**Epiphany**: Capitalized, the proper noun Epiphany refers to the religious observance beginning on the Sunday closest to January 6 through the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. (January 7-February 11, 2024). Epiphany celebrates the good news made known through the coming of the Magi or Wise Men from the East, that the baby born in the Bethlehem stable was Jesus, Emmanuel: *God with us*. Tradition tells us a star led the travelers to the place where the Christ child could be found.

#### epiphany:

a usually sudden manifestation or perception of the essential nature or the meaning of something. an illuminating discovery, realization, or disclosure.

The season of Epiphany is a reminder that God's gift of the Good News is for everyone and can be applied to our lives in meaningful ways.

- 1. Be open to new experiences: Use this time to consider learning a new language; plan a trip to someplace you've never been. Engage all family members in the planning.
- 2. Be generous: The Wise Men brought gifts to the newborn king. What gifts or talents do you have to share that will make a positive impact on our community, and our church?
- 3. Be inclusive: Epiphany celebrates the manifestation of Jesus Christ to both the Israelites and the Gentiles. Our willingness to work with others, regardless of their background or beliefs can help us build a more accepting and diverse community. Join a community, Scouting, or sports team that will introduce you to others outside your neighborhood.

#### **WORSHIP NOTES**

January is an interesting month for worship as there are a number of interesting things that happen during the month. Below we will find a number of items that can be celebrated in worship. However, while we can observe these opportunities, we don't necessarily do so in worship.

#### TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS—DECEMBER 25TH THROUGH JANUARY 6TH

The 12 days of Christmas in Christian tradition signifies the time between the birth of Christ and the arrival of the three wise men, also known as the Magi. It starts on December 25, which is celebrated as Christmas Day, and lasts until January 6, which is the Epiphany, also referred to as Three Kings' Day.

When the 12 days began, counting the days became an important facet of each holiday season. Even in the Dark Ages, in some Eastern European churches, the 12 days of Christmas meant attending daily church services. For Christians who lived during this extremely difficult age, the 12 days were a time of rededication and renewal. It was also a period when children were given small, simple, and usually symbolic gifts of faith. Thus, the twelve days were considered a holy period in both coded poems and public worship.

#### **EPIPHANY— JANAURY 6TH**

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During the first week of January (6th) this year, we have the day of Epiphany where Jesus is first recognized by the secular world. When the magi appear before Jesus, Mary and Joseph, we find them worshipping the newborn king and celebrating by the giving of the gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. In worship, we recognize and remember this selfless act of giving every time we place our gifts, tithes and offerings in the offering basket (or give online).

#### BAPTISM OF THE LORD - SUNDAY JANUARY 7TH

This is one of my favorite Sundays during the church calendar. There is a great deal of good music available to celebrate and there are some very unique worship experiences that can happen as we remember our own baptisms. This year we will enter into a communal and spiritual worship experience for this special Sunday.

#### **CHRISTMAS EVE WORSHIP**

For the second consecutive year, we had two worship services on Christmas Eve; a family service and our traditional lessons and carols service. Since Christmas Eve was on a Sunday this year, our first worship service, the family service, was at 10 AM. The candlelight lessons and carols service was held at 9 PM.

In the lessons and carols service the story f Jesus' birth is told through the connective tissue of scripture readings and hymns sung throughout the service. The service crescendos with the sharing of candlelight and the singing of Holy Night.

During the family service in the morning, the theme of Happy Birthday Jesus was present throughout worship. Joan Sommermeyer led a fun game of Jesus Bingo, utilizing some of the symbolism of Christmas (manger, star, sheep) and sharing the significance of these items in the telling of Jesus' birth. There was also a rousing rendition of Unwrapping the gift of Christmas which was a musical game of hot potato as children passed around a gift wrapped in multiple layers of paper until the music stopped and a layer of wrapping paper was torn off. As the last layer was torn off and the box opened, the children discovered the gift of Christmas, Baby Jesus, and Jessalyn got to place Baby Jesus in the manger (Wyatt was also enamored with Baby Jesus)! Pastor Wade shared the story Jesus' birth in a fun and interactive story with the kids acting like shepherds sleeping and yawning and acting scared. Then Kaleb, who was typecast as an angel, talked to the shepherds. The angel told the shepherds hat the savior was born and the shepherds went out and told everyone about how the savior was born!!!!

Of course, you can't have a Happy Birthday Jesus worship with cake! At the conclusion of worship, we feasted on birthday cake and cupcakes!!!!!

# **January Stewards**

January is traditionally the time for New Year's resolutions. It is a time for new beginnings. It's a ideal time for the Christian disciple to take stock, reassess and recommit to a life lived for and in Jesus Christ. Here are a few suggestions for the important areas of our faith life:

**Stewardship of the Church Family**: Offer your service to serve the church through a ministry team or worship leadership in the New Year. Enrich your church and your church experience by becoming involved.

**Stewardship of Money:** Take charge of your budget and your checkbook. Reprioritize your financial goals to ensure that the Lord is coming first in the expenditure of your wealth. Plan your spending and don't spend reactively or impulsively.

**Stewardship of Work:** Do your best at your chosen profession. Be honest and faithful. Resolve to find a class or other forum that will strengthen your knowledge and expertise. Bring a prayerful attitude to your job.

**Stewardship of Mind:** Resolve to read something regularly that enhances your faith life. Resolve to learn more about your faith and learn more about the missions that are important to your church family and to fellow Presbyterians.

**Stewardship of Neighbor:** Be aware of those around you, whether it be your co-workers, fellow Jesu followers, neighbors, restaurant workers or store employees. Everyone needs a smile and Christian kindness.

**Stewardship of the Poor:** Resolve to give support and aid to the poor in some specific way this year. Bring them into your prayer life as well.

**Stewardship of the Outcasts:** Choose a group of people who are on the margins of society, the sick, the cognitively challenged, members of the LGBTQ+ community, the underprivileged and be a neighbor to them. We all need good neighbors.


