#### A Little Bit of This and That for July and August...

Dear Friends in Christ,

Have I told you lately how happy I am to be serving you as your pastor and friend in Christ? It took me a long time to come home to the special gifting that God was calling me to preach and journey with others as pastor. So today I want to share with you the importance of seeking God to understand your own gifting that God has bestowed upon you to further the Kingdom of God where you are planted.

Dr. Terry Wardle has the special gifting of teaching and his writing and teaching has helped to mold my faith and help me on my own transformational journey of faith. So, I would like to share some information from his teaching in several podcasts that I have listened to recently.

First of all, our faith is not to be dormant, but alive and vital. Our journey is to be one of transformation that occurs as we pay attention to what the Holy Spirit is doing in our daily lives. We are to listen to God in the present moments of life and allow the presence of God to change and mold us. We are to choose the way of Christ and journey forward to understand the gifts that God has given to each of us and to use them to further the kingdom of God here on earth.

Dr. Terry Wardle shared that he learned from one of his professors while working on his doctorate that each one of us is given these special gifts and they are not all the same. He calls these gifts "Special Graces" that God give to each of us. He teaches that we should be operating in our special graces 80% of the time and that the other 20% of our time in the church should involve other ways we are called to help out.

Now there are a variety of gifts we receive and there are a variety of ways they are used. Many of these gifts are mentioned in Ephesians 1, I Corinthians 12, Romans 12, and Ephesians 4. I invite you to go to your Bibles to look that the lists. There are probably even more that are not listed.

Terry went on to later teach that when we are in Christ, each of us is endowed with some of these gifts and it is important for us to learn what they are and then use them. He shared that his special grace is in the area of teaching and so he spends a majority of his time in preparing teachings, writing books, and teaching. He said that when he spends time doing this, he is "at home".

I have often heard myself say that I have "come home" to what God has called me to do when I began to serve you as pastor. I was always restless in the school setting and even after pursing my master's degree in counseling, I wrestled with whether I was in the right setting. It wasn't until I finally accepted the call to become your pastor and to begin to preach and encourage you in the faith that I have felt this "coming home."

My prayer for each of us is that we will allow the work of the Holy Spirit to enlighten us to know our individual gifts (special graces) that God has given us and to develop those gifts as we allow God to be at work in our lives.

The process of being transformed in Christ is an exciting journey! I am thankful to be able to be on this journey with you.

avoid any excess heat that may be in the sanctuary in the evenings during the summer.

Also, it is a great service to invite a friend to as it is more relaxed in nature. People are invited to bring a lawn chair to enjoy sitting outside while worshipping together.

#### The Art of Listening:

In June, Pastor Doug (at St. Mark's in Wapakoneta) and I have both been preaching on various aspects of listening. It has been said that God gave us two ears and one mouth because listening is so important.

Some of the concepts that we have emphasized is that God is present with us to listen to our inner thoughts as well as our outward conversations. As we tune in to the presence of God, God has the power to speak life into us. That often comes from reading scripture and having a phrase jump out at us.

Last week, I talked about the power of creating a sacred place in your homes that helps you to set aside some time to listen to what is going on inside of you as well as to listen for the presence of God as you dedicate a little time in your day to listen. You may have a favorite chair or room in your house that calls to you. You may want to have a little candle that you light to mark your time of listening.

This week, June 29, I focused on the art of listening to others. This is a sacred art that many of us get uncomfortable with. Often people are poor listeners as they rehearse what they want to say while trying to listen. Deep listening is an art that seeks to help the

other person get in touch with what they are feeling and explore their own feelings. One of the goals of good listening is to ask questions about why or how a person came to feel strongly about a certain topic.

Sometimes, listening involves just being a non-anxious presence to sit in silence with the person who may be hurting. We heard this in the passage of Job when his friends came to console him after everything he had was taken away. They sat on the ground with him in silence for seven days and seven nights. That is pretty incredible.

In the first Sunday of July, Doug and I will each be preaching on listening to our communities. We all have several different communities that we are involved in. You may have a work community or a coffee cup community with whom you gather weekly. We live in communities. The question becomes "How do we listen to the needs within our communities?"

There is a great book written by Adam S. McHugh, upon which Doug and I have used as a resource for this series on listening. It is called The Art of Listening and Pastor Doug has bought multiple copies. If you are interested in exploring this topic in more depth, you may purchase a copy for \$10.00. Just let me know.




