3 Key Dependencies for Effective Food Supply Chain Networks in Australia

- 1. Infrastructure
- 2. Labour
- 3. Imports

Approx 25,000 truck trips made by food suppliers to customers per week

Food transport by mode

- Road 85%
- Rail 7%
- Sea 8%

Australia is an overall "Net Exporter" of food i.e Exports more than imports

Ingredients, additives & packaging materials are mostly imported food manufacturing products

On any given day, there could up to 2 days food supply held at different points in the transport system (Road, rail or sea)

WHAT IS FOOD SUPPLY CHAIN?

- Food supply chain refers to the processes and systems that enable food from the farm to be available for human consumption.
- Food supply chain consists of production, processing, distribution, consumption and waste disposal.
- The most critical point in food supply chain is the interaction with the customer. For food, it is through 2 channels 1) Retail and 2) Foodservice
- The main foodservice customer distribution channels are 1) Take away, 2) Dining Out 3) Event/Leisure & 4) Institutional

FOOD SUPPLY CHAIN ISSUES FOR FOODSERVICE?



- Changing consumer trends are heavily impacting foodservice supply chains i.e. online delivery, change in consumer demographic, demand for produce out of season and increase in alternative health trends (vegan & gf)
- Recent disasters and health epidemics are posing threats to the functioning of food supply chain networks

Major factors that impact the effectiveness of food supply chain include -

- **Inventory levels** held at distributor and customer sites
- Import dependency
- Consumer preference towards **fresh produce**
- Increased regulatory requirements
- Natural disasters

Opportunities for improvement

- Improved transparency of how food moves through supply chain
- Alternative/back up sourcing
- Continuous improvement in logistics and transportation
