Hello Winter

4 Ways to Protect Your Home When Temperatures Fall

1. Insulate water pipes to prevent freezing

- Release water from exterior pipes and shut the water off to them. Store hoses in a warm place to prevent cracking.
- Add insulation to water pipes in the basement and exterior to prevent freezing.
- If pipes do freeze, use a hair dryer to thaw them out. Never use a torch or flame for this purpose.
- 2. Re-caulk windows and doors to prevent drafts
 - Exterior silicone around door frames and using a caulk gun on the interior frames can save money on heating bills. Weatherstripping is another option. Kits for windows and doors can be found at your local hardware store.
- 3. Reverse ceiling fans to push heat down
 - In winter, the ceiling fan direction should be clockwise to create and updraft and circulate warm air around the room.
- 4. Trees and branches can be dangerous if they come down unexpectedly
 - Dead trees or branches are more susceptible to falling in the winter due to snow and ice.
 - If you are unsure if your trees present a safety concern, contact a local tree service to help make the determination.

The REALTORS® Association of York Adams Counties (RAYAC) housing statistics as of November 2022:

During the first eleven months of 2022, 6,050 homes were sold in York County, a 10% decrease from this time last year.

The median home sale price for all of York County is \$245,000, an 9% increase from this time in 2021.

Southeastern York County median sales price in between January 1 to November 30, 2022, is \$315,000 up 16% from this time last year.

Aeration – Early to mid-spring or late summer to early fall

This service is provided by Extend Your Day, LLC – Call or text Cory for a free estimate

Aeration is the process of creating holes in a lawn to alleviate soil compaction reduce thatch, while allowing a better flow of oxygen, water, and nutrients to roots. It allows the grass roots to dig deep into the soil which allows for strong and resilient growth.

Seeding – Late summer to early fall is best for establishing a new lawn from seed

In general, new lawns are more successful when there is less weed competition and new grass will have 2 seasons of cool weather to establish before encountering the stress of summer heat.

Overseeding – Late winter, spring, or early fall

This service is provided by Extend Your Day, LLC – Call or text Cory for a free estimate

Aeration prior to overseeding in spring or early fall provides seed the soil contact and space needed to germinate and develop successfully

Fertilization – Mid to late spring and/or late summer to early fall

Annual applications of nitrogen fertilizers can help maintain good quality lawns and, in some cases, improve lawns that need a quality boost.

Sodding – Just about any time of year, but try to avoid the hottest, driest parts of summer

Sod can be placed any time of year when temperatures are cooler, and rainfall or watering opportunities are more plentiful.

Liming – Fall or early winter

Soil PH should generally fall between 6.0 and 7.0 in our area. If soil is too acidic, apply lime based on a soil test recommendation. You can obtain a test kit online from Penn State: <u>http://agsci.psu.edu/aasl/soil-testing/soil-fertility-testing</u> The cost for the sample kit is about \$9.00 and, once submitted and analyzed, recommendations for liming and fertilization will be sent to you.

Weed Control – Between March 15 and April 15

The best weed control is a dense, properly managed lawn. The lawn care suggestions above will help achieve that goal. Even so, sometimes weeds can still emerge. When this happens, the use of preemergent herbicides can control annual weeds such as crabgrass if they're applied prior to weed seed germination near the dates listed.

Winter Facts and Travel Preparedness

- The Winter season begins on Wednesday, December 21, 2022, until the first day of Spring on Monday, March 20, 2023
- According to PennDOT's website, PennDOT maintains about 40,000 miles of roads and 25,400 bridges across the state.
 - 2,199 PennDOT trucks, plows and salt spreaders or operated by roughly 4,700 on- the-road workers
 - o PennDOT rents about 452 trucks and hires temporary workers to help with snow removal
 - Over the past five winters, the department has used an average of 801,453 tons of salt
 - o PennDOT spreads a mixture of salt and small stones call anti-skid to provide traction
 - In rural areas, the mix of anti-skid and salt is different because salt depends on a certain amount of traffic to be effective
 - Anti-icing is another way PennDOT treats roadways. The roads are treated with saltwater, also referred to as brine, prior to freezing precipitation falling. The water part of the brine evaporates leaving the salt which helps prevent ice from forming a strong bond with the road surface
 - PennDOT has 65 facilities across the state capable of making brine. In the 2021-2022 season, 12.6 million gallons of brine were used on the roadways
- According to The Old Farmer's Almanac, <u>2022-2023 Winter Weather Forecast | The Old Farmer's Almanac</u> winter in PA, winter will be colder than normal. Precipitation will be near-normal, and snowfall is predicted to be above normal. It is going to be coldest in early December, and late January.
- Ensure you're prepared for winter travel
 - o Make sure your gas tank is full in case of traffic backups
 - Put together an emergency kit that includes enough water, meal bars and other snacks to sustain you and your passengers for at least 24 hours
 - o Have enough warm blankets for everyone in the car
 - o Everyone should have warm socks, boots, gloves, hats, scarves and clothes for layering
 - o Check weather forecasts for your travel route
 - Cold weather and older car batteries can leave you in stranded. Check your battery to see when it was installed and how long it is guaranteed.
 - If in doubt, I've had great experiences at Batteries Plus Bulbs, 96 Sofia Drive, Suite 103 in Shrewsbury. 717-996-4100. They check your battery for free and install the new one if it's needed (and purchased there) at no extra charge.
