Sunday, September 8, is our annual Homecoming worship service and picnic (AND the first fall Sunday School lesson). Please join us, share summer adventure stories, and reinvest in Sweet Hollow's mission and ministry.

Among the changes at Sweet Hollow this fall is the resignation of our former church secretary, Barbara Zimmerman. The Personnel Committee and Session agreed that this is a good opportunity to reevaluate the secretary's job description and skills required. Some time is needed to consult both church officers and the larger church membership; thus, an intentional interim period is in effect through December 31, 2019. We hope to post a public job description in mid-late fall, then interview candidates. We hope to approve a final candidate to begin work in January 2020.

In the interim, the Session is delighted to have Maureen Sansone as church secretary. Maureen is a longtime church member, familiar with our Sweet Hollow family and our regular church activities. She brings welcome love for and knowledge of our church. This is especially important while Pastor Meg is out of the office this fall. Maureen maintains our 9am-noon office hours, checking church email, answering phones, and overseeing the use of church property (membership, tenants, and maintenance). Please stop and say, "thank you!" for all that she is doing for us!

While Pastor Meg is out of the office on maternity leave, Rev. Joan Finck returns to Sweet Hollow as our supply pastor. She is ordained in the United Church of Christ with years of experience in the Episcopal Church. Most recently, Pastor Joan has been serving the Glen Cove Presbyterian Church during their pastoral interim period. She also happens to be a licensed CPA. Pastor Joan knows our congregation from previously leading our worship services and serving as supply for Pastor Meg's maternity leave in 2016. Welcome back, Joan! We are grateful for your time and talents invested at Sweet Hollow.

Last fall began an exciting season of growth and renewal for Sweet Hollow. Let's continue moving in that same direction. It is critical that each member and family invest in our congregation, attending weekly worship services, helping with committee work, and serving the larger community. See you in church!

Estate / Legacy Planning

Current Financial Status - End of July

We have income of \$165,588.21 and expenses of \$142,486.58 for a YTD total of \$23,101.63. Please keep in mind that this includes a legacy gift of \$50,000. Thank you for your continued generosity!

<u>Per Capita</u>

We have received \$1,485.97 towards our responsibility of \$4527.95. Per Capita continues to be an area of that creates a large shortfall for Sweet Hollow on a yearly basis, even though it is approved as a budget expense and approved as a budget item.

Facility Improvements

Work is in progress painting the Fellowship Hall. The congregation voted on the color scheme over the summer.

We're sad to report that our daycare tenant "Jessy Bee's Busy Bee Child Care" has closed up shop as of the end of August as her enrollment declined dramatically. We hope she will return one day.

Project Regeneration

Over the past several months we've worked with consultants from the Presbyterian Foundation to help us discern a path forward for Sweet Hollow. While we will continue to work with the consultants, the initial analysis is not good. Currently we are not on a path to continue the long term sustainability of Sweet Hollow. While we are grateful for the many good things have happened for Sweet Hollow over the past couple of years, our membership has continued to decline.
