Dear brothers and sisters in Islam, today we are celebrating one of the greatest festivals of Islam-Eid ul Adhaa (festival of sacrifice). It is a day of joy and celebration, a day to show happiness and delight, a day in which we renew our faith and recalibrate ourselves to live our lives according to the teachings of the Quran and the example of our beloved Prophet Muhammad, and out of all the days that we live our lives, today we are experiencing the most beloved day to The Prophet (pbuh) said:

" إِنَّ أَعْظُمَ الأَيَّامِ عِنْدَ اللَّهِ تَبَارَكَ وَتَعَالَى يَوْمُ النَّحْرِ ثُمَّ يَوْمُ الْقُرِّ "

"the greatest day amongst the days of Allah (swt) is the day of nahir" (the day of sacrifice).

Above all, this is the day in which we celebrate our relationship with a special friend of Allah; this is the day in which we show gratitude to Allah (swt) for guiding us to be on the religion of this special friend, the religion of Ibrahim (AS). Allah (swt) says:

ثُمُّ أَوْحَيْنَا إِلَيْكَ أَنِ اتَّبِعُ مِلَّةً إِبْرَاهِيمَ حَنِيفًا ﴿ وَمَا كَانَ مِنَ الْمُشْرِكِينَ

"Then We revealed to you, [O Muhammad], to follow the religion of Abraham, inclining toward truth; and he was not of those who associate with Allah." (An-Nahl [\%:\\\\)]).

We are honored to be from the followers of Ibrahim...the father of the Prophets.... The same message of Muhammad ibn Abdillah, the final prophet sent to mankind, it is not a new message but rather it is renewal of the message of Ibrahim and through the institutions of Eid ul-Adha and Hajj we are taught to closely align ourselves to this same message of Ibrahim...the message of Islamic monotheism.(AS),

all of Allah's Nessengers taught their People - Adam - Noah. Moses - Jesus and Muhammad propert

Whether was the model of Islam, who came to Allah (swt) with an al-Qalb al-saleem (a sound heart) in total submission and obedience to Allah (swt) –directing his entire life totally focused towards Allah (swt).

Our prophet Ibrahim grew up in a seciety that was deeply rooted in idol worship and polytheism. We was the son of a father who sculpted idols for a living, and sold them facilitating others to worship other than Allah. Prophet Ibrahim was blessed with wisdom even from his youth, and he was able to recognize the falsehood of the society in which he lived in, he was able to see through the illusion, the propaganda, the tricks, the idolatry and immorality present in his society, that were used to divert the masses from understanding who created them, who they are and where they were heading.

This is similar to the society we live in today, with its idols of consumerism and materialism. movie stars and celebrities —evervone chasing after the dollars, fame, status and their egos —spending their whole lives looking for life that is temporary and will fade, while exchanging it for life that is ever lasting and blissful in the hereafter.

And yet, the people who have always submitted their will to a Divine authority, and his commandments, and those who have always been critical thinkers, who have always reflected, who have always been determined not to follow the crowd, not to follow the latest fad, the latest fashion, the latest style or model... these individuals have always seen through the illusion and the spider web of this temporary world, and the illusions of Satan and his counterparts. Those who have been given light by Allah, and were able to see through the fake glitter and fool's gold that shines in front of their eyes, in the fake glitter and

one's desires ..

look at how importent your daily proper compared to your jobs, investments comilles -It is said that "if you want to know where you stand with Allah, look at where Allah stands with you". We need to know where we place Allah in our list of priorities in our daily and hectic lives. Our priority list should be according to what Ibrahim and our prophet Muhammad both expressed in their personalities and manifested in their lives, as Allah says in the Quran: قُلْ إِنَّ صَلَاتِي وَنُسُكِي وَمَحْيَايَ وَمَمَاتِي بِلَّهِ رَبِّ الْعَالَمِينَ (١٦٢) لا شَرِيكَ لَهُ وَبِذَلِكَ أَمِرْتُ وَأَنَّا أوَّلُ الْمُسْلِمِينَ Say: truly my prayer and my service of sacrifice, my life and death are (all) for Allah, the Cherisher of the Worlds" (An-am <: \\\)). In Makkah Allah tested Ibrahim and asked him to sacrifice what he loved most dearly, his first son, Ismaael Ibrahim recognised this as a supreme and difficult test from Allah. He would have to sacrifice the most beloved thing to him for Allah. How did he respond, what did he say? When he heard the command from Allah...even though it went against his natural love and desires... what was his response? Did he hesitate, did he ignore Allah's commandment, did he disobey, or turn away from Allah's order?...Both Ibrahim and his son obeyed the divine 🔨 🤇 command without flinching and without any resistance at all!. Ibrahim brought his first son Ismael to Mina, and layed his son down, and placed the sharp knife lay on Isma'ils tender throat. But just before it severed the jugular vein. Allah sent a sheep to him from the paradise exactly where Ismaels' body lay, and Ishmael's life was spared. Prophet Ibrahim had passed the test and succeeded... He sacrificed his personal love and desire that he had towards his son-to fulfil Allah's

commandments, Allah's friendship and Allah's love was more important فَانْظُرُ مَاذُا تُرَى قَالَ بِا أَبُتِ اِفْعَلْ مَا تُؤْمَرُ مُسَّ اللهُ من الصابرين - اِفْعَلْ مَا تُغْمِر ...

to him than any type of worldly love...What a great example of sacrifice we have in the story of Ibrahim and Ismaeel.

When we celebrate *Eid al Adha* today, the Festival of the Sacrifice, we should remember Ibrahim's willingness and hastiness to obey Allah, He was prepared to give up his most beloved son. Brothers and sisters in Islam, this teaches us that, as Allah's servants, we too must obey Allah unconditionally, without question and without hesitation. We too, must be prepared to give up whatever else, besides Allah, is so near and dear to us. We too, must learn to tame our selfish desires, and we must learn how to fulfil our Lord's commandments, and persevere through hardships, difficulties and trials so that Allah will purify us and purify our hearts and souls, and keep them connected only to him and pleasing and satisfying Him constantly.

This is the sacrifice... the example of our beloved Prophet Ibrahim. a man, a noble messenger and friend of Allah... who was purified through trials and tribulations in his youth, in his adulthood, and yet in each circumstance his resolve was unmatched and his determination to please his Lord was unswerving.

Indeed Prophet Ibrahim was an Ummah, a nation by himself, for the sacrifices that he endured and put forth for Allah the almighty:

Verily, Ibrahim was an Ummah, obedient to Allah, Hanif-monotheistic, and he was not of those who were polytheists

So Where do we stand? What are we sacrificing for Allah, for Islam, for the improvement of the society that we live in? we all chose with

Where is Allah is in our lives. What are we willing to sacrifice for the religion of Allah? We are now billions of Muslims throughout the world, but can we truly say that we are a unified ummah...Ibrahim was an ummah by himself, solely because of his devotion and sacrifices he put forth for Allah? We need ask our selves....Are we truly devoted to Allah.

Allah? Are we willing to sacrifice our wealth to build a community here in Hagerstown? What are we doing to attain financial, political, religious, and social influence in the societies we live in?

Sacrifice is an essential requirement to test the sincerity of our faith and to fortify our position with Allah (swt). This has been clearly demonstrated through the examples of Prophets Ibrahim and Muhammad (PBUT). Second Khuthah

My dear brothers and sisters the only ones that benefit from our animal sacrifices today are ourselves... our sacrifice of goats, sheep or cows is a symbolic sacrifice to Allah, as He says in the Quran:

لَنْ يَنَالَ اللهَ لُحُومُهَا وَلَا دِمَاقُهَا وَلَٰكِنْ يَتَالُهُ التَّقُوَىٰ مِنكُمْ ۚ كَذَٰلِكَ سَخَرَهَا لَكُمْ لِتُكَيِّرُوا اللهَ عَلَىٰ مَا هَذَاكُمْ ۗ وَيَشْيَر الْمُحْسِنِينَ

The meat from the sacrifices will not reach Allah, nor will the blood of the sacrifices, but what reaches Allah is 'taqwa' piety and righteousess from you. Thus have We subjected the animals to you that you may glorify Allah for that [to] which He has guided you; and give good tidings to the doers of good.

Allah's commandments in the Quran and Sunnah, like a helpless animal submits in sacrifice to his creator, provider and sustainer? Are we willing to submit completely like Ihrahim and Ismaa'el did by fulfilling Allah's commandments in the Quran and Sunnah? This is the real wisdom and reminder behind this blessed day of sacrifice...

Far too often this lesson is missed and our sacrifice on this great day becomes only a ritual practice without any meaning to change ourselves or our personality. We've prepared ourselves for this day of sacrifice, but let us prepare ourselves for the life of sacrifice. Because without making sacrifices we will not be able to develop our hearts, our souls, our families, our masajid, and our Muslim communities, or bring about social reform. We will not be able to pave the way and preserve the future of our youth here in America.

We should be ready to sacrifice our time, our wealth, our resources and our personal likes and dislikes. We should be ready to acquire ™ore properties in our local areas, and specifically in the downtown area to
