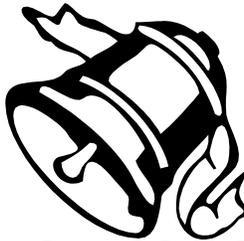

Pastoral Column

Pastor Meg Flannagan

The metro NYC area receives many global refugees each year. Individuals and families, adults and children arrive from all over the world with few personal belongings. They are often taken directly from the airport to an empty apartment. But on what will they sleep? With what will they cook? What should a child take to school? The International Rescue Committee (“IRC,” responsible for the resettlement of refugees) has limited means to support each family situation.

Through the guidance of the IRC, the Presbyterian Churches of Baldwin, Garden City, and Sweet Hollow have previously partnered to meet the needs of several families. Our congregations collected cash, gift cards, and new or gently used goods (furniture, clothing, linens, etc.). Although our efforts were appreciated, the need was much bigger than our resources could stretch. A grant was thus submitted to the Presbytery of Long Island for financial assistance with this outreach. Last month, \$5,000 was awarded to Sweet Hollow! The grant money will be evenly dispersed amongst refugee individuals and families, supplementing our donations. The money may be used to purchase additional supplies or be given directly to families in gift cards. Other congregations will share in the supply drives. We hope to connect refugees with existing church ministries: clothing and furniture thrift stores, driving ministries, and healthcare initiatives. Old First (Huntington) and Setauket Presbyterian Churches have already committed to help with this significant outreach.

This is an exciting opportunity for Sweet Hollow to serve both locally and globally at the same time. It invites us to practice multiple biblical commandments; we will be caring for the widowed and orphaned, loving our neighbors, becoming peacemakers, bearing fruits of the Spirit, and more.

Please pray for refugees arriving in our neighborhood, and that we may be kind and gracious friends to all those in need.

Stewardship - Our Path to Sustainability

We'll begin our 2020 campaign in August. Please let me know if you would be interested in giving your Faith Testimony to the congregation this fall. It's a great way to let others know the story of you and help them gain perspective in their own Faith Journey. Did you know that Stewardship includes caring for the environment? Let's do all we can to improve it on a daily basis. Everyone can compost table scraps, mulch lawn clippings instead of bagging, refrain from using mylar balloons, and properly dispose of unwanted medication.

Estate / Legacy Planning

Have you named the Presbyterian Church of Sweet Hollow as a beneficiary in your will? A properly executed will enables you to sustain your support of Sweet Hollow. Your bequest may be a specific amount, a percentage of your estate or a residual amount (after expenses and other bequests have been fulfilled). If you need assistance, Rich Burke has graciously offered his help with planning. We are extremely grateful for those who have done so already!

Current Financial Status - End of May

We have income of \$89,250.79 and expenses of \$90,447.44 for a YTD total of (negative) \$1,196.65. Thank you for your continued generosity! The summer is generally a slow time for donations so please keep your pledges up to date.

Per Capita

We have received \$1,485.97 towards our responsibility of \$4,527.95. Per Capita continues to be an area that creates a large shortfall for Sweet Hollow on a yearly basis, even though it is approved as a budget expense and approved as a budget item. We derive a myriad of free services as a result of our association with the larger Presbyterian organizations. Please let me know if you have questions about Per Capita. We are all responsible for our fair share.

Facility Improvements

Work is nearly finished replacing heating and A/C in the Little House (Parlor, Office, Nursery, Youth Group Room). This will eliminate the risk of our over 50-year-old boiler system failing us next winter. It will also give us improved efficiency, which is good for our checkbook and good for our environment. We have also had the floor in the Fellowship Hall professionally cleaned and it looks fantastic.

Please keep in mind when planning your family events that a benefit of Sweet Hollow membership is the ability to utilize PCSH space at a deep discount.

Discipleship/Membership

We are in need of a dedicated individual to serve as chair of our Outreach Committee. We have many opportunities to engage the hundreds of people using our facilities on a weekly basis. We are grateful to our new members and their families as they commit to joining with us on their Faith Journey! The Personnel Committee reported the resignation of church secretary Barbara Zimmerman. Session received her resignation with gratitude for over 10 years of service, and appointed Maureen Sansone interim church secretary. Maureen is a longtime member of Sweet Hollow. She will serve from July 3 - December 31, providing knowledge and continuity during Pastor Meg's maternity leave. The Personnel Committee will reevaluate the position over the fall, invite congregational input, and publicly post the opening.

CEB Hall Floor

Earlier this spring the Session approved the cleaning and sealing of our CEB Hall floor. Bill Von Brook coordinated this work completed last month. Because it had been years since they were last done, it required significant time and expense. Going forward, we plan to clean and reseal the floors twice a year for a nominal fee. 
We have decided to have our next meeting on Thursday, September 19.
