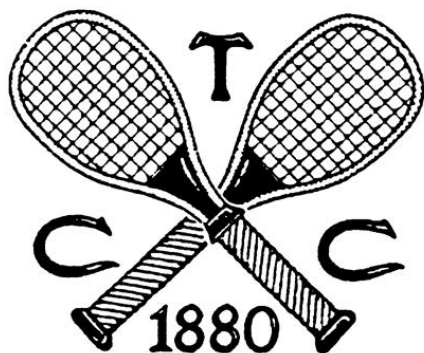

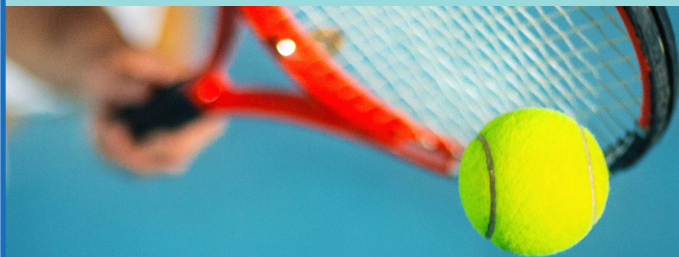

Changing Roles

One of the joys of being a spectator of the USTA National Father & Son Clay Court Championships through the years is seeing how teams transform over time. Many of the best teams begin playing national events when the son is 13 or 14 years of age. At that stage, the father's experience makes him the clear leader in terms of strategy and proper court positioning, and he is certain to be the stronger player. He has the more dominant serve, hits harder groundstrokes and thus will look to take as many shots as possible in hopes of mitigating the weaker aspects of his young son's game. But as the son reaches his mid-teens, the two will become more equal in ability, thus changing the team dynamics. No longer will the father automatically serve first in every set or take the majority of overheads, two common traits when one player is superior to the other. Finally, once the son becomes a collegiate player, there is no question as to who will dictate play and it isn't the aging, often-times balding father. The transformation is now complete; the roles of the players have changed 180 degrees and the best teams have to come to terms with that reality.

Michael and Alex Wesbrooks, who have won the past five Clay Court Championships (they captured the 2016-2019 titles in Cincinnati and the 2021 championship in Florida), are the most current example of how father and son must come to terms with the natural progression of the father/son doubles team. The Wesbrooks first national event was in 2015. Son, Alex, had just turned 16 while father, Michael, a former All-American at Louisiana State University, was still playing at an incredibly high level. They lost a hard-fought quarterfinal match to 7-time champions, Jerry and Brett Morse-Karzen. Michael remembers the 2015 event well, "At that point, I was the better doubles player and also the leader on the court as far as strategy and direction." It remains their only loss in six national events. When they returned to CTC in 2016, Alex's play had improved and it led to their first title, "The next year was a big change as Alex developed as a doubles player immensely and was equal or better than me. The evolution became final when in 2021, after becoming a top player on the University of Louisville Tennis Team, Michael was well aware of who the dominant player was. Each year, Alex has become a stronger player and more of the leader on the court. So much so that last year in Florida, there was no doubt he was the reason we won the tournament. He took over the match. It was a beautiful thing for me to witness as a father."

The greatest teams in the history of this event, the Van Lingens, Morse-Karzens, Weinackers, Smiths and Wesbrooks have all seen how the role of the father must change for them to remain at the top. It is possible that of all the qualities it takes to win a USTA National event, having a humble father should be added to the list.

USTA National Father & Son Championships Circuit

The USTA National Father & Son Championships Circuit is comprised of four tournaments, each played on a different surface.

The Indoor Championships are played in April at Cherry Hill Racquet Club in Cherry Hill, New Jersey.

The Grass Court Championships are played in July at Longwood Cricket Club in Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts.

The Clay Court Championships are played in July at Cincinnati Tennis Club immediately after the Grass Court Championships.

The Hard Court Championships are played in November or December at La Jolla Beach & Tennis Club in La Jolla, California.

The Grass Court Championships are the oldest of the four tournaments, having begun in 1918. The tournament is held the weekend before our Cincinnati Father & Son tournament.

Talbert-Trabert Sportsmanship Award

In 2019, Praveen and Rohan Chandrasekhar (following their second appearance at the Father & Son Tournament) were awarded the prestigious Talbert-Trabert Sportsmanship Award. They were fierce competitors, who left everything on the court. While doing so, they brought a grace and a joy to the game and an infectious desire to share their love of tennis with all the people they met - both those they competed with on the court and the fans who cheered them on.

The Talbert-Trabert Award is named after two lions of tennis, both of whom had deep connections with the Cincinnati Tennis Club. Bill Talbert won the US Doubles Championship four times and was inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 1967. Court 10 at CTC is named in his honor. Tony Trabert was a junior member at CTC where he was tutored by and played with Bill Talbert. Talbert and Trabert won a number of professional doubles tournaments playing together. Trabert went on to win multiple prestigious singles and doubles tournaments (US and French). He was inducted into the Tennis Hall of Fame in 1970. Court 2 at CTC is named in his honor.

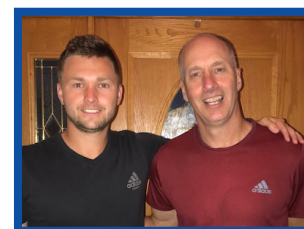

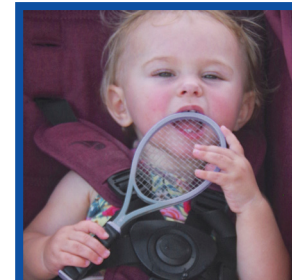

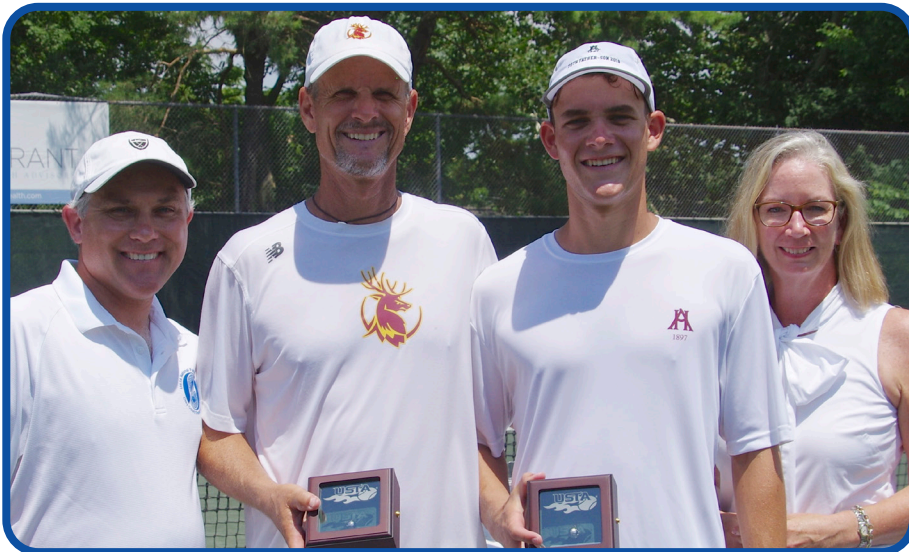
