Motoring Matters

When motor cars were first introduced to Britain the 'Red flag' law (locomotives Act of 1865) was still in force, and the cars were treated as traction engines - and as such had to be driven at a speed limit of four miles an hour, and be preceded by a man on foot carrying a red flag!

Exceeding the speed limit...

Walter Arnold was charged on 28th January 1896 at Tonbridge with exceeding the 2mph speed limit at Paddock Wood. It was estimated that he was doing 8mph when stopped by a policeman on a bicycle after a five mile chase. He was fined one shilling.

The act was finally repealed on 14th November 1896 and motors were allowed to drive on the highway at a speed not exceeding 12mph.

In 1903 British motorists received another charter which, by increasing the speed limit from 12 to 20 mph, enabled more powerful cars to be used.

How times have changed.

Bikers Get All Fired Up In Falkirk

Observers from both the car and bike sections of the Group were invited by our good friend Robert Thomson from Falkirk Fire and Rescue Service to support a road safety event he was running at Falkirk Fire Station on Sunday 2nd April. The event was aimed at bikers in particular, just as the traditional riding season starts in earnest. Fine weather and free food tempted over 100 bikers to attend, together with a number of car drivers. The Fire Service ran a number of sessions teaching basic First Aid and helmet removal techniques, and gave an excellent demonstration at lunchtime of how they deal with a Road Traffic Collision (RTC) - showing how they cut casualties out of a damaged car and get them safely onto a stretcher for medical attention. Two Police motorcyclists brought their bikes along too, and they enjoyed chatting to attendees throughout the day.



Many of the FV Observer team were in attendance, ably assisted by colleagues from Glasgow North, Glasgow South and the Region 8 (West Scotland and Ireland) Area Service Delivery Manager, Scott Tulip. Between us we took around 10 riders and at least one car driver on free assessment rides/drives to give them a wee taste of what IAM RoadSmart can offer. Scott and Ronnie MacLean ran slow manoeuvring exercises throughout the day, tailoring the exercises to individual needs, and our trainee bike Observers, Ian, Wilson and

Dave did a great job booking folk in for the various activities and getting the necessary paperwork signed.

3 RoadSmart courses were sold on the day, with several others promising to sign up in the near future. Robert Thomson said after the event "The motorcyclists I spoke to on the day all commented on how they had enjoyed the event, they also highlighted that it was great to have the opportunity to improve their riding ability and first aid skills."

All in all, an enjoyable and successful day."
