A Little Bit of This and That for September...

As I begin to write yet another message to you through the newsletter, I pray that what I write speaks to your hearts and encourages your faith. We are all on a faith journey whether we are actively engaged or not for we are all spiritual beings housed in mortal bodies.

As I begin my seventh year with you, I begin to question how we are doing on this spiritual journey together. Are you growing deeper in your relationship with Christ and am I continuing to grow in depth and faith to convey God's love and message to you?

In August, my husband Pastor Doug and I began a five-part series on stewardship. Most of us, when we hear that word groan, but it is really just another word that refers to how we **manage things in our lives and faith journey**. Each Sunday we addressed another topic that we need to manage well. The five topics were our time, talents that God has given each of us, our relationships, our money, and how we manage to care for God's creation.

When we are baptized into Christ we are baptized into the body of Christ. We are claimed by God as a child of God. Jesus is our savior who makes this possible.

Over this summer I have been ruminating over the concept of Jesus as savior and Jesus as Lord and Savior. I was baptized as a baby and I believe that God claimed me then. I grew up in the Methodist Church, but did not fully understand the depth of the call to make Jesus my Lord until I was a freshman in college. When I think of Jesus as my savior, I am grateful and relieved that I do not have to earn my way to heaven. I can be at rest in that and choose to do very little in my life to really get to know Jesus.

But, when I make a commitment to Jesus as my Lord, the faith journey is different. I open my heart to allow Jesus to be more at work to mold me into the person God created me to be. This faith journey becomes different because I need to get to know Jesus on a more personal level to understand who he is as my Lord and to listen to what I believe he through the Holy Spirit is calling me to be and do each day of my life. What becomes important in my life is that I am open to follow Jesus.

For much of my life, I was restless in my faith. I needed Jesus to do some deep healing work in my life. I used my gifts to further the work in the church and in my community, but I was restless in each of the many professions I tried. As I look back, I think I had a calling to Pastoral Ministry back in 1979, but I said for years that one pastor in the family was enough. I think my mental stand was a roadblock. Granted, I often did ministry in the church as Doug's pastor wife. I prayed with people, encouraged people, facilitated an adult Sunday School class, preached when Doug was away, and generally encouraged others in the faith- all gifts for pastoral ministry.

It wasn't until I came to a fall gathering of the ELCA SW conference churches at St. Peter, in 2018 that I could no longer deny the call to pastoral ministry. The Holy Spirit was at work to call me here to you at St. Peter.

As I look back on these six years we have spent together I see that we have become a much more open and loving church. You have become better at welcoming new people and this is a place where the love of Christ can be found.

My question is... is there more that Jesus wants us to be doing. How do we continue to share the call to follow Jesus as our Lord and savior and not just savior? How do we move forward to discern God's call to us to become more actively involved in ministry to our communities and even those struggling around the world? How do we each live into the fullness of the relationship that Jesus longs to have with each of us? How do we allow the Holy Spirit to stretch us in our faith to risk failure or disappointment in the outcome?

Jesus says that he will never leave us or desert us. If Christ is for us, who can be against us? It is easy for us to become complacent and just do things as we have always done them. I am asking all of us to pray and discern what some of our next steps might be as we move forward together in faith.

As we think about how we move deeper in faith with Jesus as our Lord and Savior, may we all discover a deeper connection and the richness that this journey of faith brings. Blessings to all of you.
