Pastoral Column

The disciples shouted earnest Hosannas on Palm Sunday, but they quickly abandoned Jesus in the following days. We, too, waved palms, shouted “Hosanna!” and celebrated Christ’s rising on Easter Sunday. But what shall we do now?

As warmer weather and summer activities tempt folks away from church, plan ways to nurture your faith throughout the coming weeks. Spend time in prayer when early sunlight wakes you. Talk to a friend about a faith question or prayer while you are riding in the car together. Help a neighbor with outdoor chores. Add a spiritual book to your reading list. Revisit old favorites by C.S. Lewis, Kathleen Norris, and Henri Nouwen, or, try a contemporary classic. I highly recommend these titles (available in our Public Library) or other books by these authors:

Barbara Brown Taylor – Learning to Walk in the Dark. God is as present in the dark as in the light. This is an exploration of spirituality when (or because) life is not always bright and sunny.

Gregory Boyle – Tattoos on the Heart: The power of Boundless Compassion. Father Boyle’s collection of true and profound stories about his ministry to inner-city L.A. gangs. Each chapter is brief, easy to read, and resounds with simple truths.

Tod Bolsinger – Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory. About today’s changing church demographics, this book is on every pastor’s and Presbytery COM’s list.

Robin DiAngelo – White Fragility: Why It’s So Hard for White People to Talk about Racism. Although not explicitly spiritual, this is a must-have reflection and conversation for Christians. It is on every pastor’s book list.

Richard Rohr – Falling Upward: A Spirituality for the Two Halves of Life. This is a beautiful and thought-provoking book for everyone as we age.

Stay connected to Jesus wherever life takes you. Walk with Jesus beyond the Easter glory. Then tell us how Christ’s new resurrected life is made manifest in your own life.

WANTED: New Clerk of Session

Our current clerk, Lynn Burke, will complete her service this year. Another volunteer is needed to train and transition now so that they can confidently begin work next February. A Clerk of Session must be an Elder (currently serving or past) available to attend all Session and congregational meetings. A great Clerk is organized and competent in basic computer programming: word processing, email, etc. According to the *Book of Order* (the Presbyterian constitution) the Clerk is the secretary for both the Session and congregation; the Clerk records transactions, maintains attendance and the rolls, preserves the records, and serves as the official contact for other councils of the church (Presbytery, other congregations’ committees, etc.).

Stewardship—Budget

To all that have pledged and donated this year, thank you for your continued generosity! We wouldn't be the "Little Church with the Big Heart" without you and your time, talents and treasures supporting all the good work that we do!

Stewardship

When we honor the Lord with all that we have, we have faith that he will provide all that we truly need. The total of our campaign is 41 pledges for a total of \$89,665. Praise the Lord! The end of the first quarter of the year is a good time to assess our finances. This year our overall donations are \$23,058.60. Some of our members are behind in their donations. If you have not yet done so, please bring your pledged donations up to date as soon as possible.

Estate / Legacy Planning

A key to creating a sustainable church is to consider Sweet Hollow in your estate / legacy planning. Rich Burke has graciously offered his assistance with planning. We are extremely grateful for those who have done so already! We received a substantial gift recently and our committee is discerning the appropriate use for this gift to sustain Sweet Hollow.

Current Financial Status - End of March

We have income of \$45,891.83 and expenses of \$51,651.53 for a YTD total of (negative) \$5,759.70. Our largest expenses are quarterly and we had to make a withdrawal of \$5,000 from savings. We have received \$1,371.82 towards our *Per Capita* responsibility. Our affiliation with the Presbytery helped us recently when the Session decided not to renew our contract with the Board of Elections. The amount they were willing to pay for the use of our facilities was insufficient for the amount of wear and tear incurred by the events. They threatened to force us to hold elections and we referred the matter to the Presbytery. They intervened on our behalf, without cost.

Facility Improvements

Session has decided to move forward with replacing heating and A/C in the Little House (Parlor, Office, Nursery, Youth Group Room). This will eliminate the risk of our over 50-year-old boiler system failing us next winter. We will also be expanding our WiFi connectivity to the CEB and installing a video doorbell system to increase security for our Daycare friends.

Facility news

Our Gathering of Light friends will now be staying with us through May. Please keep in mind when planning your family events that one of the benefits of membership is the ability to utilize PCSH space at a deep discount.

Discipleship/Membership

We are grateful to our new members and their families as they commit to joining with us on their Faith Journey! We delighted in welcoming new visitors, dear friends and many children on Palm Sunday; it was a moment of pure joy! We are called to discipleship, to be bold and spread the good news about Jesus; engage your family and friends in discussion about the joy of membership at Sweet Hollow!

From the *Christian Century*:

The largest 10% of American congregations contain half of all those who attend worship; that is, half of worshippers go to the top 10% of churches (by attendance). The other half of worshippers attend the remaining 90% of churches.

The average American congregation has 70 regular participants (adults and children) with an average budget of \$85,000. (Note that Sweet Hollow has maintained a budget of approximately \$200,000 for many years.) – “Century Marks” in March 27, 2019 *Christian Century*.

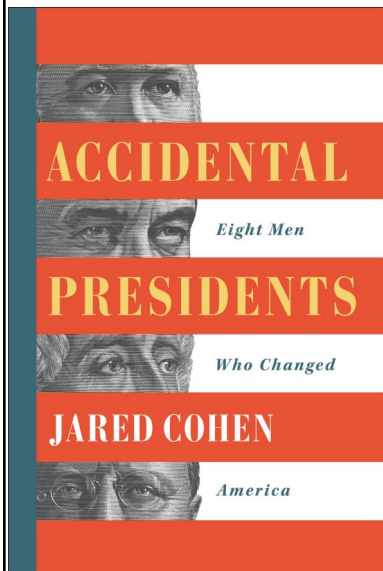
We have decided to have our next meeting on September 19.
