## ENTRIES

- Entries will be accepted only between the hours of 3 and 7 PM on Friday, September 15.
- All items entered must be the work of the exhibitor. Entries are limited to one per person in each class.
- In section $V$ any entry that has won a ribbon at the Ladies Fair may not be entered again. Non-winning items entered prior to 2019 are eligible.
- Judges may not enter any class they judge.
- Entry form is attached and also available to print from the website (bigrockplowingmatch.org). Each exhibitor is asked to fill out this form. Place an X in the box for each item you are entering.
- Each item should have a label with complete information for each Section, Category and Class name per example below. Do not put your name on entries. Labels are available to print from the website. Entrants have the choice of printing on paper to cut and pin or tape to item, or to print on adhesive labels (Avery \#5160). Please bring return address/computer labels one per item - to be used on entry tags.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS \& JUDGING CRITERIA

- Quality of workmanship, as well as beauty of the entry will be considered. Baked items will be judged on appearance, texture, taste, moisture and presentation. All ingredients must be edible on the baked items.
- Please bring 13 (Bakers dozen) of all cookies, cupcakes, muffins, brownies, bars and candies.
- All food entries must be on sturdy cardboard or heavy duty plates. Entries must be packaged in a large zip top bag or container with a domed top. Sorry, no twist ties or plastic wrap. Entries deemed unsafe (mold, bugs, etc.) will be disposed of. Please no cream cheese or whipped cream toppings.
- Not all entries will be awarded a ribbon. Judges' decisions are final.
- Prize money will be awarded after Saturday's auction in the Office (S.E. corner of lunch stand) at approximately 3:30 PM.
- Prize money not picked up by 4 PM on Sunday will be considered a donation and will not be forwarded by mail.


## All winning entries in baking and candy will be sold as packaged at the Auction on Saturday: Junior Fair at 1 PM, followed by Ladies Fair at 1:30 PM and Quilts at 2 PM.

- Made from scratch only - no box mixes.
- Minimum $8^{\prime \prime}$ pan. May be layer.

4 Favorite Recipe - included on a $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{\prime \prime}$ card.
5 Chocolate Zucchini
Special Recipe - Must use this recipe
Class $6 \quad 1^{\text {st }} \$ 30 \quad 2^{\text {nd }} \$ 20 \quad 3^{\text {rd }} \$ 10$

## Patti McKenzie's Oatmeal Cake

1 cup oatmeal
$11 / 4$ cup boiling water
1 stick of butter, softened
1 cup brown sugar
1 cup white sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
2 beaten eggs
$11 / 3$ cup flour
1 teaspoon cinnamon
$1 / 2$ teaspoon of salt
1 teaspoon of baking soda
Combine oatmeal, water, and let cool. Cream butter and sugars. Add eggs and vanilla. Add oatmeal. Add dry ingredients. Pour mixture into a $9 \times 13$ pan sprayed with baking spray. Bake at 350 degrees for $30-35$ Minutes.

## Frosting:

1 stick of butter melted
$1 / 2$ cup of brown sugar
2 cups of coconut
Mix all ingredients together and spread onto the warm cake.
Broil for 2-3 minutes until toasted.

Theme: Park District Movie in the Park

- Formed, shaped, layer or sheet cake.
- Minimum dimensions of cake is $9^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$


## Category C - Layer Cakes

- Minimum $8^{\prime \prime}$ round. Must be layer.

- Made from scratch only. No mini loaves.

## Special Quilt

5 Mini Quilt - Theme: Cattle Show See Special Award

- Quilted and pieced by hand or machine. More points if hand quilted.
- Finished size must be $24^{\prime \prime} \times 24^{\prime \prime}$.
- Rod sleeve on back of quilt.
- Label: 2023 Quilt Challenge, Quilter's name on back of quilt. Cover label with black cloth, loosely stitched.
First and Second place quilts will be sold at auction
