

KENNY FIELD LIGHT PROJECT

he ball field in Big Rock has a long history dating back to the 1920's with games played by little leagues, pony leagues, ASA leagues, American Legion leagues, church leagues and the Hinckley Big Rock High School teams, all calling the field home. It was in the mid-60's that Kenny Raymond, Bill Thurow, Jr. and Roger Hatfield asked the Plowing Match Board about putting lights at the ball field. It had not happened when a car accident took the life of Kenny Raymond in June 1967.

Roy Raymond was an impetus behind the origin of Kenny Field, dedicated to the memory of Kenny Raymond, his nephew. Roy pledged that the family was going to build a lighted baseball field at Plowman's Park. The committee, headed by Mr. & Mrs. Herman Lange, included Harley Davis, Bill Thurow, Jr. and Roger Hatfield, with the assistance of Roy Raymond. The estimated cost for the professional size baseball diamond was \$12,000. The project included an electronic scoreboard, sound system, concession stand, press box, bleachers and lighted field—"the newest type on eight light standards with 91 1,500 watt quartz-iodide lamps." It was built by donations with the final cost underwritten by Roy.

Kenny Field was built in just five weeks with 325 cash contributions that flowed in from Big Rock, Hinckley, Kaneville, Elburn, Sugar Grove, Aurora, North Aurora, Yorkville and DeKalb. Big Rock's young and old worked together seven days a week for an estimated 8,500 hours to string electrical wire, lay block, shovel dirt, set light poles and assist in any necessary work, determined that the field would be ready for use at the Plowing Match. The community was aided by the involvement of Valley Electric Supply in Aurora, Muscatine Lighting & Manufacturing Company, ComEd, Joslyn Manufacture Supply Company in Chicago, a Rock Falls trucking firm and several generous in-kind donations.

The field was dedicated at the 73rd Plowing Match on Sunday, September 17, 1967, with a game between the First Congregational and Baptist Churches followed by a Donkey Ball game under the lights. It hosted games played by Eddie Fainer or "King" and his Court (4-man softball team), as well as the Aurora Sealmaster Team, who were then world champions. Exhibition games, tournaments, championships and All-Star games were

also played on the field. "This wonderful field is a source of great pride to our community. It is in use almost every night during the summer and attracts ball teams from a distance of 50 miles." *Plowing Match Times* 1968

Fast forward to 2023 when the lights at Kenny Field will once again illuminate the night sky. New LED lights were made possible by the Kane



County Board, through its Office of Community Reinvestment, with funds from the Grand Victorian Riverboat Casino. Final approval of our application was received in October 2022 and due to supply issues the project was delayed until 2023. Spring weather delayed work until June when the ground was firm enough for equipment. In less than 60-days TCL Electrical and Lighting set in place 72 Sparta Sports lights with 112,000 lumens replacing the original 91 lights with 30,000 lumens installed in 1967. Additionally, the electric service panels were upgraded. The completed project was approximately \$174,000 funded primarily through ComEd grants at \$135,000 with the balance covered by the Grand Victorian Riverboat Grant and the Association.

Further Kenny Field enhancements are taking place. In July, members of the Kane County Phantoms team cut/dug, rolled and removed 15 feet of grass to extend the entire infield. Next came the removal of the dugout roofs followed by the demolition and removal of concrete. Steve Ruh, assisted by Rick Paver and Preston Sanford completed this work in August. Ruh Farms will be funding the state-of-the-art chain link fence dugout replacement.

The Association extends a huge thank you to everyone involved in this project and the enhancing of Kenny Field to bring it back to its shining days of glory.

25 points: Low back furrows distinct (back to be slightly crowning and all trash covered)

25 points: Furrows of uniform depth and width, showing slight ridge and distinct from end to end

25 points: Line of furrow 15 points: Covering of trash

10 points: General neatness of the whole and appearance of ends

- All plowmen must plow 5 inches but not more than 7 inches deep.
- All plowmen must make 7 rounds.
- No assistance to any plowmen after the first round.
- ♦ All plowmen using 16-inch plows must plow not less than 14 inches.
- ♦ All plowmen using 14-inch plows must plow not less than 12 inches.
- All plowmen using 12-inch plows must plow not less than 10 inches.
- ◆ All plowmen must leave the field at designated finish time, unless granted more time by field committee for some reasonable cause.

All plowmen will be scored back:

- 4 points for each foot in width for not finishing the land by the specified finish time.
- 4 points for each inch less than the minimum depth of 5 inches.
- 4 points for each inch in excess of the maximum depth of 7 inches.

There are five weight classes from 40 to 90 pounds: 40-50 lbs.; 51-60 lbs.; 61-70 lbs.; 71-80 lbs.; and 81-90 lbs.







The twenty-eighth annual Plowing Match was held on the H. S. Long Farm and grove three miles west of Big Rock on September 23, 1923. It was "the one perfect day of the year." Conservative estimates of the crowd placed it at 8 to 10 thousand, at any rate it was as large as any ever at the match.

This year considerable interest was shown in the horse drawn contests and the tractor exhibits especially by the dealers and manufacturers were small in numbers. Farm machinery exhibits on the grounds were not as plentiful as in years past.

Much interest was shown in the address given by Dr. B. J. Cigrased of Aurora on the "Farmer of Yesterday and Tomorrow."

The Women's Department had an overflow of all kinds of exhibits in the tent.

Horseshoe contest won by Miner Bros. of Kaneville, second prize by Bastian & Farrer of Hinckley. This year the contest was open to everyone.

St. Charles Boys Home band furnished music. They were transported to the grounds by the community school buses. The Ball Game with Plano and the Aurora Lutheran League playing resulted in a victory for Plano. Both teams put up a good game and greatly pleased the spectators.

Sept. 23, 1923, H. S. Long Farm

The Plowing Match Association gave \$1,000 to the new school being built in Big Rock. The money was used to buy the curtains for the stage, purchasing and paying the labor to install the backboard and gaskets, and screens in the gymnasium. They also paid for the small room that was formerly used as a movie projector house.
