BIG ROCK PLOWING MATCH ASSOCIATION: BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE


It all began in 1894. Today the Big Rock Plowing Match is one of the longest running annual events and the only one of its kind that remains active in Illinois. For 124 years, the Association has showcased our agricultural heritage by sponsoring the Big Rock Plowing Match. The years have been good, filled with changes and improvements. Since 1950, buildings have been constructed, Kenny Field was created, the Plowing Match expanded and Plowman's Park hosts many community and family events, all under the majestic oaks.

The Big Rock Plowing Match Association is a nonprofit 501C(4) organization. Funded solely from cash donations, in-kind contributions of materials, equipment or services, the auction of baked goods from the Junior and Ladies Fair, as well as park rental fees. Plowman's Park is privately owned and maintained by the Association, without any tax or public funds.

The Association Board has been tireless in maintaining the 19-acre park and buildings: improvements include metal roofs and siding on buildings; blacktop around the pavilion and stage; pavilion floor replaced and gutters added; and replacement of vintage equipment from the 1940's and 1970's that had expired in usefulness, with a used 2010 mower and a used 2015 utility tractor.

In addition to routine maintenance, the unpredictable occurs with unexpected costs: underground water leaks; vandalism and unauthorized trespass/use of park resulting in damage to Kenny field and other areas.

The work of the Association has been advanced by the generous in-kind support of individuals, businesses and organizations – your support is priceless. It is with great appreciation that we acknowledge our many sponsors who support us by providing the funds for the prize money at the Plowing Match. Our gratitude is also extended to everyone who bids and buys at auction. This support has extended our ability to provide improvements and enhancements beyond our funding, as well as continue the Big Rock Plowing Match as an event free of admission and parking fees. Plowman's Park is in good shape, better than it has been since it became home to the Plowing Match, but so much more is needed and the time has come for us to reach out to the community for assistance.



Our most immediate list for enhancements, renovation and maintenance of Plowman's Park include:

- ◆ Upgrade electric service to 200 amp service to upgrade lunch stand and add lighting throughout the park.
- ◆ Improve cooking equipment in lunch stand building
- ◆ Renovate restrooms to be ADA compliant
- ◆ Upgrade sound system (current system is 51 years old)
- ◆ Blacktop all gravel roads/surfaces within the park
- ◆ Upgrade lights at Kenny Field
- ◆ Payoff the loan on the utility tractor
- ◆ Repair concrete floor in Ladies Fair building

Over the years, donors have been generous in providing significant contributions to the Association. Monetary contributions were received from the Lois Morris (2013) and Robert Hardekopf (2014) estates and this spring, metal picnic tables were donated by Cyril W. Matter to commemorate his family's memories of living in Big Rock and being part of the Plowing Match.

Perhaps you have enjoyed an event at the park. This private park is owned and maintained, without any tax or public funds, by the Big Rock Plowing Match Association.



In 1952, Cyril O. Matter sold his trucking business and bought a 125-acre farm on Camp Dean Road. The family settled down and became involved in the community. Cyril's dad served as President of the Plowing Match Association for 15 years from 1957 to 1972 and was instrumental in the early development of Plowman's Park. His mom Hazel entered her baked goods and knitted items in the Ladies Fair bringing home many ribbons over the years. Cyril started competing at the Plowing Match as a kid, learning and taking tips from his dad's Uncle Rob to hone his skills enabling him to win in his class. He played many a game on Kenny Field first as a little league player, then Pony and Legion leagues and as an adult on fast-pitch teams. He fondly reflects on these wonderful memories. Cyril's gift of giving back to the community allowed the Association to replace all of the wooden tables under and around the pavilion. The Association is extremely grateful for his generous gift—we know everyone will enjoy creating their own fond memories of Plowman's Park, home of the Big Rock Plowing Match.



25 points: Low back furrows distinct (back to be slightly crowning and all trash covered)

25 points: Furrows of uniform depth and width, showing slight ridge and distinct from end to end

25 points: Line of furrow

15 points: Covering of trash

10 points: General neatness of the whole and appearance of ends

- ◆ All plowmen must plow 5 inches but not more than 7 inches deep.
- ◆ All plowmen must make 7 rounds.
- ◆ No assistance to any plowmen after the first round.
- ◆ All plowmen using 16-inch plows must plow not less than 14 inches.
- ◆ All plowmen using 14-inch plows must plow not less than 12 inches.
- ◆ All plowmen using 12-inch plows must plow not less than 10 inches.
- ◆ All plowmen must leave the field at designated finish time, unless granted more time by field committee for some reasonable cause.

All plowmen will be scored back:

- ◆ 4 points for each foot in width for not finishing the land by the specified finish time.
- ◆ 4 points for each inch less than the minimum depth of 5 inches.
- ◆ 4 points for each inch in excess of the maximum depth of 7 inches.

CLASSES ON SATURDAY

- ◆ Boys and Girls 15-and-Under Class
- ◆ Boys and Girls 19-and-Under Class
- ◆ Farmers Open Class
- ◆ Prizewinners Class: Plowmen who have taken two first places in the Farmers Class qualify to compete in this class.
- ◆ Expert Plowmen's Class: Plowmen who have won first place two successive years in the Prizewinners Class must compete in this class.
- ◆ Horse or Mule Class
- ◆ Novelty Class: Judged on unit only, plowing does not enter in judging. Plowmen in this class are not required to make 7 complete rounds.

- ◆ Antique Rubber Class: Tractors made before 1939
- ◆ Antique Steel Class: Tractors made before 1939
- ◆ Novelty Class: Judged on unit only, plowing does not enter in judging. Plowmen in this class are not required to make 7 rounds.

SWEEPSTAKES

Given to the plowman with the highest score during the Plowing Match, except those entered in the Expert class.

HORSE SHOW

SATURDAY

Soon summer will give way to fall when the brilliant leaves and harvested crops remind all that it is time for the Big Rock Plowing Match. Farmers from all over Illinois and neighboring states gather to compete to earn the honor of the best plow person in the competition.

At the other end of Plowman's Park, riders will compete in the 34th annual Big Rock Horse Show. Riders from the age of 6 through 60 will compete in over 25 events. Cash awards and ribbons are given to the best riders and horses. Our judge is Ms. Amy Rovtar-Payne from Sugar Grove. In addition to judging, she will teach riders how to improve their ride in the different events.

There are several fun events including an egg and spoon race and bribe your horse. We even have a class where we "auction" the horse and rider to individual spectators where the winning temporary owner of the horse can take home 50% of the pot for 1st place, 35% for second place and 15% for third place and the rider will receive a ribbon for the competition.

Our goal is to make sure the riders not only learn but have FUN. At the end of the show all ribbon winners that have stayed to the end of the competition gather in the arena and a \$100 cash award goes to a lucky ribbon winner with the matching number on the back of their ribbon. Our High Point and Reserve High Point winners will also win a cash award along with a ribbon.
