# **Introduction**

**The information we will be sharing today is based upon Holy Scriptures (Old Testament, New Testament and Quran) from an Islamic perspective. Many of the things mentioned today, you may have never heard in your life. We ask that you listen with an open heart and mind, and any questions will be answered at the end of the presentation.**



# **Mohamed or Muhammad**

**If your name was spelled wrong, it would be considered a social blunder and an apology would be required.**



# **Translations = Changes**

**The Hebrew text reads:**

**Song of Solomon 5:16-'Hikko mamittadim  
vikullo Mahamadim zehduhi vehduhi  
vezem raai benute  
Yapus Halam.'**

**After going through multiple translations, it  
appears as such (English Revised Version):  
'His speech is most sweet, and he is  
altogether desirable. This is my beloved  
and this is my friend, O daughters of  
Jerusalem'**



# **King James**

**“His mouth is most sweet, yes, and he is altogether lovely. This is my beloved, and this is my friend, O Daughters of Jerusalem”**

**Completely unrecognizable, which makes it easy to escape the attention that would have otherwise raised questions directed at religious authorities who supposedly know the contents of these holy books.**



# **Quran**

**Allah confirms the Prophet's name in the former scriptures in the Quran: '...those who follow the Messenger, the illiterate Prophet, whom they find written in what they have of the Torah and the Injeel, who enjoins upon them what is right and forbids them what is wrong and makes lawful for them the good and wholesome things and prohibits the evil, and relieves them of their burdens and the shackles that were upon them. So those who have believed in him, honored him and supported him and followed the light which was sent down to him-it is those who will be successful.' (Quran 7:157)**

# **Muhammad=Descendant of Abraham**

**Genesis 17:4-6- “As for Me, behold, My covenant is with you, and you shall be a father of many nations. No longer shall your name be called Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you a father of many nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you.”**



# Isaac and Ishmael

**Genesis 17: 19-20: Then God said: “No, Sarah your wife shall bear you a son, and you shall call his name Isaac; I will establish My covenant with him for an everlasting covenant, and with his descendants after him. 20 And as for Ishmael, I have heard you. Behold, I have blessed him, and will make him fruitful, and will multiply him exceedingly. He shall beget twelve princes, and I will make him a great nation.’**



# **Isaac=Children of Israel**

**Jacob the son of Isaac was know as Israel.**

**Moses and Jesus were from Isaac**

**From Ishmael came Muhammad**



# **A prophet from their brothers**

**Deuteronomy 18:18-19: God promises Moses that He would send to the descendants of Israel a prophet from amongst their brothers (NKJV):**

**“I will raise up for them a Prophet like you from among their brethren, and will put My words in His mouth, and He shall speak to them all that I command Him. 19 And it shall be that whoever will not hear My words, which He speaks in My name, I will require it of him.”**



# **Sand Dunes in Arabia**

**It was from the scorching desert of Arabia that God brought forth the man who would finalize a long line of prophets sent one after another.**

**Deuteronomy 33:2-'And He said, 'The Lord came from Sinai, and dawned on them from Seir; He shone forth from Mount Paran, and He came with ten thousand saints; from his right hand came a fiery law for them'**

**Sinai=Moses revelation in Egypt**

**Seir=Same message via Jesus in Jerusalem**

**Mount Paran=Muhammad in Makkah**

# **Conquer of Makkah**

**Muhammad emigrated from Makkah to Madinah and returned after ten years to conquer Makkah, establishing the law of God in that city. He was accompanied by ten thousand companions:**

**Habakkuk 3:3-4: 'God came from Teman, the Holy One from Mount Paran. Selah. His glory covered the heavens, and the earth was full of His praise. His brightness was like the light. He had rays flashing from his hand, and there His power was hidden.'**

# **Muhammad=Full of Praise**

**Muhammad means: 'full of praise' or 'the praised one.'**

**He was the one intended by the previous biblical verse**



# **Lineage of Muhammad**

**1 Chronicles 1:29- 'These are their genealogies: The firstborn of Ishmael was Nabajoth; then Kedar, Adbeel, Mibsam.'**

**Ezekial 27:21- 'Arabia and all the princes of Kedar were your regular merchants. They traded with you in lambs, rams and goats.'**

**Muhammd's tribe, the Quraysh, descended from Kedar, Ishmael's second son.**



# **Quraysh**

**Most respected and influential tribe in Arabia and were in charge of major trading expeditions to and from Makkah, also to Syria, Iraq, Yemen and Ethiopia. They also held significant power in the region and were also responsible for the distribution of Zamzam water.**



# Valley of Baca

**Psalms 84:4-6 this valley is mentioned:**

**‘Blessed are those who dwell in Your house; they will still be praising you. Selah. Blessed is the man whose strength is in You, whose heart is set on pilgrimage. As they pass through the Valley of Baca, they make it a spring; the rain also covers it with pools’**



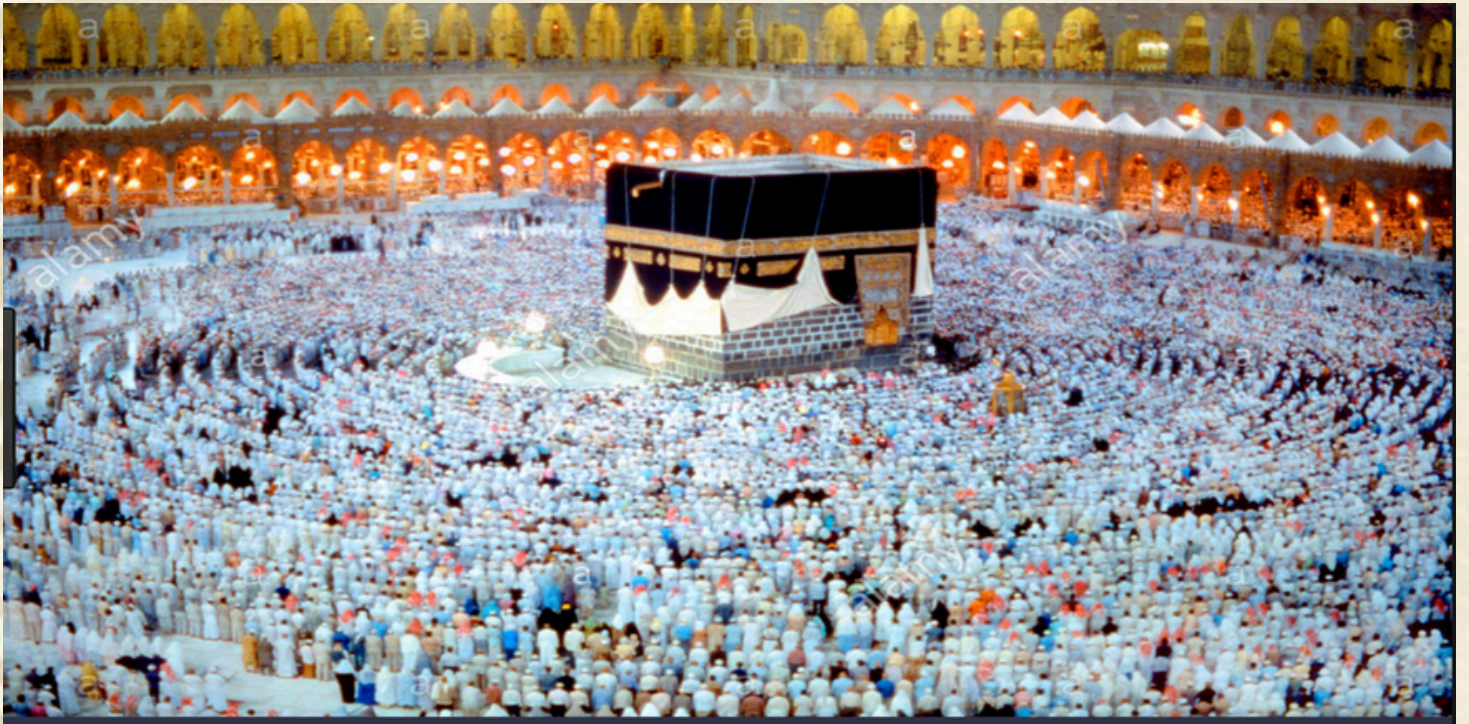
# **Bakkah=in Quran**

**Allah says in the Quran:**

**'Indeed, the first House of worship established for mankind was that at Bakkah (Makkah) blessed and a guidance for the worlds' (3:96)**



# What do they do in Makkah?



# Makkah

**Muslims perform pilgrimage once in a lifetime to the Holy House of God in Makkah.**

**They pray, they circumambulate and supplicate to Allah there.**



# Emigration

**Muhammad came from Arabia, the Valley of Baca. The burden of bringing back God's true religion in the midst of paganism was given to him in Arabia. Prophethood has always had its enemies. Muhammad faced strong resistance in the beginning, he was forced to migrate from Paran Mountains to Tema (a chain of mountains 300km north of Madinah)**

# Tema

**Isiaiah 21:13-14-'The burden against Arabia. In the forest in Arabia you will lodge, O you travelling companies of Dedanites. O inhabitants of the land of Tema, bring water to him who is thirsty; with their bread they met him who fled.'**

# **Illiterate Prophet**

**A city of merchants and trade, Makkah (Baca) boasted many learned people who excelled in reading and writing, as opposed to the agricultural city of Madinah. Muhammad was born in Makkah of Makkan parents, from a respected and established tribe of significant status. Yet he could not read nor write.**

# **‘I am not literate’**

**In the book of Isaiah 29:12-**

**‘Then the book is delivered to one who is illiterate, saying: ‘Read this, please’, and he says, ‘I am illiterate.’**

**Muhammad was 40 years old when he received revelation from angel Gabriel, in the cave of Hira. He was commanded, ‘read.’ He answered again, ‘I cannot read.’ The angel commanded him for the third time, but he gave the same answer. Then these verses were revealed:**



# Read!

**“Read in the name of your Lord who created-created man from a clot-Read and your Lord is the most generous-who taught man by the pen-taught man what he didn’t know” (Quran 96:1-5)**

**Quran confirms Muhammad could not read or write:**

**‘And you did not recite before it any scripture, nor did you inscribe one with your right hand. Otherwise the falsifiers would have had cause for doubt.’ (Quran 29:48)**

# Illiterate Prophet


**“Say O Muhammad, ‘O Mankind, indeed I am the Messenger of God to all of you, to whom belongs the dominion of the heavens and earth. There is no deity except Him. He gives life and causes death, so believe in god and His messenger, the illiterate prophet, who believes in God and His words, and follow him that you may be guided.’” (7:158)**

# **What did Jesus say?**

**John 16:12-14-**

**“I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. 13**

**However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come. 14 He will glorify Me, for He will take of what is Mine and declare it to you. ‘**



# **“He”?**

**He is repeated 8 times to emphasize that this will be a man and not a spirit or ghost.**

**‘He hears’ and ‘He speaks’ alludes to the fact that the man will be receiving words from God, and not speaking from himself.**

# **Jesus never spoke of himself**

**John 5:30**

**“I can of Myself do nothing. As I hear, I judge; and My judgment is righteous, because I do not seek My own will but the will of the Father who sent me.”**

**John 12:49-50**

**“For I have not spoken on My own authority; but the Father who sent Me gave Me a command, what I should say and what I should speak. And I know that His command is everlasting life. Therefore, whatever I speak, just as the Father has told Me, so I speak.”**

# **Muhammad glorifies Jesus**

**Jesus' name was mentioned over 25 times in the Quran.**


**He is described as the Messiah, the word of God, the son of Mary, a servant of God, and a messenger and prophet.**

**Six hundred years before his arrival, Muhammad's coming was foretold by Jesus.**



# **“The Helper”**

**“But now I go away to Him who sent Me, and none of you asks Me, ‘Where are You going?’ 6 But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your heart. 7 Nevertheless I tell you the truth. It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you; but if I depart, I will send Him to you. 8 And when He has come, He will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment: 9 of sin, because they do not believe in Me; 10 of righteousness, because I go to My Father and you see Me no more; 11 of judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.” (John 16:5-11)**



# **Farewell words**

**These parting words directly told the Israelites that they should expect the coming of another prophet after Jesus.**

**Thus the Israelites were left by Jesus with a building anticipation of the arrival of 'The Helper'.**

**John 1:19-21-**

**“Now this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, “Who are you?”**

**20 He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, “I am not the Christ.” And they asked him, “What then? Are you Elijah?”**

**He said, “I am not.”“Are you the Prophet?”**

**And he answered, “No.”**

# **“That Prophet”**

**This statement in the previous verse means that they were awaiting another prophet to come, however ‘that prophet’, referred to as ‘the Helper,’ is believed by the Christians to be the Holy Spirit.**

# **Holy Spirit**

**Jesus made his departure a precondition for the coming of ‘the Helper’, but it could not have referred to the “Holy Spirit”, for the Holy Spirit was already present at the time of Jesus and even before him, as stated in the Bible:**



# **Holy Spirit**

**Luke 4:1 ‘Then Jesus, being filled with the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness.’**

**Luke 1:15 ‘He (John) will also be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother’s womb.’**

**Luke 1:67 ‘Now his father Zacharias was filled with the Holy Spirit...’**



# **Arabic = Language of Muhammad**

**The spoken languages of the Children of Israel and their prophets were Hebrew and Aramaic.**

**In the book of Isaiah 28: 10-11 it mentions that the forthcoming prophet will speak to people in a language other than Hebrew and Aramaic...???**

**‘For precept must be upon precept,  
precept upon precept, line upon line,  
line upon line, here a little, there a little.  
For with stammering lips and another  
tongue He will speak to this people.’**

# Arabic

**This other ‘tongue’ is Arabic. The Quran, the last revelation of God, was given to Muhammad in the Arabic language. Yet this language was to become the common language used for acts of worship, as foretold in the book of Zephaniah 3:9:**

**‘For then I will restore to the peoples a pure language, that they all may call on the name of the Lord, to serve Him with one accord.’**

# **Muslims=One language to pray**

**Over 2 billion Muslims throughout the world use one language (Arabic) to call upon God in their daily prayers, during their pilgrimage, and recitation of the Holy Quran.**



# **Was he a true Prophet?**

**He must speak the truth—even before Muhammad started inviting people to Islam he was known as the ‘Truthful One’.**

**A true prophet is one who was foretold of by previous prophets, as we previously saw in the Old and New Testaments.**

**A true prophet wouldn’t live extravagantly, Muhammad was well known for his simple and modest lifestyle.**

**A true prophet would uphold and apply God’s laws and follow His commandments. Even Jews would come to him for judgment when he was leader in Madinah.**

**A true prophet would foretell certain future occurrences and his prophecies were always fulfilled.**

# **Muhammad = The Praised One**

**His name continues to be uttered,  
revered and lauded each day throughout  
the globe, in the call to prayer and even  
during the Muslim's prayers.**

**The truth about Muhammad is clear to  
anyone who seeks it.**

**Be of those who seek the truth, and  
follow it.**
