Workers raised the building jacks and only raised a building three inches a day and they raised them twenty feet. The second was to the Railroad Museum. It was a self-guided tour, and you could take as long as you wanted. Most of the laborers for the railroads were Chinese. In the beginning they were hardly mentioned for their hard work. There were genuine train engines and there were cars for the wealthy, and they were very luxurious with all the amenities of home. There were also box cars for freight and refrigerated ones for fruit.

There were also scale model trains that were so small that the engines and box cars were only about an inch long. Volunteers even made scale models of railroad towns and even had scale models of people, pets and vehicles. It was cool to see the work that these people went to, to create the places along the railroad tracks.

If you have never been on these tours, you are in for a real treat. It was a great outing, and fun was had by all.
