# Minutes of Meeting

Officers meeting 5:30PM-6:00PM

Rosary was prayed 6:00PM-6:25PM led by John Harper

Meeting was called to order by Grand Knight, Charles Huey at 6:35P.M. Our Chaplain, Fr. Michael Lydon, led our opening prayer. Grand Knight, Charles Huey, led in saying the Pledge of Allegiance.

The meeting minutes for the March meeting were approved as written in the April newsletter.

Ron Moellman gave the treasurer's report. As of the end of March the bank statement said we have \$54,088.83 which included \$13,981.39 in outstanding checks. If all of the outstanding checks had been cashed the net amount would be \$40,107.44 (this is the checkbook balance at the end of March).

We had guest speakers giving presentations for two charitable organizations. Karin Kostich, Director of the James II Project, gave a presentation regarding their organizations expanding efforts to provide free meals and other supportive services for unhoused and underprivileged individuals.

Fr. Lydon and another guest speaker gave a presentation about Caritas House in Festus, Missouri. This is a proposed project to build and operate 5,000 sq. ft. transitional housing facility serving 12-25 single adults and families who are unhoused and working to rebuild their lives with dignity and purpose. This project is in its fund-raising stage. They have raised about 70% of their goal of \$1,400,000. The Caritas House will be operated by Catholic Charities Housing with on-site management. The suggestive range of giving is \$2,000 - \$10,000.

Preston Haglin talked about several topics of interest to our council.

1. Fish Fry Report: The fish fries for the current season that ended on Good Friday the council had approximately \$100,000 in gross revenue and \$60,000 in profit. An appreciation dinner for the fish fry workers, Knights, Ladies and friends will be at Bandanas Restaurant in Arnold at 6:00pm, Tuesday April 28, 2026. It was also mentioned that Bob Parson will be stepping down as the kitchen manager. Randy Maledy has volunteered to take over the kitchen manager position.
2. Catholic School Scholarships: Applications are being accepted for \$500.00 scholarships for the upcoming school year. Applicants must be children or grandchildren of Active Knights. Contact Preston Haglin or Charles Huey for an application.
3. Church Picnic: The Knights will be working booths, picking up trash and providing golf cart shuttle rides at the Holy Family Parish Picnic. The Picnic is Friday May 15th and Saturday May 16th. Please contact Preston Haglin to volunteer to help.
4. Sr. Softball Game: The Senior Softball game will be on Saturday, May 23rd from noon-1:00pm. All seniors are invited to join the fun. Younger family members and friends are also invited to attend the game and cheer on the players. A free luncheon will be provided by the council after the game.
5. Membership Report: Our council has far exceeded its goal for the current fraternal year. If we add four more members by the end of June, we will reach 600% of our goal.

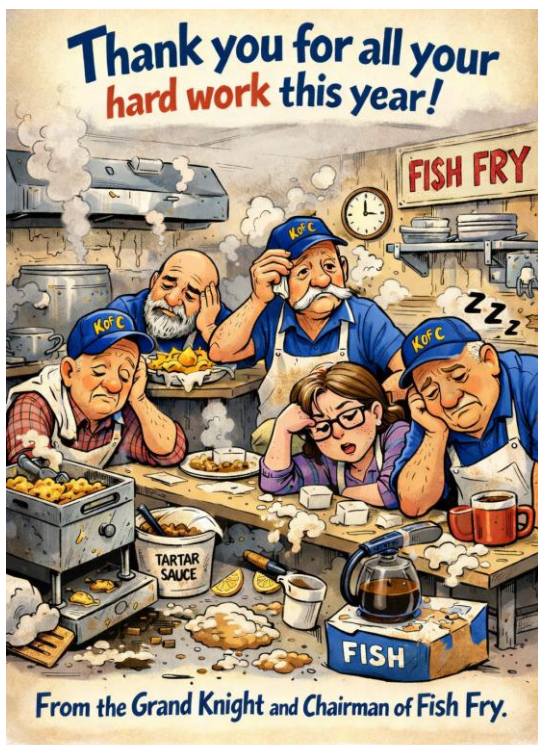

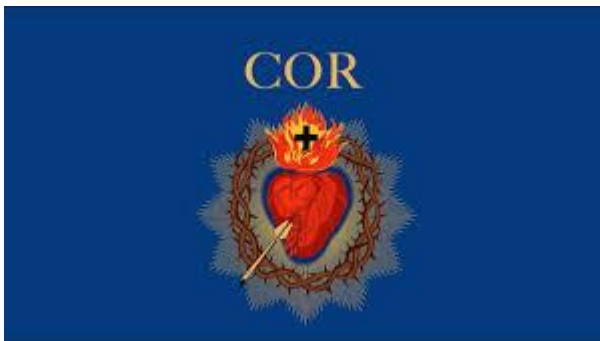
# Ladies Auxillary News

## Proposed By-Law Change

### Article IV- Meeting

The By-law in question currently reads:

Section 1: Regular Meeting of the Council shall be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of each month. All meeting shall commence at 6:30 pm. Twelve members shall constitute a quorum at business meeting.

The By-law is to be changed to read as follows: (All Changes will be in Bold, Italics, and underline)

Section 1: Regular meeting of the council shall be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> **Thursday** of each month. **The Officers meeting shall commence at one hour before the business meeting followed by the rosary and the business meeting shall commence at 7:00 PM.** Twelve members shall constitute a quorum **for the business meeting.**

Rationale: Since the younger members of the council work more Monday Through Thursday these days and they find it hard to get to the meeting for that starts at 6:30pm moving it to 7pm would give them more time to get to the meeting. As for Thursday, if they do not have to work on Friday, they may be more willing to stay and socialize after the meeting which will give the members more time to have fellowship and get to know each other more.

This proposal was read for the 1<sup>st</sup> time in open council on 4/14/2026 and therefore the vote to adopt will be at the May meeting.

# Saint Spotlight

## Our Lady of Fathima



A title of Mary, mother of Jesus, based on the Marian apparitions reported in 1917 by three shepherd children at the Cova da Iria in Fátima, Portugal. The three children were Lúcia dos Santos and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto. José Alves Correia da Silva, Bishop of Leiria, declared the events worthy of belief on 13 October 1930.<sup>[3]</sup>

Pope Pius XII granted a pontifical decree of canonical coronation via the papal bull *Celeberrima solemnitas* towards the venerated image on 25 April 1946. The designated papal legate, Cardinal Benedetto Aloisi Masella, carried out the coronation on 13 May 1946, now permanently enshrined at the Chapel of the Apparitions of Fátima. The same Roman Pontiff also raised the Sanctuary of Fátima to the status of a minor basilica by the apostolic letter *Luce superna* on 11 November 1954.

The published memoirs of Sister Lúcia in the 1930s revealed two secrets that she claimed came from the Virgin Mary, while the third secret was to be revealed by the Catholic Church in 1960. The controversial events at Fátima, including the Miracle of the Sun, gained fame due partly to elements of the secrets, prophecy and eschatological revelations allegedly related to the Second World War and possibly more global wars in the future, particularly the Virgin's request for the Consecration of Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
