What makes us unique

Wounded Healers is the only young survivors led organization. We believe that survivors of sexual violence are the most powerful advocates against sexual violence and so listening to their voices and subsequent redress the inflicted wound is imperative. Therefore, the development and implementation of all programs includes the expertise, ideas, and strategies of survivors of sexual violence.

Since 2018 we have empowered and trained over 1000 girls with skills to be aware and protect themselves from sexual violence. We put the right tools in children's hands to give them the excellent education they deserve.

Led by passionate survivors, parents, teachers, educators and community members, Wounded Healers continue to fight to restore dignity and end sexual violence in our communities.

- Improved our branding and online appearances.
- Rented a physical office at Kasarani opposite, Kasarani Police station.
- Participated in Nairobi county technical working group to end sexual violence.
- Enrolled Sexual violence prevention curriculum (Nilinde) in public schools Nairobi County.
- Hired a counselor

Our Work in 2020

The Pandemic has been difficult for us all. Overall, it has challenged us to be innovative and find a unique way of serving our community in Kenya. With your support, we reached 1300 people this Year! Programs provided critical resources for survivors and important education on ending sexual violence.



- Thirteen girls were provided with safe housing, counseling, food, and tutoring as schools in Kenya were closed.
- One hundred girls were provided with the Essential through Queens program in Mukuru slums, Nairobi, Kenya.
- Wounded Healers has transitioned the office to an in-house community center that provides consistent mentoring, counseling, safe space, and individualized tutoring.
- 330 children were provided with Education and basic physical skills to protect themselves in event rape occurs through the Nilinde curriculum
- We were part of many incredible events this year, from speaking at international Women's Day events. To Facebook live, podcasts, live radio, Tv, and webinars. We are so grateful for the support we have felt both in-person and online! Thank you to all hosts who helped us share our message!



COVID-19 RESPONSE

The Covid 19 pandemic has brought significant change to the delivery of services, and heightened inequality in access of education. Without a pause, Wounded healers provided valuable support to students, survivors and families who needed us more than ever.

Our Covid -19 Responses included:

- Virtual Psychological Support- Provided one on one counseling to survivors on WhatsApp chats, phone calls and video call. We supported the client with internet funds.
- Zahara program is a monthly program for teens and young women that provides a safe space to discuss Trauma, Reproductive health education, and give a Dignity kit(sanitary towel, underwear, sanitizer, and a mask). Since the pandemic restricted us from meeting monthly, we provided Phone checkings and distributed essentials through the nearest vendors.
- Nilinde Curriculum: Because we could not run our weekly training in schools, we found other ways to engage by providing IEC materials and graphics for students to read while at home.

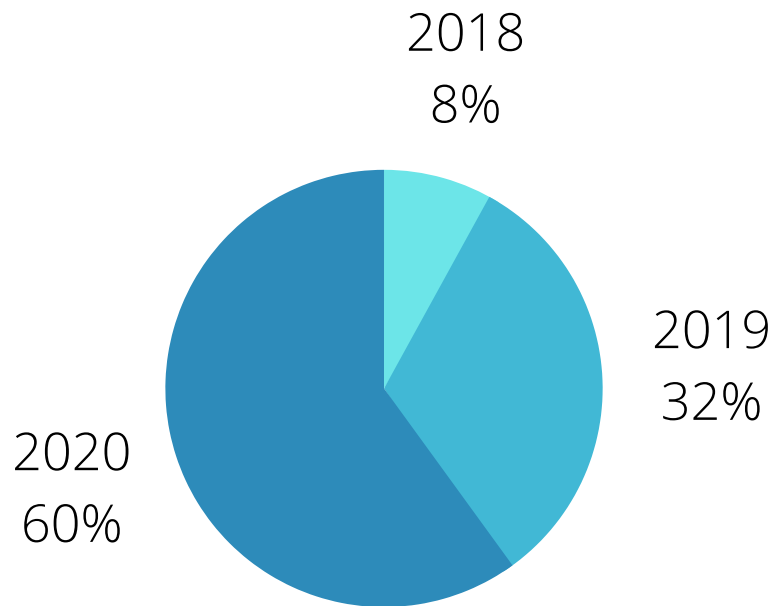

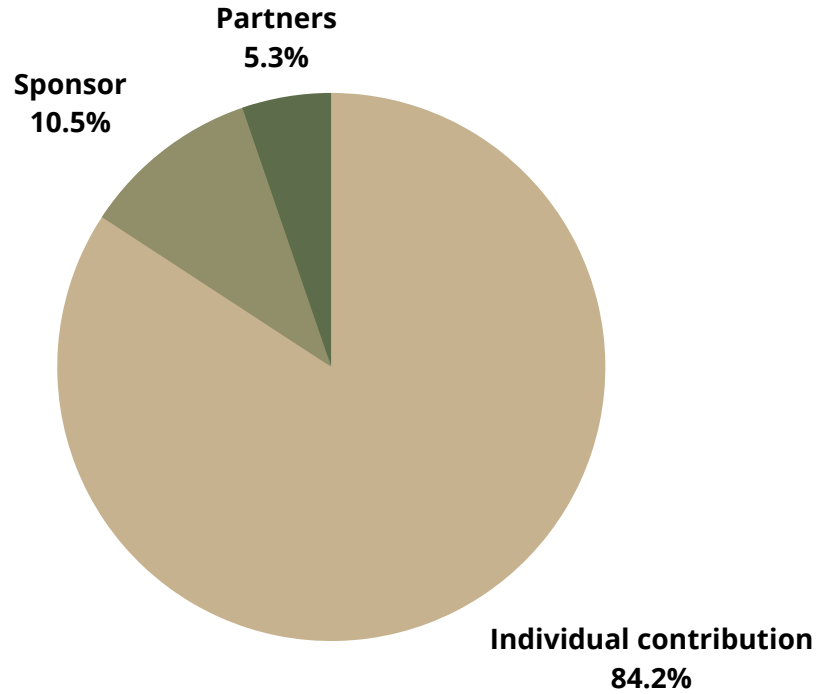
FINANCIALS 2020

We increased program funding with **30%** compared to 2019 while keeping our total assets similar.

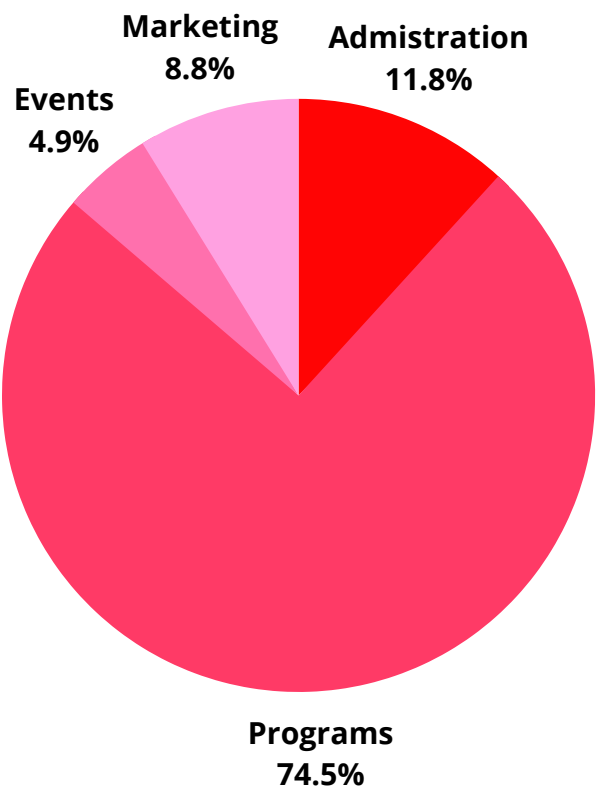
74% expenses went to survivors support
