Crisis/Hotline: All calls are confidential and autonomous. We listen, assist and discuss options and resources available as well as identify your next steps. . Marta’s House 24 hour *Crisis Hotline: 541-884-0390*

Sexual Assault Response Resources: In-person response to Emergency Room calls, assistance with protection orders and peer support. Marta’s House 24 hour *Sexual Assault Hotline: 541-883-RAPE*

Turtle Cove: Our Housing First program is designed to bridge the gap for women and families on the path to self-sufficiency. *541-205-5223*

Marta’s House Shelter: Emergency shelter with 1, 3, 7 day emergency stays upon availability. Extended options are available for 30 days in a women’s program.

Our House Next Door: A facility located next door to Marta’s House provides hosting opportunities for meetings, trainings, and workshops for participants of Marta’s House programs designed to promote personal independence.

Re-entry Program: A new collaboration with Community Corrections focused on a gender specific program working with women at risk and women in the criminal justice system.

PAWS for Change: (Prevention, Awareness, Wellness, & Strength) is a sexual assault prevention program designed to engage men and boys to create social change through programs such as, Men’s Academy, and bystander engagement.

Marta’s House Walk-in Services: Walk-in services Monday- Thursday 9 am -12 pm and by appointment from 1 pm – 4 pm. Groups and community meetings are held 1 pm- 4 pm.

2015 Goals

- Enhance outreach to women in the criminal justice system as well as those experiencing any form of trafficking.
- Increase Community Education/Prevention outreach to improve reporting and prosecution of Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, Trafficking and Stalking.

For over 30 years the Marta's House has been providing services to men, women, and children who are victims of Sexual Assault, Intimate partner Violence, Stalking and all forms of Trafficking.

Safety is always the top priority. Twenty four hours a day people in need can find support through access to our 24-hour crisis hotline, shelter and services for victims of sexual assault. In addition, walk in services are available Monday through Thursday 9am-12pm and by appointment.

Marta's House services, programs, and projects are made possible thanks to community support, individual and corporate donations and the contribution of numerous volunteers resulting in over 30,000 hours of service. A majority of funding for Marta's House programs come from federal, state, local, and foundation grants. The dedication of six full time employees and the numerous volunteers are critical to ensuring success and the ability of the organization to continue these critical life sustaining services to those most in need.

Community Education and Workshops are also provided offering interactive presentations on subjects such as Economic Justice, Dating Violence, Stalking, Trafficking, Domestic Violence, Anti-Oppression and Racism, Economic Empowerment. In addition, Marta's House provides court and legal support, safety planning, assistance with transportation, clothing and furniture for children, comfort kits for rape victims, household starter kits and furniture for women moving out of shelter and six months of advocacy support after leaving shelter.
