wrath of God, paying the price that we sinners owe, thus redeeming His people and once again bringing them into a familial relationship with the Father: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn

the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him" (John 3:16-17).

And so, the Good News of Christmas is not just the birth of Jesus, but that He truly, once and for all, accomplished the mission for which he was sent. After His resurrection, and before His

ascension into heaven, Jesus commanded His followers: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have
