Two years ago I went to a church in Rockaway Park to help prepare Thanksgiving dinner for homeless and hungry people. Although my son had volunteered to carve turkeys for a bunch of years prior, this was my first time. If there was ever medicine for the complaints about the selfishness and bigotry in the world, this was it.

First of all I couldn't wrap my brain around how many young people were present – and most were volunteers from other years. I was sent to a table to join two college students who were opening cans of peaches and distributing them to dessert dishes. Other enthusiastic young people were setting the tables, peeling and cooking vegetables, unloading donated food from cars, lining up drinks and mashing potatoes. I mention the young people – but the hall and church were also filled with middle age people, seniors and some children. My ten-year-old granddaughter went with her father last year and helped with seeing that each place setting had utensils.

Volunteers were from all ethnicities, abilities and religions. In such a violent, nasty world, I am sure that looking over this humungous outreach brought warmth to God's heart. It sure did to mine.

So – as we snuggle into warm clothes and bedding, I would hope that we all have hearts of thankfulness and take the time to enjoy the foliage, remember to salute our veterans and saints, and share some of our blessings and bounty with those who are in need. Jesus reminds us in Matthew 25 that when we do good deeds to others, we are doing it to Him.

To all that have pledged and donated this year, thank you for your continued generosity! We wouldn't be the "Little Church with the Big Heart" without you and your time, talents and treasures supporting all the good work that we do!

Stewardship - our path to sustainability

We'll begin our 2020 campaign by meeting to focus on Stewardship November 3 after coffee hour. We will try to finish by noon. Please let me know if you would like to join the committee. I continue to believe that an increase of 10% in active members, building use and donations are all that we need to turn the tide and have momentum in our favor.

Estate / Legacy Planning

Have you named the Presbyterian Church of Sweet Hollow as a beneficiary in your will? A properly executed will enables you to sustain your support of Sweet Hollow. Your bequest may be a specific amount, a percentage of your estate or a residual amount (after expenses and other bequests have been fulfilled). If you need assistance, Rich Burke has graciously offered his help with planning. We are extremely grateful for those who have done so already!

Current Financial Status - End of September

We have income of \$183,166.28 and expenses of \$165,645.79 for a YTD total of \$17,520.49 Please keep in mind that this includes a legacy gift of \$50,000.00. Thank you for your continued generosity! Our donations are up from last year, while our Building Use is down \$20,000.00 and our Fundraising is down \$4,000.00.

Per Capita

We have received \$1,485.97 towards our 2019 responsibility of \$4527.95. Per Capita continues to be an area of that creates a large shortfall for Sweet Hollow on a yearly basis, even though it is approved as a budget expense and approved as a budget item.

Project Regeneration

We are continuing to work with consultants from the Presbyterian Foundation to help us discern a path forward for Sweet Hollow. Currently we are not on a path to continue the long term sustainability of Sweet Hollow. While we are grateful for the many good things have happened for Sweet Hollow over the past couple of years, our membership has continued to decline. We may have to make a difficult decision in the near future. A congregational forum will be scheduled in to discuss options. The time to make a difficult decision is drawing nearer.
