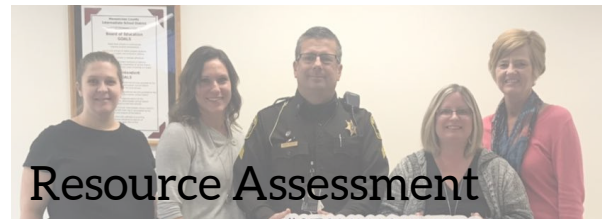

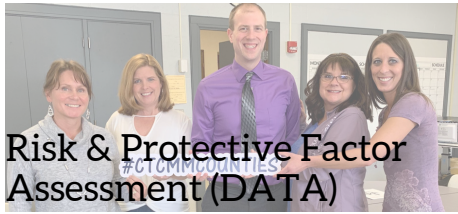

Resource Assessment

The Resource Assessment workgroup has been busy finalizing the new resource smartphone application and is excited to announce that the Great Start Collaborative has secured funding to support the app for another year! The work group is in the final stages of adding pictures to the various pages of the app and going through all the information to make sure everything is filled out completely. They will be looking at a plan to advertise the app in the near future. Resource is also working on a presentation highlighting the Community Action Plan for the next Key Leader meeting in November. Risk & Protective Factor Assessment (DATA)

The 2019 survey results have been collected and returned to this group. In November, members will receive training to interpret the results and select risk and protective factors identified based on these results. This work group is working on developing brief animated videos to share with the community to raise awareness and bring support to CTC. The videos will focus on survey results and will include sample questions. Videos will be created in a series but will be able to stand alone and each will be approximately 30 seconds long.



Suicide Prevention & Mental Health

This work group recently held the Ripple Effect movie showing. they had 96 seats filled with lots of great feedback from the community. Sources of Strength in Marinette High School has been hanging posters for their "I am Stronger" campaign. This group supported the Suicide Prevention Network Walk where 85 people completed the walk. In the future this group is working on showing the movies "Written Off" and "Resilience". There have been two pre-screenings of "Written Off" to our work group members in preparation.



Outreach and Public Relations

This work group group has been working on yard signs and window clings as a new method of adverting and has assisted in promoting the film The Ripple Effect which was shown to a sold out audience. They are currently working on new radio ads and looking to promote the blueprint programming already in our community.



Funding

The funding committee is working to help fund the suicide prevention/ mental health committee's mental health first aid classes as well as working with the resource group to provide some funding for the marketing of the Rtown app. We are also holding our rubber chicken fundraiser on Friday the 18th at the Marinette High School home game.



Youth Involvement

This workgroup has been active within the community, and in supporting the Healthy Youth Coalition (HYC) within our schools. HYC support includes meeting with all schools in our counties over the past few months. We offer the schools knowledge, education, and aide in planning activities. This included presenting CTC & Community Health Partnership to all and promoting and offering Botvin's Life Skills prevention education (with newly trained facilitators) and Youth Mental Health First Aid.

We supported and took part in the Marinette High School Back to School Event, Hugh Bretl Drug Awareness Fundraiser, HYC Color Run, and Women, Wine, and Wellness event. CTC had Vaping and other prevention displays at the Marinette Middle School Orientation night, National Night Out, Marinette County Fair, and the Marinette County Wellness Fair. This group is in the process of planning a showing for Written Off; a video about opioid misuse. We are also planning an anti-vaping town hall winter event on vaping, gateway drugs, recovery, and prevention followed by an action plan to address vaping community wide.
