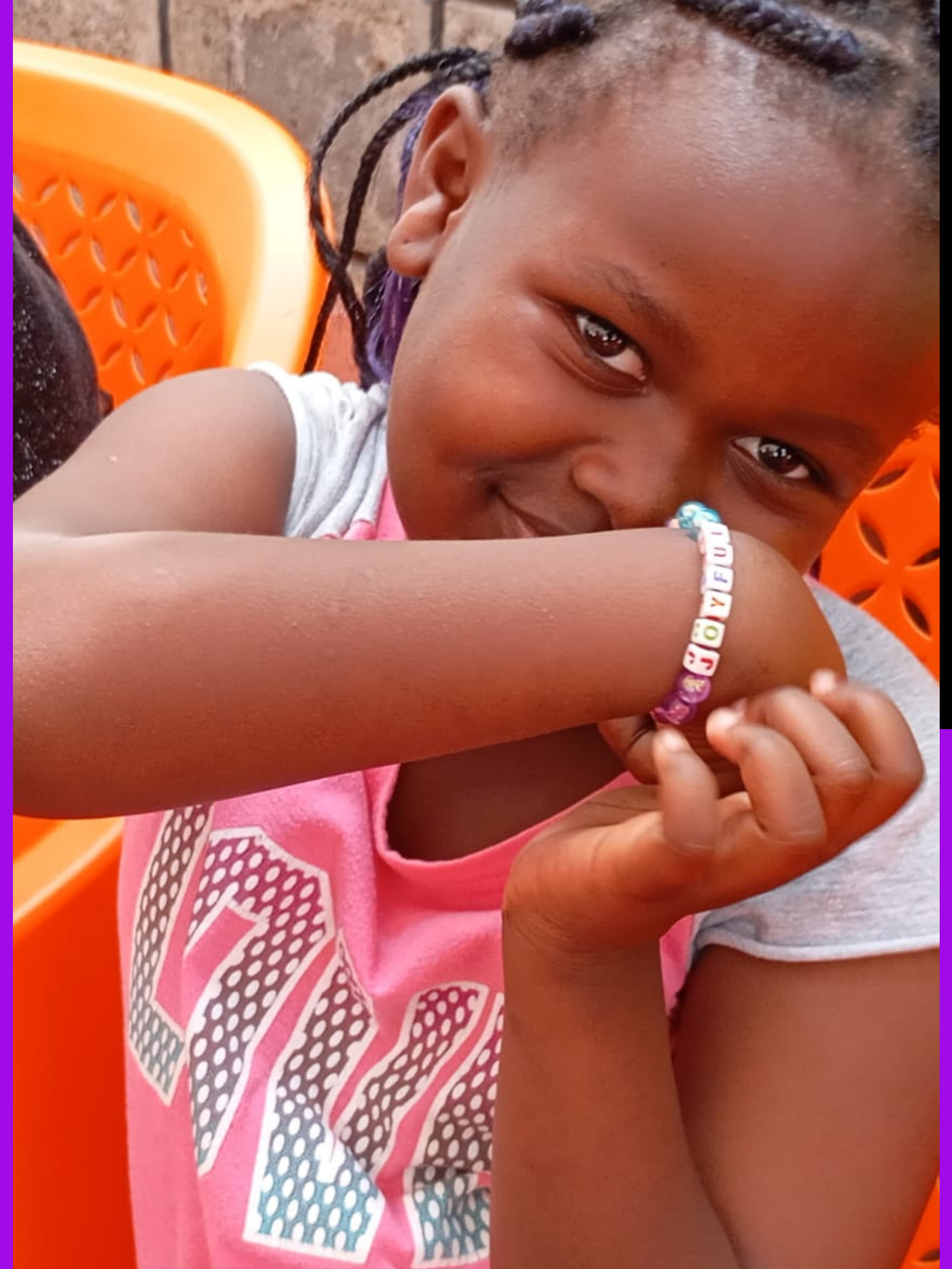

2024 ACHIEVEMENTS

WOMEN ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

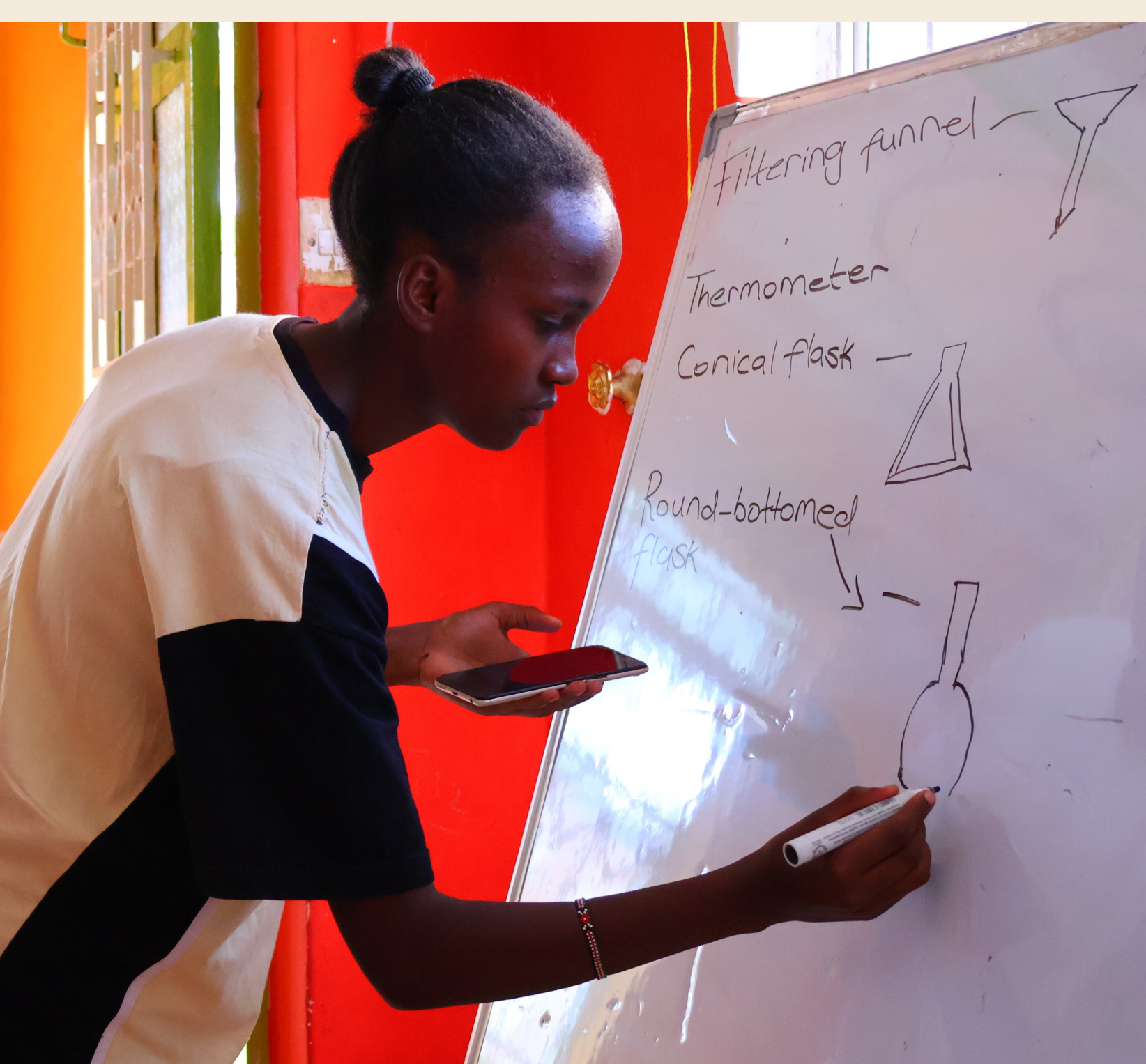
In 2024, our Women's Economic Empowerment project reached significant milestones, particularly with the support of the French Embassy through CREAM. We established and supported 10 self-help groups, composed of women from various community sectors.

These groups have been instrumental in fostering economic independence and raising awareness on crucial issues, including SRHR. One of the key successes this year was the production of reusable sanitary towels. These environmentally friendly products not only address the critical need for menstrual hygiene management but also provide economic opportunities for women in the community, enabling them to create a sustainable income stream.

Impact of the Floods

In April and May 2024, floods severely affected our community, leaving many families in urgent need of basic necessities. With the generous support of CREAM, the Foundation responded quickly and provided food and bedding support to 100 households. This initiative helped alleviate some of the immediate hardships faced by families, ensuring they had the resources needed to rebuild their lives during this challenging period.

Learning Center Growth

Our beauty and cosmetology program became a lifeline for 50 teenage mothers and dozens of women seeking economic independence. Through makeup and nail art, they gained more than just skills—they found resilience, confidence, and hope. With every service they offer, they are rewriting their stories, proving that empowerment starts with skill, but true transformation comes from within.

computer class

In 2024, our computer training program empowered 50 individuals, including teenage mothers and young people eager to build their future. From basic digital literacy to advanced skills, this training opened doors to job opportunities, online businesses, and further education. With technology shaping the world, these learners are now more confident, independent, and ready to compete in the digital space, proving that access to knowledge is the first step to transformation.

Adult Education

our adult education program welcomed 30 learners, many of them teenage mothers determined to rewrite their futures. Understanding their challenges, we created a child-friendly space, ensuring they could attend classes while their children were cared for. With every lesson, they gained knowledge, confidence, and the power to change their lives, proving that it's never too late to learn and that motherhood should never be a barrier to education.

Sewing class

In 2024, 20 women gained valuable sewing skills, turning fabric into opportunity and impact. Together, they produced 2,000 reusable sanitary towels, providing a sustainable solution for menstrual health while generating income for their families. With each stitch, they are not only building financial independence but also promoting dignity and environmental sustainability—proving that skills in the right hands can change lives.

2024 Achievements

SGBV Awareness and Engagement

Community Dialogue

In 2024, we reached 3000 people through community dialogues on SGBV, creating a platform for open discussion and learning. These dialogues were pivotal in raising awareness, fostering healing, and encouraging collective action. We addressed harmful cultural norms, empowered survivors, and motivated community members to actively stand against violence.

By bringing people together to share stories, learn, and unite, we are helping to build a stronger, more resilient community where everyone plays a role in ending gender-based violence. Together, we can create lasting change.

Amani Boys

In 2024, we engaged 100 boys in our program, using football and liquid soap making as tools to promote healthy masculinity and combat sexual violence. Through football, we fostered teamwork, leadership, and respect, encouraging boys to become allies in the fight against gender-based violence.

In addition to sports, we introduced liquid soap making as a skill-building activity, providing boys with practical tools for entrepreneurship and empowerment. By combining these activities, we are helping boys not only develop important life skills but also become active contributors to creating a violence-free community.

Girls Soccer

In 2024, we introduced girls' soccer as a powerful tool for empowerment and leadership, with the theme “Girls Too Can”. The program challenged cultural norms and provided girls with a platform to showcase their skills, leadership, and resilience in a traditionally male-dominated sport.

Through soccer, we encouraged girls to believe in their potential, break barriers, and inspire their peers. This initiative not only promotes gender equality but also builds confidence, teamwork, and a sense of community among the girls.



2024 ACHIEVEMENT

Body safety

In 2024, our Body Safety Program reached 2000 children, empowering them with crucial knowledge about personal boundaries, consent, and how to protect themselves. Through interactive sessions, we taught children the importance of body autonomy and how to recognize and report unsafe situations. By engaging children at a young age, we are equipping them with the tools they need to stay safe and build a culture of respect and accountability. This program is a vital step toward creating a future generation that understands and values personal safety.

Girls Mentorship

In 2024, our girls' mentorship program provided guidance, support, and empowerment to young girls, helping them navigate the challenges they face and realize their full potential. Through one-on-one sessions and group activities, mentors shared valuable life skills, leadership lessons, and advice on handling social, emotional, and educational challenges.

This program is helping girls build confidence, resilience, and the belief that they can achieve anything. By nurturing the next generation of leaders, we are ensuring that these girls have the support and tools to break barriers and create positive change in their communities.

Counseling Services >

Our counseling services reached 250 individuals, providing essential support to those affected by trauma, loss, and emotional distress. Through one-on-one counseling and group therapy, we offered a safe space for individuals to process their experiences, heal, and build emotional resilience.

These services have been crucial in helping survivors of SGBV, flood victims, and others in the community who faced personal challenges. By offering professional care and guidance, we are supporting individuals on their journey toward healing and empowerment, ensuring they have the strength to move forward.

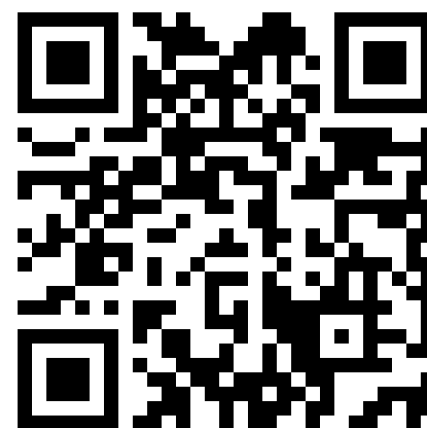
