# **Grand-Prix Eventing at Bruce's Field**

#### FULL EVENT RECAP





California based, Tokyo alternate, Tamie Smith and the 15-year-old German Sport Horse gelding, Mai Baum, made the trip over to the East Coast this winter and claimed the win at the **2021 \$50,000 LiftMaster Grand-Prix Eventing at Bruce's Field**. Tamie & Mai Baum, owned by the Ahearn family & Eric Markell, laid down a 23.3 score in the Dressage ring to take the lead after the first phase of competition on Friday, March 5th, and never looked back. A flawless round over Michel Vaillancourt's Show Jumping track, brought to you by Jack Wetzel & the D&W Group, saw them head into Saturday's competition in the lead. The Cross-Country phase, brought to you by the City of Aiken, was run in reverse order of standing, so Tamie & Mai Baum were the last pair out on course. The optimum time on Capt. Mark Phillips Cross-Country course proved to be a formidable test. They knew they had 6 seconds to spare to stay in the lead. *"'Lexus' was completely wild and crazy at the beginning of the course, but he finally settled in and we managed to make the time!"* said Tamie after her *"wild ride"*.
