From the Pastor's Nook:

EASTER AFTERMATH

It's the month after Easter. Jesus is risen. All of the palms and lilies are out of the Sanctuary. We successfully navigated holy week services as our church welcomed the most number of worshippers since I arrived in June of 2021. And we had a delightful time of worship during Holy Humor Sunday followed by Happy Hour hosted by Melissa D'Angelo and Jane Beller.

And so, after all of this busyness, I am taking a vacation (or two) this month. I have to admit to being tired and maybe I share that with some of the disciples prior to Christ's incarceration, crucifixion and resurrection.

The way Matthew and Mark tell it, the disciples have simply fallen asleep at the wheel. The two first gospels don't give us a reason why they were snoozing. But in Luke 22 it says they were sleeping "because of grief."

The more I think f it, grief makes a lot of sense. The disciples were absolutely exhausted because they had spent the last several weeks listening to Jesus hint at something horrible and inexplicable. They knew something heartbreaking was happening, or about to happen. They couldn't begin to truly understand that what happened at Golgotha would not be the end. But even if they did, it doesn't take away from the grief they would know from experiencing it.

I am a joyful proclaimer of Christ's resurrection, and celebrate that death will never have the last word. But sometimes it's good to remember that even those closest to Jesus were overcome by the sorrows of their day, and needed to rest their minds and bodies to heal from it. With the brokenness of the world unfolding around us like it does, sometimes, even in Eastertide, we need to do that too.

Did you know that the Fourth Sunday of Easter, each year, is always *Good Shepherd Sunday?*We thank the *Devotions* section of the April 30, 2023 issue of *Taking Faith Home** for inspiring the our Faith Formation comments this month and encourage you to read the full message found there.

This year the Fourth Sunday of Easter fell on Sunday April 30. Lectionary readings for that day included Acts 2:42-47, Psalm 23, 1 Peter 2:19-25 and John 10:1-10. (Year A of the 3-year (A,B,C lectionary cycle) Readings for Year B include Acts 4, Psalm 23, 1John 16-24 and John 10:11-18. Readings for Year C: Acts 9:36-43, Psalm 23, Revelation 7:9-17 and John 10:22-30.

You've probably noticed that Psalm 23 is included in the readings each year. You might imagine Psalm 23 as the "hub message" with the other scriptures serving as "spokes" radiating outward into the community of Believers as we are simultaneously bound together in Christ's name. Open your Bible; read each of these selections; note how the image of Christ as our Shepherd gradually draws us forth to serve each other as we become part of the body of Christ!

New Fundraising Program ALERT = RAISE RIGHT

When the Amazon Smile program concluded on February 20, we were able to find another program that would benefit the church. This program is all about purchasing gift cards. They can be either electronically sent cards or physical cards. Over 500 brands participate in this program. It will be a great idea for gift giving and everyday personal use. I personally have done a test run and had a physical card sent to me – an electronic card sent to a friend and an electronic card sent to myself! Hopefully the directions on "how to" will be helpful to family and friends wishing to help the church through their purchasing.

They run specials called Raise Days and there will be one on March 2 – 3. So get onboard and venture into a new purchasing style for gift cards. Thank you for your support. HOW DOES RAISE RIGHT AND BUYING GIFT CARDS HELP OUR CHURCH?

Great question!!!! Raise right is a program committed to utilizing fit cards as a form of fundraising.

Instead of selling goods or planning events, gift card (aka scrip) fundraising participants can earn \$\$\$\$ for the church simply by purchasing gift cards through the church's Raise Right affiliate program.

In buying gift cards through this program and their online or mobile phone applications, the church receives a percentage of each gift card purchased.

For instance, let's say you were planning your grocery shopping for Stop & Shop or ShopRite. You could purchase a \$100 gift card for either of these stores and the church would receive \$4 just by you purchasing a gift card through the Raise Right program!

Great question!!!! Raise right is a program committed to utilizing gift cards as a form of fundraising.

Instead of selling goods or planning events, gift card (aka scrip) fundraising participants can earn \$\$\$\$ for the church simply by purchasing gift cards through the church's Raise Right affiliate program.

In buying gift cards through this program and their online or mobile phone applications, the church receives a percentage of each gift card purchased.

For instance, let's say you were planning your grocery shopping for Stop & Shop or ShopRite. You could purchase a \$100 gift card for either of these stores and the church would receive \$4 just by you purchasing a gift card through the Raise Right program! And once you have your electronic gift card on your phone (which happens almost instantaneously), you are ready to shop!

But this isn't just about gift cards for groceries. There are over 500 national retailers that participate in this program. Fixing something up at home and need something from Home Depot or Lowe's? Get a gift card! Happy about a night out at the movies or a restaurant? There are gift cards a plenty for those! Clothing stores? Yep, got you covered! Fast Food? Most of the big names are available! How about Best Buy for your appliances and electronics? Definitely! Even travel companies like American Airlines, Delta and Carnival Cruise Lines participate in the Raise Right program!

And naturally, these gift cards make great gifts! They are great gifts for birthdays, holidays, anniversaries or just because 'I appreciate you.' Those big retailers like Target, Amazon, Walmart...everyone of them participate in the Raise Right program!

My encouragement to you is to not let the opportunity to pass you by. The church can generate far MORE income than the Amazon Smile program generated if you take advantage of the Raise Right program! Be sure to check with Jane Beller or Pastor Wade about questions with the program! There will be a great deal of information coming your way!

HOW DO I SIGN UP for RAISE RIGHT?

RaiseRight Fundraising for PCSH 2023

THE FIRST STEP

Get involved and support the church

Create an account at https://www.raiseright.com onto your home computer
Or download the app on your smartphone or tablet!

You will need enrollment code 5J9Y6TFH7J9C

Use your email and then create a password

Who are you fundraising for = type Presbyterian Church of Sweet Hollow (later this will appear near your name on the right top side of the screen) hit next

Sign in with your email and password (asked for 2x) hit next

Give a recovery (cell) phone number and it will send you a code to verify the account Select two security questions

Enrollment complete - it should indicate Jane Beller as coordinator

THE SECOND STEP

Browse through the *list of brands* (https://www.raiseright.com/brands)

Suggestion to get acquainted with the brands...select your favorites (click on the heart icon near your brand and it will turn red and then be placed in your favorites, hit it again and heart clears red) this makes it easier to order.

There are over 550 brands to choose from—you will be amazed.

Under the name of each brand, it will indicate what *percentage* will be given to the church based on your purchase

Select how you *want to look at* the brands on the right side – highest earnings, most popular, name a-z or name z to a

Sometimes they run bonus increases on certain brands that only last for 3 days and then goes back to the previous percentage. --- they are highlighted in potentially pink and on the bottom of it would say BONUS (view on bonus only group). Also there are FLASH Bonus brands

OR You can shop by categories or card type or denomination or view on bonus only (slide the bar near the words) group when you go explore. You will have to *click on the load more items* at times to see more.

There is a search bar up top that you can spell the brand you are looking for.

THE THIRD STEP......SHOP!!!!!!!

A comprehensive email will be sent out to you with full instructions for sign up. Also, please know that Jane is available to help walk you through your initial set up and purchases if needed. An informational meeting will be held at the church following worship on April 23rd during fellowship time for those with questions or need assistance signing up!
