit what God has entrusted to them and seek to honor God by their living and by their giving.

The wealth we have is determined by God.

"But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth" (Deuteronomy 8:18).





THE LITURGICAL COLORS OF JANUARY ARE WHITE & GREEN

Every January begins with white as the first liturgical color of the month as we are in the midst of celebrating the birth of Christ, Epiphany and ending with the Baptism of the Lord (which falls on Sunday January 8th of this year). It is truly a special and holy time of the year. Beginning on January 9th and continuing until the tail end of February, the liturgical color changes to green. Green is the color that marks "common" time in the church but the color choice is meant to reflect growth!
