### From the Pastor's Nook:

Pastor's Nook - On Being Grateful and Giving Thanks

As July rolls around and we prepare to celebrate Independence Day—with fireworks, barbecues, and parades—we're invited to remember our nation's founding ideals: liberty, justice, and equality. These values resonate deeply with many of us, and they echo some of the values we find in our Christian faith. And yet, as followers of Jesus, we are called to go even deeper.

Jesus reminds us in Matthew 6:33, "But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." The kingdom of God is not confined by national borders or defined by political parties. It is a realm of radical love, neighborly compassion, and justice for the marginalized. This means that while we may wave flags and sing anthems on the Fourth of July, our first and ultimate loyalty is to the gospel.

In our current moment, we see how essential this distinction is. As debates rage over immigration policy, voting rights, reproductive freedom, and racial justice, we must ask ourselves: are we being guided more by patriotic sentiment or by the teachings of Jesus?

When the Prophet Micah posed the question, "What does the Lord require of you?" (Micah 6:8), the answer was not "Wave your flag" or "Pledge allegiance." The answer was: "to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God."

#### **PROPERTY SALE UPDATE**


Our work is complete related to the property sale.

The county will then complete their process in navigating the completion of the property acquisition. We are thankful to have Jim Reiser as our attorney helping us to navigate this complex process.


#### WHAT'S NEXT

## Brick by Brick: Creating a Walkway of Dedication



Build your legacy by purchasing a commemorative 4" x 8" laser engraved brick that will be permanently placed as a border on both sides of a new sidewalk in front of the church's breezeway. Bricks can honor family members, friends, pets-whatever you can imagine. We are partnering with Fundraising Brick, a not-for-profit company with an extensive portfolio of fundraising marketing support, as well as durable laser engraved brick. The proceeds from this fundraiser will be used for the cost of the replacement of the sidewalk, and the installation of the laser engraved brick.

You can have up to 3 lines of text, each line has 20 spaces for text, punctuation and blank spaces, all in CAPITAL letters, the type will be lucida sans: This article is written in that type face. You also have over 25 artwork choices approximately 1 ½" in height engraved on upper left side of text.

Additionally, you can purchase to keep at your home or others.

#### There is only enough space available for 150 bricks.

Printed order flyers will be soon available as well as electronic ordering. Frank Sansone will be leading the campaign and will be able to assist you. This is a transformative opportunity to replace what is worn into a lasting Walkway of Dedication.

Food Drive

The "climate" surrounding 2025 shows us there is more food insecurity than ever. The need is increasing exponentially. Many of our Church Members and friends have contributed a lot over the years. 
Long Island Business Newsletter reported the following: THE BLUEPRINT:

- Food insecurity affects over 313,000 Long Islanders in 2025
- Long Island Cares reports a 30% rise in pantry visits in 18 months
- Federal food aid cuts and <u>inflation</u> worsen local <u>hunger crisis</u>
- <u>Island Harvest</u> aims to distribute 20 million pounds of food in 2025

Headlines such as: Long Island food banks struggle amid USDA program cuts—Long Island's two largest food banks, Long Island Cares and Island Harvest, are facing significant setbacks as the U.S. Department of Agriculture cuts food assistance programs and freezes funding, leaving thousands of food-insecure residents at risk are beyond scary.

On a happier note, over the years many of our Food Drives were successful. These drives included: Sharing Bags for Healthy Snacks for school children at Tri-CYA; Souper Bowl of Caring to benefit Huntington Community Food Council; and Thanksgiving Food Boxes for Helping Hand Rescue Mission.

As the church, our calling is to speak with clarity and compassion in times of national dissonance. When Supreme Court decisions affect the lives of LGBTQ+ individuals, women, or communities of color, we must remember that our liberation is bound together. Galatians 5:13 says, "You were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another."

So let us celebrate the good in our country—the courage of whistleblowers, the perseverance of organizers, the protection offered by first responders and civil servants. But let us never confuse the kingdom of God with any human-made empire. Jesus' vision transcends nationalism and demands that we live not just as good citizens, but as faithful disciples.

This July, enjoy your celebration. Thank God for the freedoms we do have. But then go deeper. Ask: What does freedom mean in the gospel? Who is still not free? And how can we live in a way that helps bring God's kingdom a little closer—on earth, as it is in heaven?
